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Executive Summary

The aim of this Sixth SME Progress Report is to monitor the participation of SMEs in the Cooperation Programme within the Seventh Research Framework Programme (FP7). The report also covers the SME participation in the Capacities and People Programmes of FP7.

The Commission is required to pay special attention to the funding for SMEs under the Cooperation Programme, following the target in the Decision establishing FP7¹. The aim is to ensure that at least 15% of the funding of the programme goes to SMEs.

In particular, this report examines the funding for SMEs under the Thematic Priorities of the Cooperation Programme. 96% of the Cooperation budget in Grant Agreements signed before 1 October 2010 has been used for open calls under the ten Thematic Priorities of the FP7 Cooperation Programme. It includes an analysis of SME participation rates across the Themes of the Cooperation Programme and of the EU contribution to SMEs.

An overall analysis of the Cooperation Programme also takes account of the grants to ESA (European Space Agency), the Joint Technology Initiatives and the so-called "General activities"² within the Cooperation Programme.

The major outcome of this monitoring exercise is that within the Cooperation Programme as a whole, **14,5%** (1.578 million €) of the budget has been granted to SMEs so far. Focusing on the SME participation in the Thematic Priorities only, 14,7% of the Cooperation budget is going to SMEs. The Cooperation Programme still has 21.788 million € available to spend (67,5% of the total budget in the remaining years of the Framework Programme, until 2013). From the remaining budget, 15,3% should go to SMEs in order to reach the 15% target for the whole period.

Although the cumulative figure for the EU contribution in the Themes of the Cooperation Programme is only 14,7%, when we analyse the Grant Agreements signed between 1 January 2010 and 1 October 2010, we see that 15,4% is allocated to SMEs (Graph 2). This positive trend together with the scheduled SME dedicated calls under the 2011 Work Programmes makes it possible that the 15% target will be met before the end of FP7 in 2013.

For the first time, this report includes a comprehensive analysis of the activity sectors represented in the Themes. All activity sectors are represented in all Themes. For instance, ICT companies play an important role in Themes such as TPT, NMP and SEC, as well of course in the ICT Theme (see Table 1 for Theme descriptions).

So far about 11.000 organisations have participated in FP7, many of which are involved in more than one FP7 Grant Agreement. In FP7, SMEs represent 35,4% of these unique participating entities, which is the highest single group participating in FP7. At least 20.000 SMEs are expected to benefit from FP7 before the end of the Programme.

This report also includes maps with a regional analysis of the 15% target in signed Grant Agreements within the Cooperation Programme. In addition, the participation of SMEs per region in the Capacities and People Programmes of FP7 is analysed.

