

International Summer School Seggau

Together with the Diocese of Graz-Seckau and the Commission of the Bishops' Conferences of the European Community (COMECE), the University of Graz has organized this two-week programme with a focus on European integration since 2006.

The University received several applications by Albanian students for this summer school and five of them have been selected. The Summer School takes place from 30 June -14 July 2012.

<u>Graz International Summer School 2012 - GUSS</u>

The grant programme "Go Styria!" is a cooperation between the University of Graz and the Province of Styria that has supported students from South-Eastern European universities since winter semester 2007/08. Students from FYROM are entitled to apply for the programme.

Best of South-East

Since 2008, the trainee and internship programme "Best of South-East" has been carried out in cooperation with the *Steiermärkische Sparkasse* bank. "Best of South-East" gives outstanding students and graduates of Economics, Business and Law from South-Eastern Europe (Slovenia, Croatia, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Serbia, Montenegro and <u>the Former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia (FYROM)</u>) the opportunity to obtain their first professional experiences.

Students from FYROM are entitled to apply for the programme. In the academic year 2011/12, one incoming student from the Ss. Cyril and Methodius University (Skopje) spent an exchange stay within this programme at the University of Graz.

CEEPUS

The CEEPUS programme ("Central European Exchange Program for University Studies") promotes academic cooperation in research and teaching in Central and Eastern Europe. The University of Graz has been actively involved in this program for years and has engaged in close cooperation with subject-specific networks.
