Trade & investment

- The EU is Albania's biggest trading partner
- The EU's Foreign Direct Investment in Albania reached €610.9 million in 2021
- Volume of trade in goods with the EU was €5.9 billion in 2021



EU funding

- The EU is the largest provider of financial assistance to Albania
- The EU is supporting the socioeconomic development and reforms in the enlargement region, including in Albania, with financial and technical assistance through the **Instrument for Pre-accession Assistance (IPA)**
- For 2021-2027, IPA III funding for the whole enlargement region is **€14.162 billion***. It responds to thematic priorities

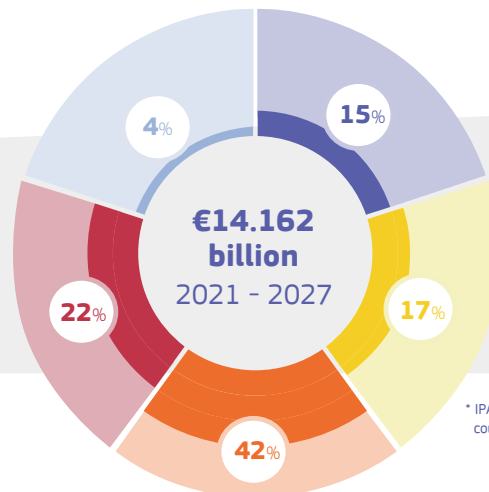


Economic & Investment Plan

Over the next seven years, the EU will mobilise up to **€30 billion** in cooperation with international financial institutions through the Economic and Investment Plan for the Western Balkans launched in 2020. The following EIP projects for Albania were endorsed in 2022:

- Sustainable transport:** Tirana bypass, Hani i Hotit railway line
- Clean energy:** Vau i Dejës Floating Solar Photovoltaic Power Plant

- The Annual Action Plan 2021 for Albania foresees a budget of **€64.9 million** supporting actions in judiciary, property rights, circular economy & green growth, innovation and nature
- For 2014 - 2020, IPA II funding allocated for Albania amounted to **€758 million**
- €569 million in European Investment Bank loans since 1999
- €115 million** EU grants for rehabilitation and reconstruction after the 2019 earthquake



* IPA assistance is based on EU thematic priorities rather than pre-defined country allocations, hence the global amount for the enlargement region.



Human capital & innovation

- The EU pays special attention to youth, education and innovation and is helping the Western Balkans implementing Youth Guarantee schemes to support youth employment
- 9,800+ participants from Albania in student, academic and youth exchanges under ERASMUS+ (2014-2020)
- €25 million in support to civil society (2014-2020)