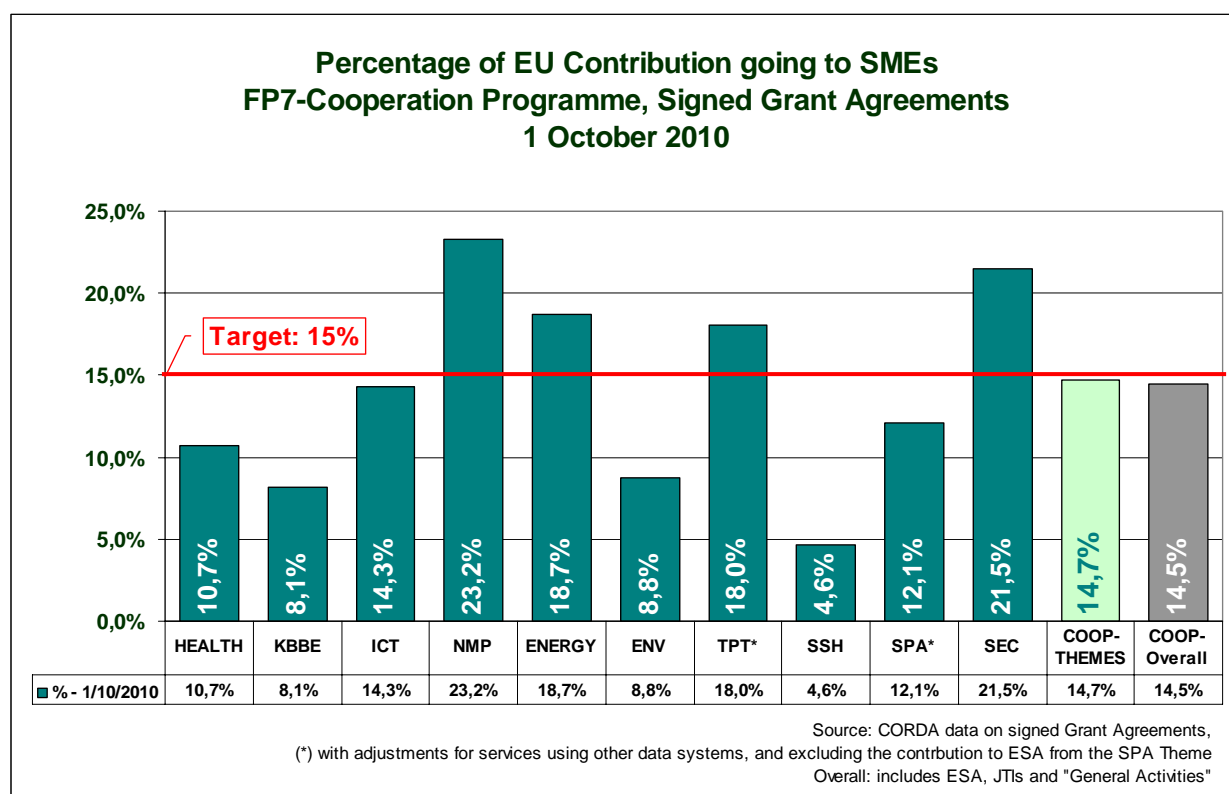

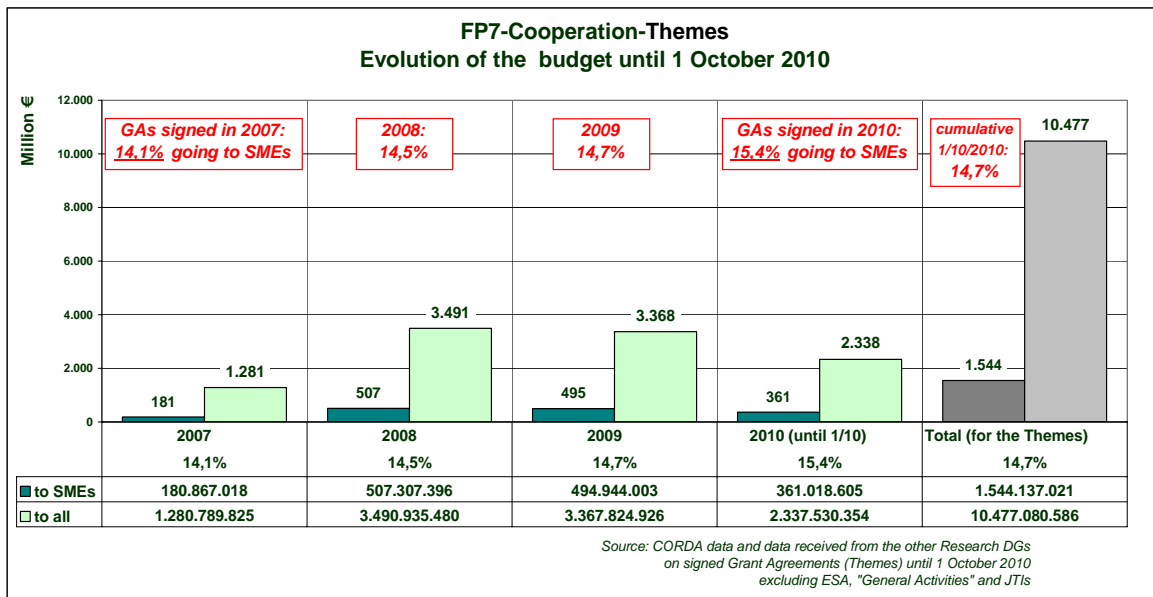

Cut-off date: 1 October 2010**



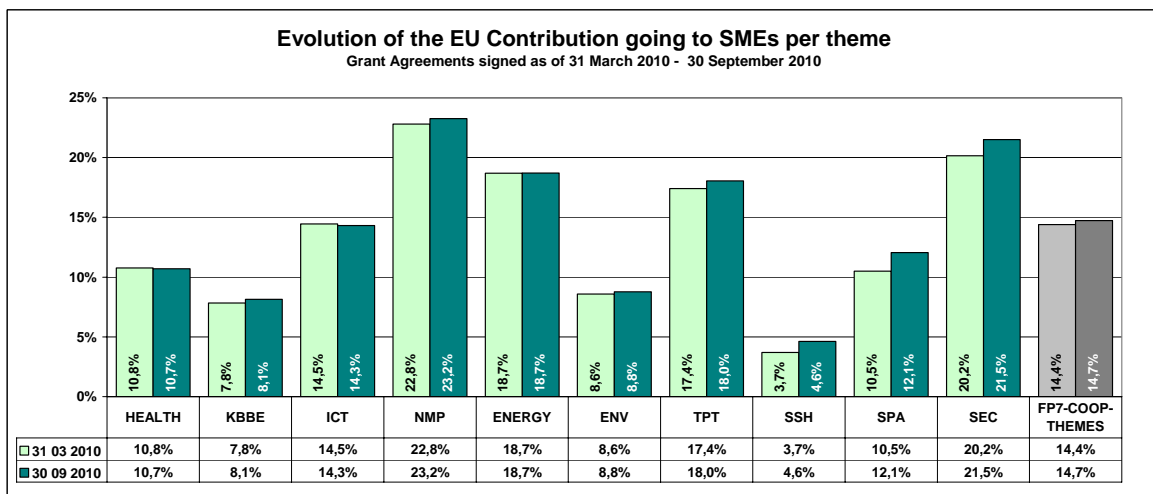
Graph 1: The share of the EU Contribution going to SMEs, for each Theme within the Cooperation Programme.

Evolution of the FP7-Cooperation budget to SMEs and all participants since 2007



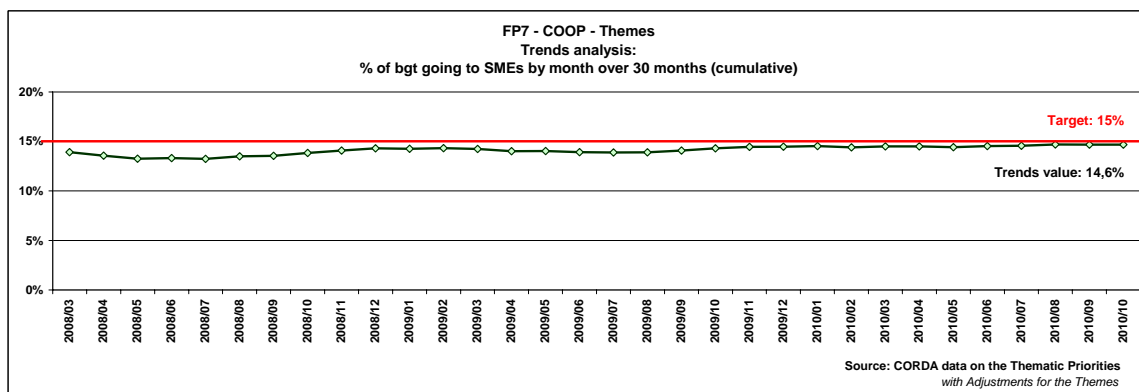
Graph 2: Evolution of the budget in signed Grant Agreements over the years.

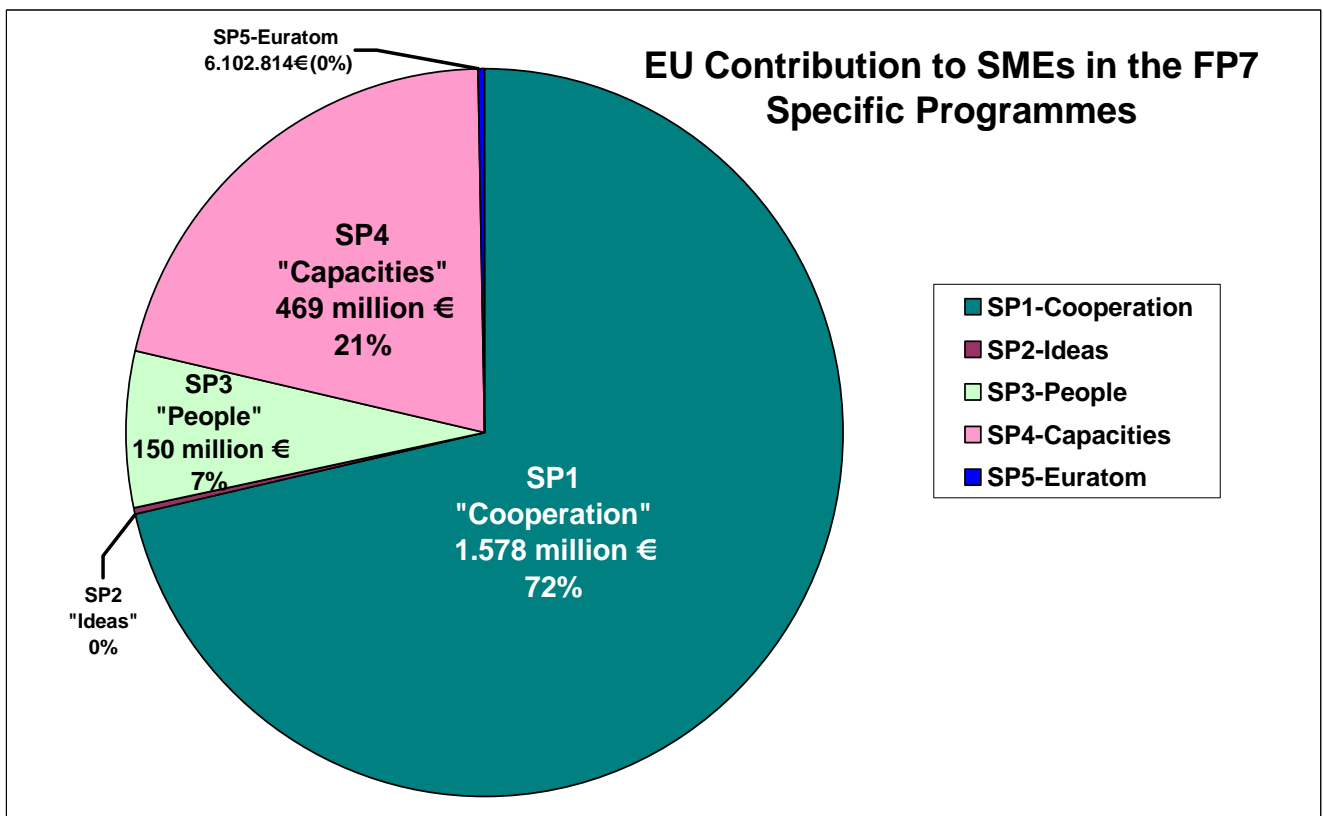
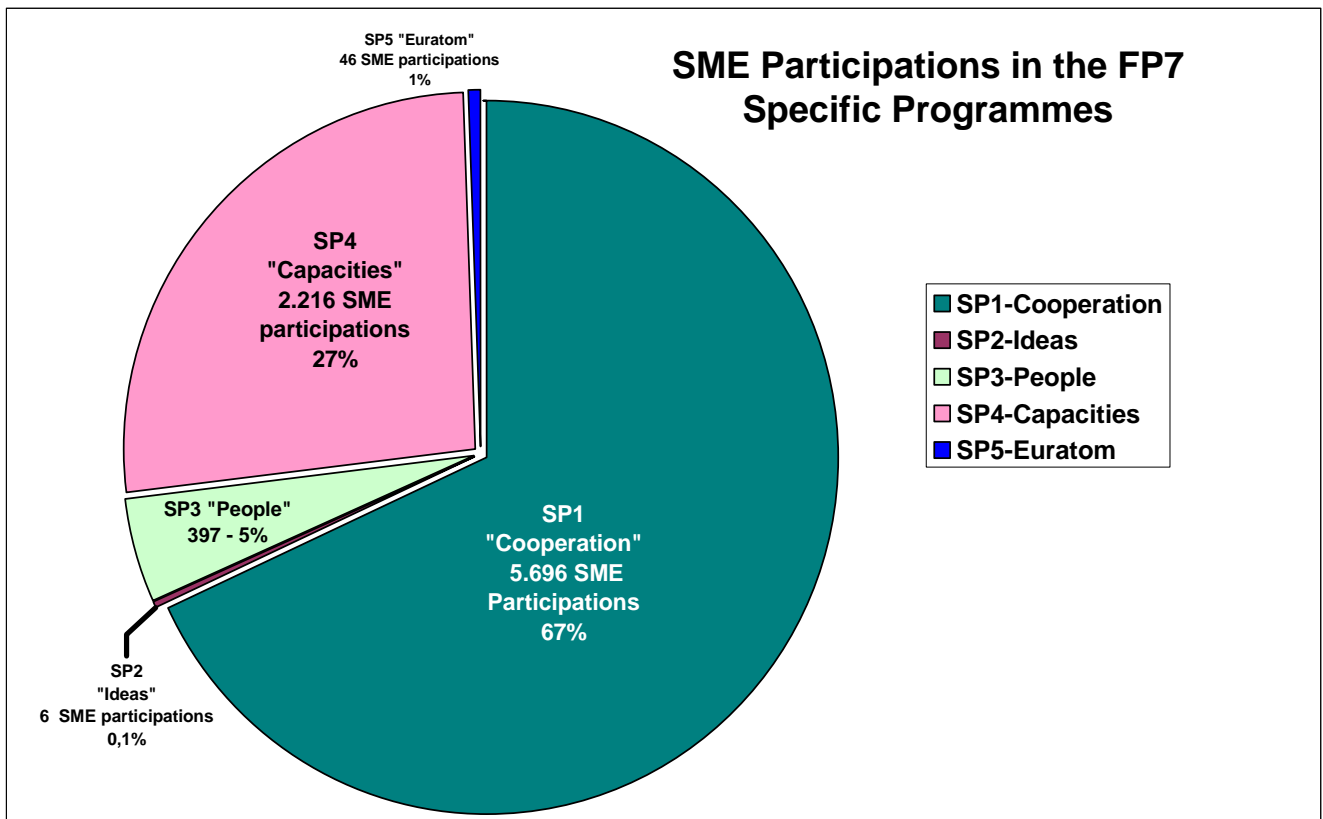

Until 1 October 2010, 32,5% of the budget for the Cooperation Themes has been used.

With a total budget of 32.265 million €, 21.788 million € is remaining.

To reach the 15% target by the end of FP7, during the remaining 3 years, at least 15,3% of the EU contribution in Cooperation Grant Agreements should go to SMEs.

Cooperation Programme - Other components

Although the report focuses on the ten Thematic Priorities of the Cooperation Programme, the other components of the Cooperation Programme are taken into consideration in this report too. These are:

- The Joint Technology Initiatives
- The grants to the European Space Agency
- The so-called "General Activities", covering the CORDIS services, the horizontal ERA-NET scheme, Research organisations in the EU, Strengthened coordination with EUREKA, Scientific and technological cooperation activities carried out in COST, the European Metrology Research Programme, etc.

Although the Decision establishing FP7 specifies the aim of enabling at least 15% of the funding of the Programme to go to SMEs, the Commission pays special attention to the funding for SMEs under the Thematic Priorities of the Cooperation Programme, because they represent 96% of the whole Cooperation budget as of today. The SME participation in the Themes can be accurately monitored and therefore influenced by specific measures in the yearly Work Programmes.

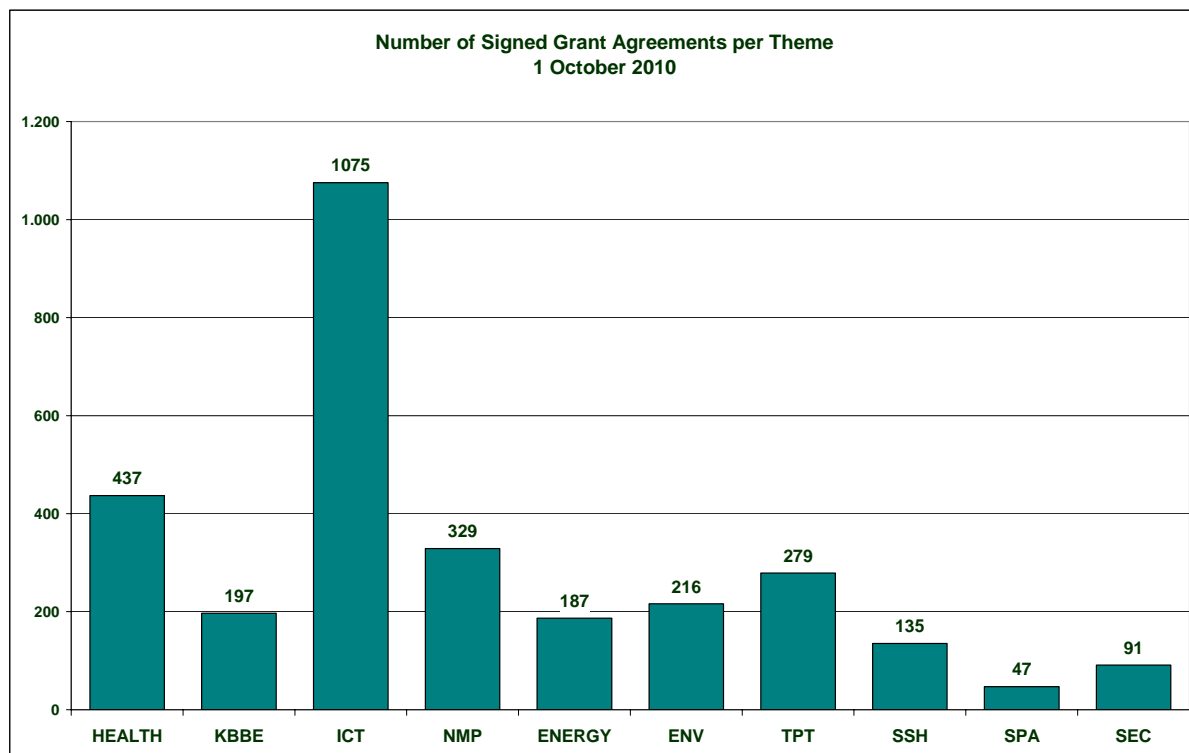

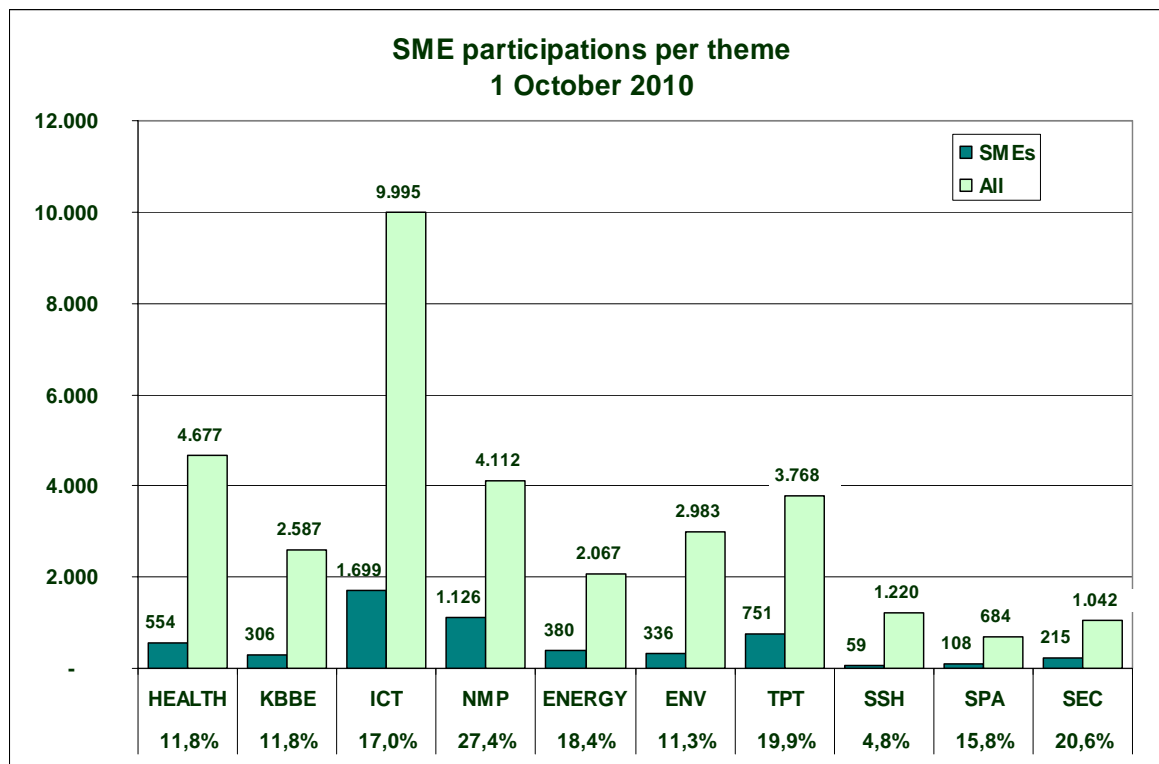

Number of signed Grant Agreements per Theme



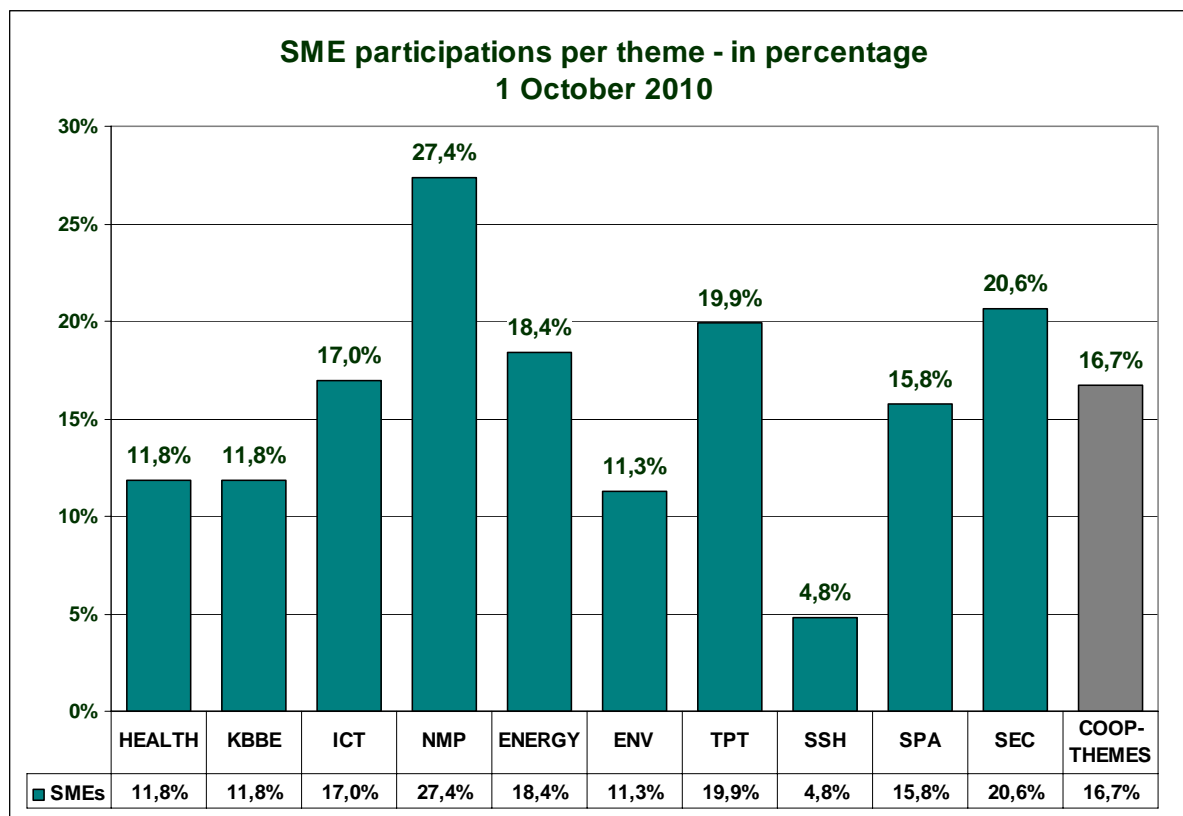
Graph 6: FP7-COOP Signed Grant Agreements per Theme, 1 October 2010

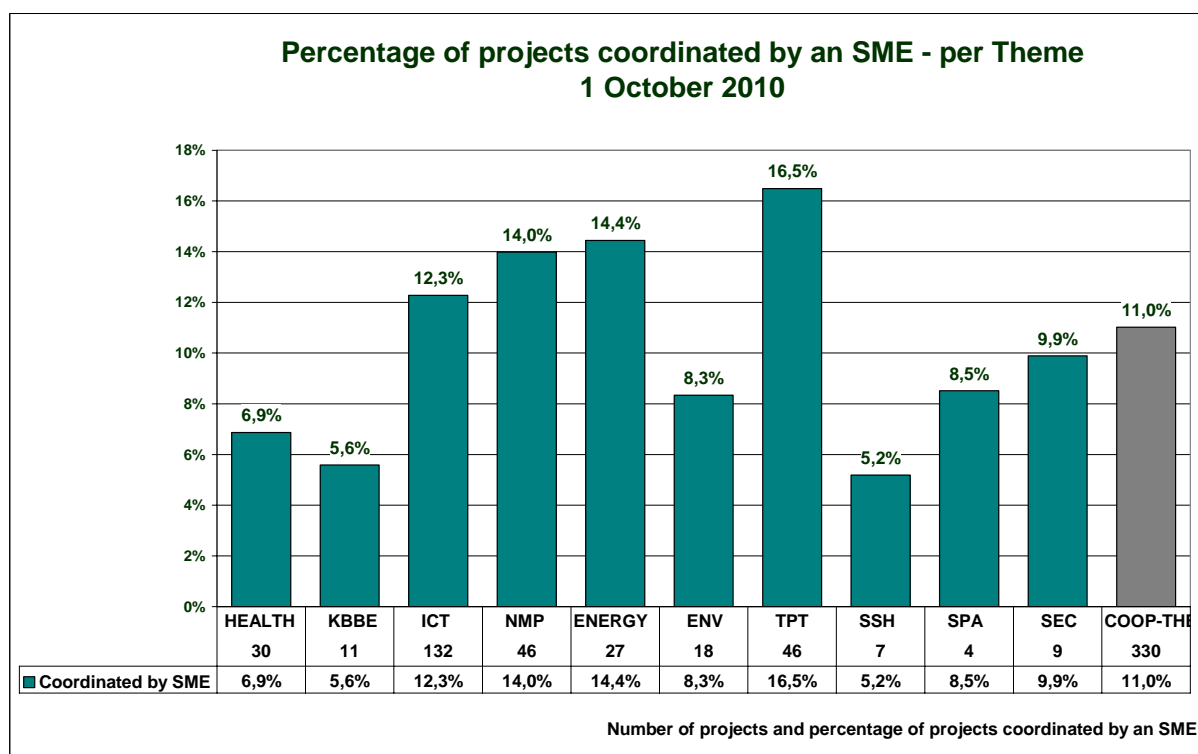
Graph 7: Participations per Theme – SMEs versus all

SME Participations per Theme in Percentage



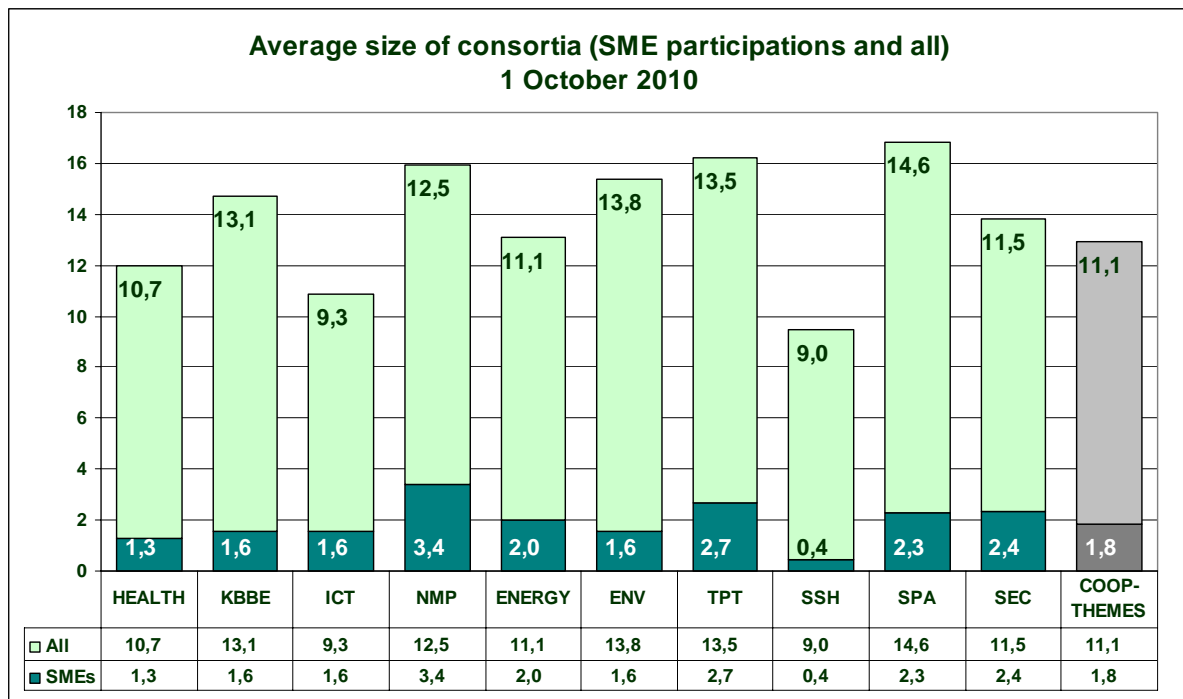
Graph 7B: Participations per Theme – SMEs versus all – in percentage

Number of SME Coordinators in signed Grant Agreements



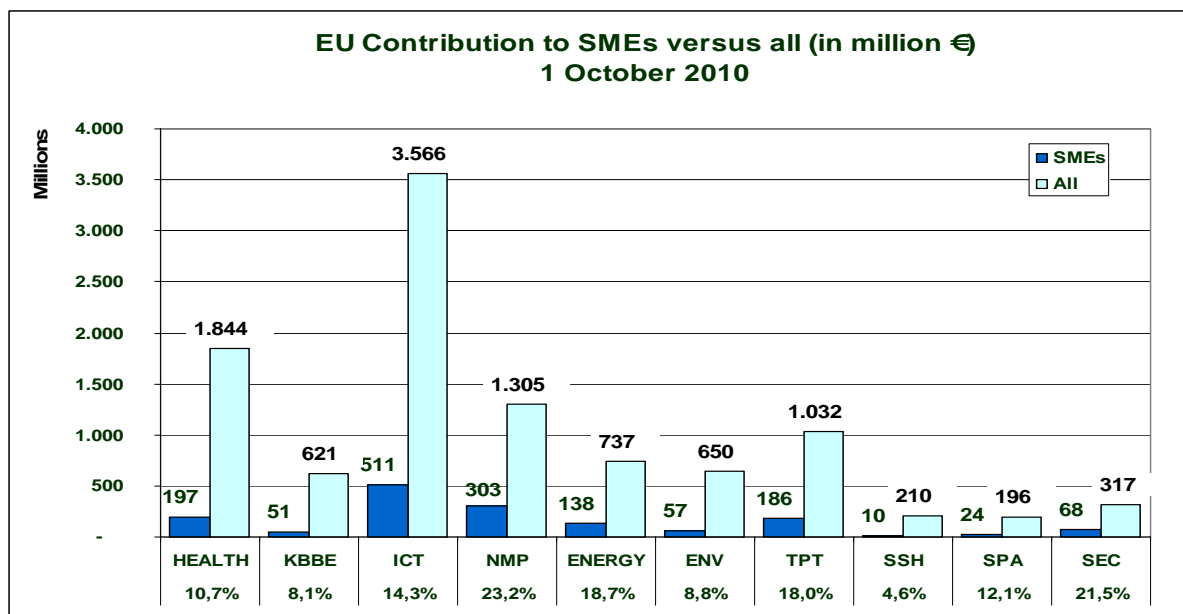
Graph 8: SME Coordinators in number and in percentage of the projects, per Theme

Graph 9: Average number of participants per project per Theme – SMEs versus all

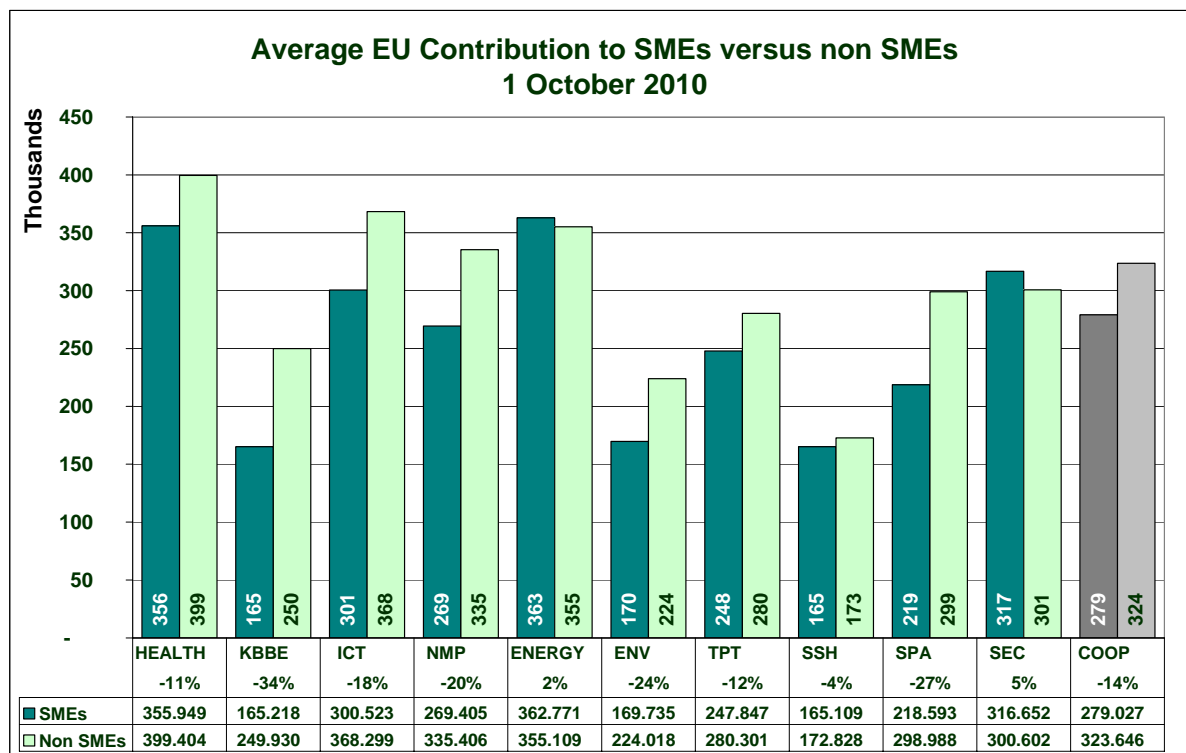
EU Contribution per participation in signed Grant Agreements



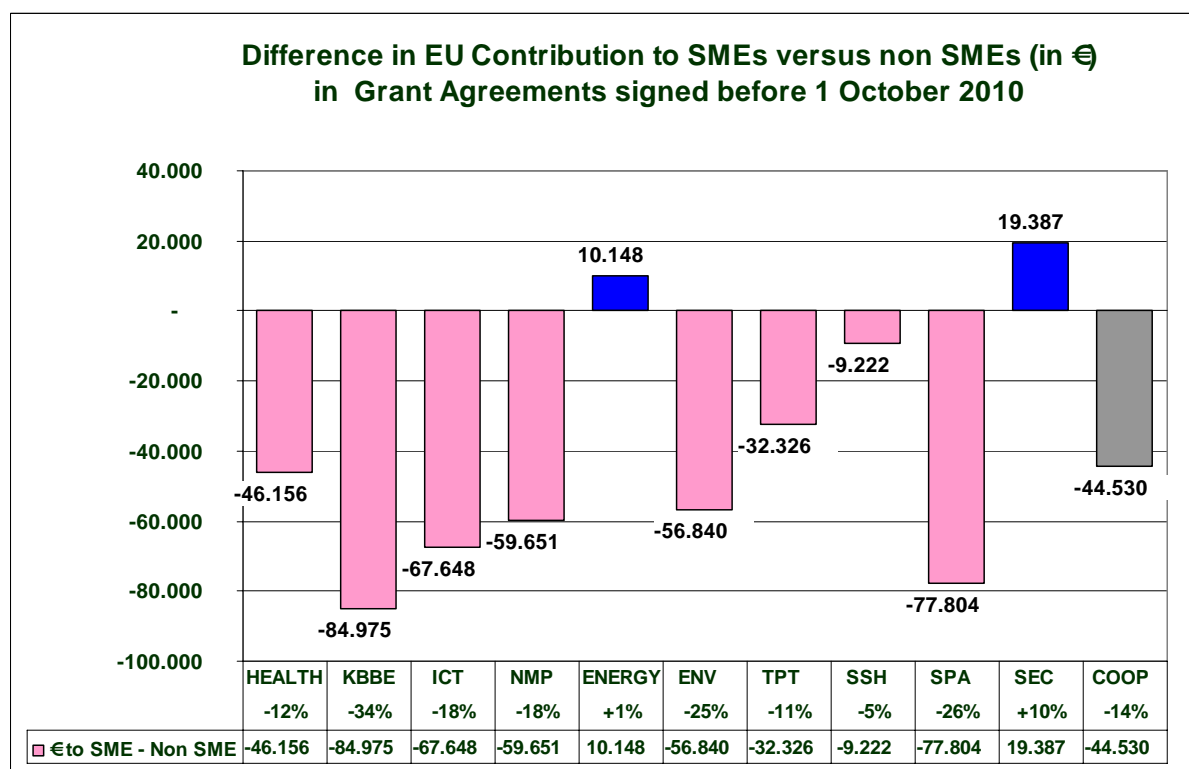
Graph 10: EU contribution per Theme – to SMEs versus all

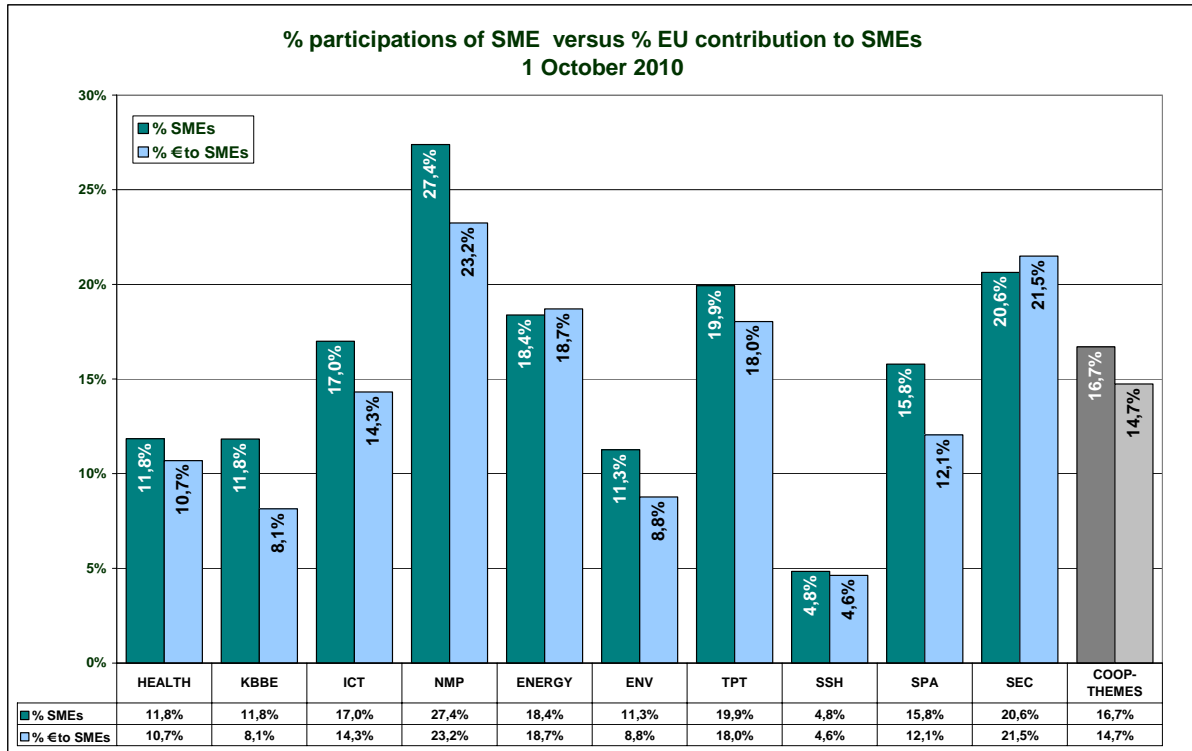


Graph 11: Average EU-contribution per participation – SMEs versus non-SMEs



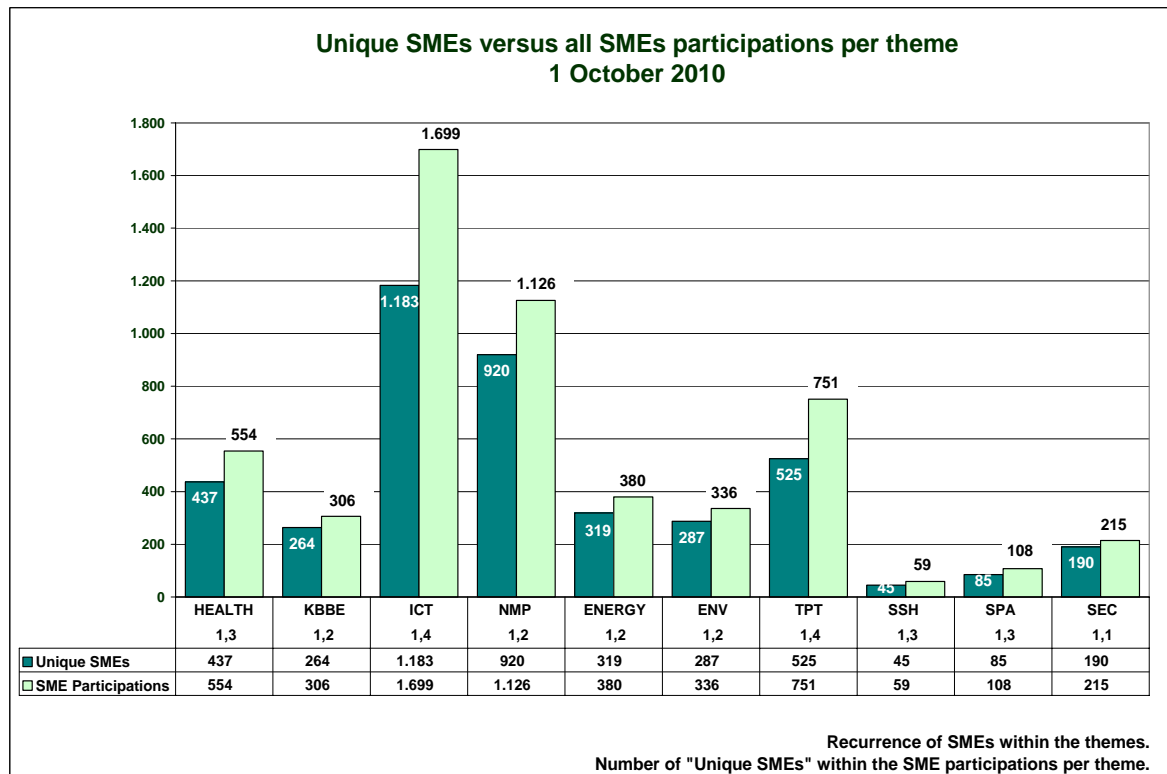
Graph 12: Difference in EU contribution to SMEs versus non-SMEs (average per participation)

Comparison of the SME participation rate and the EU contribution rate to SMEs



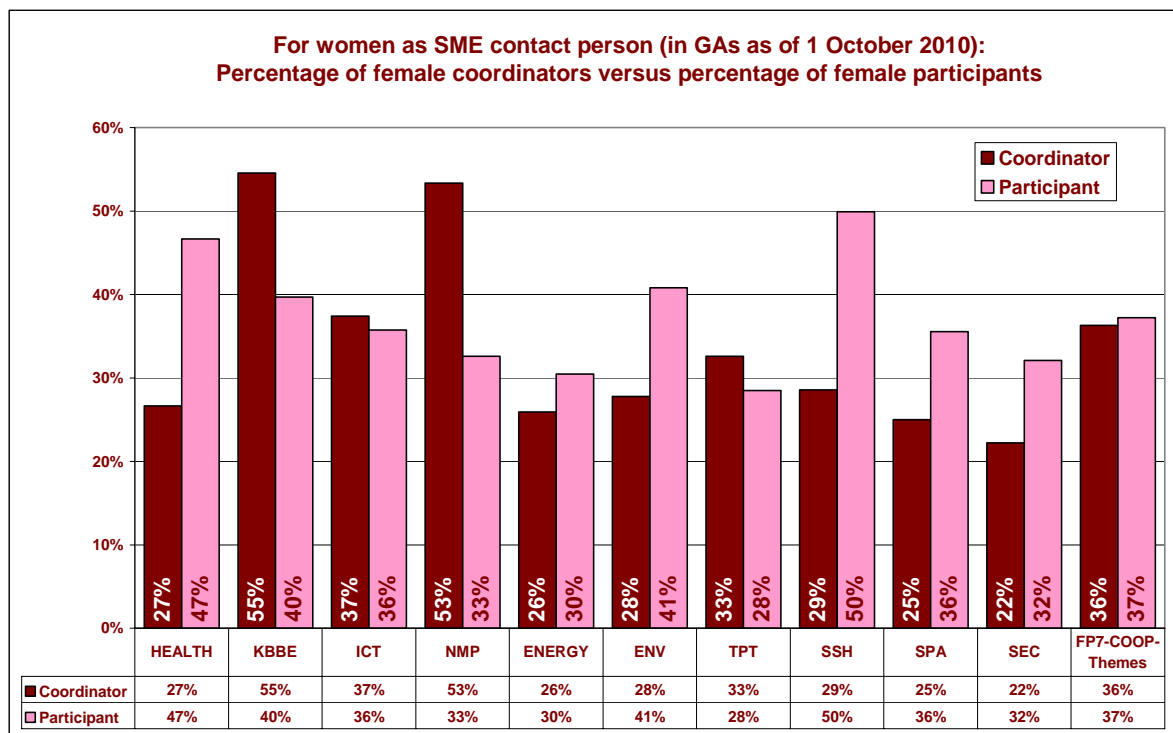
Graph 13: SME Participation rate versus EU Contribution rate to SMEs

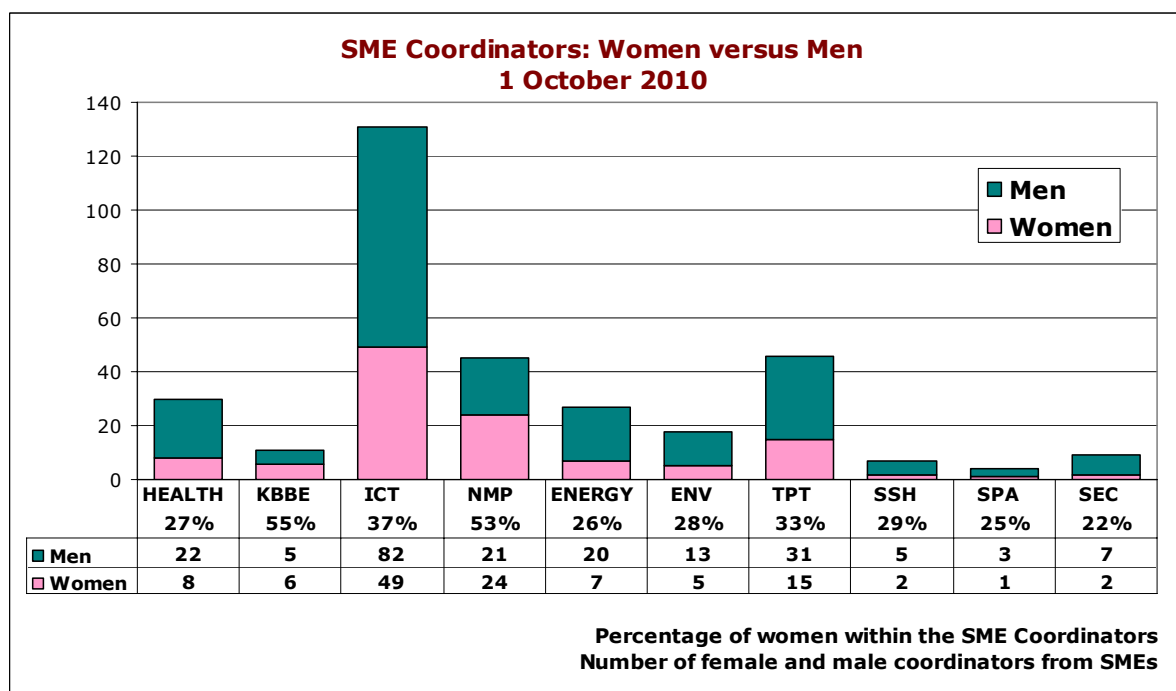


Graph 14: SME participations per Theme, compared to "unique SME participants" (individual SMEs, possibly participating in several projects)

Gender of contact persons in SMEs

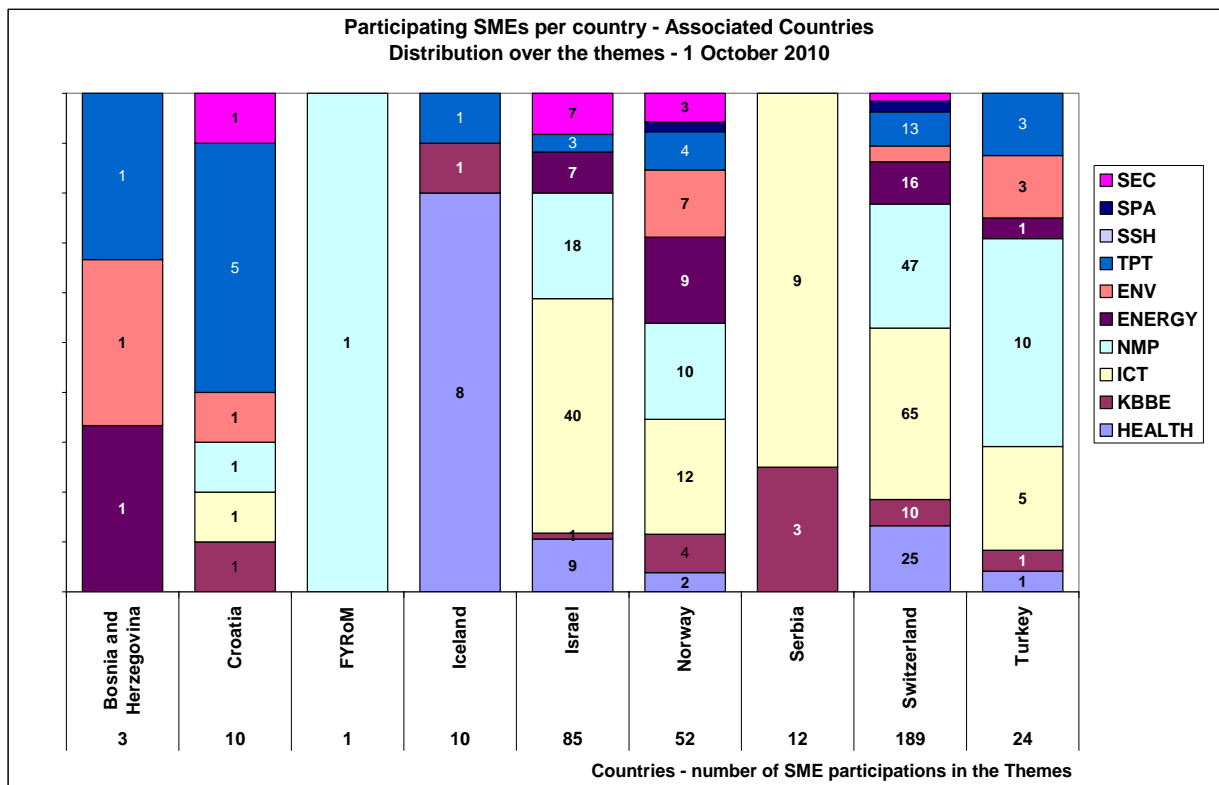
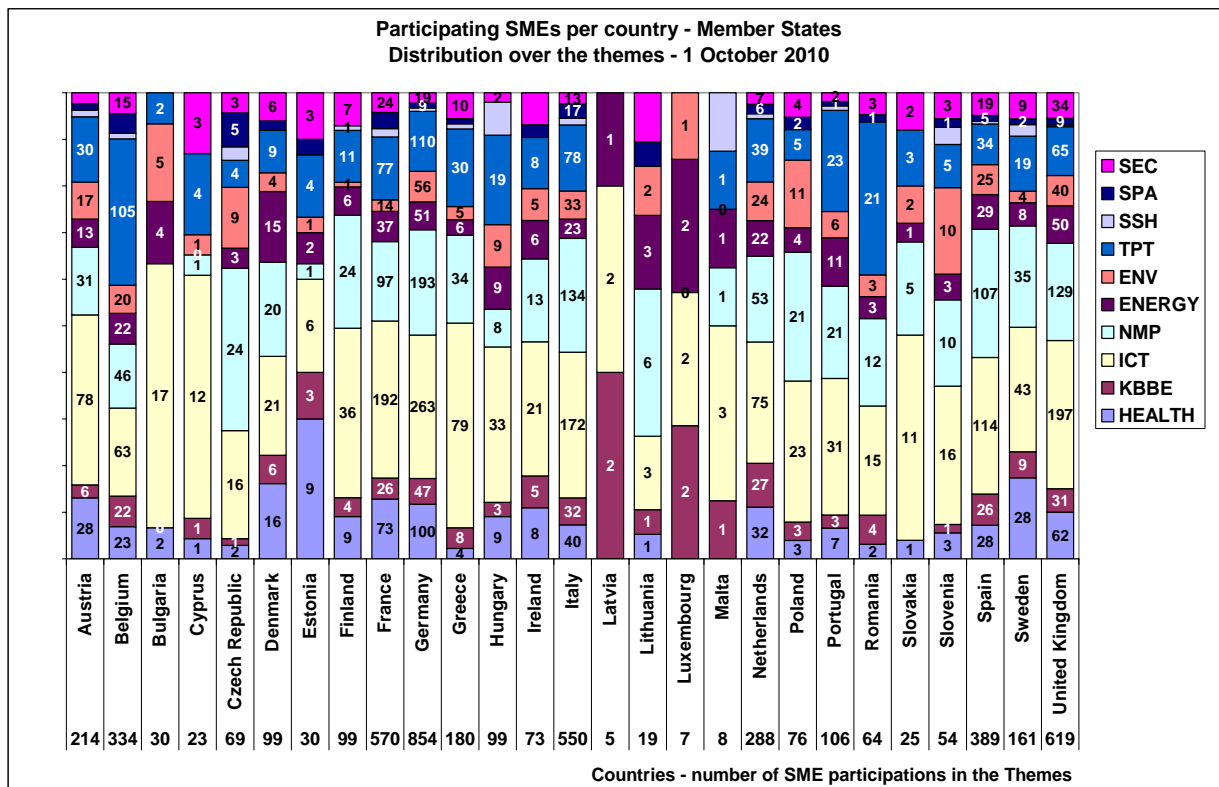


Graph 15: Female contact person for coordinating SME versus participating SME

Country profiles: SME participations per Theme in signed Grant Agreements



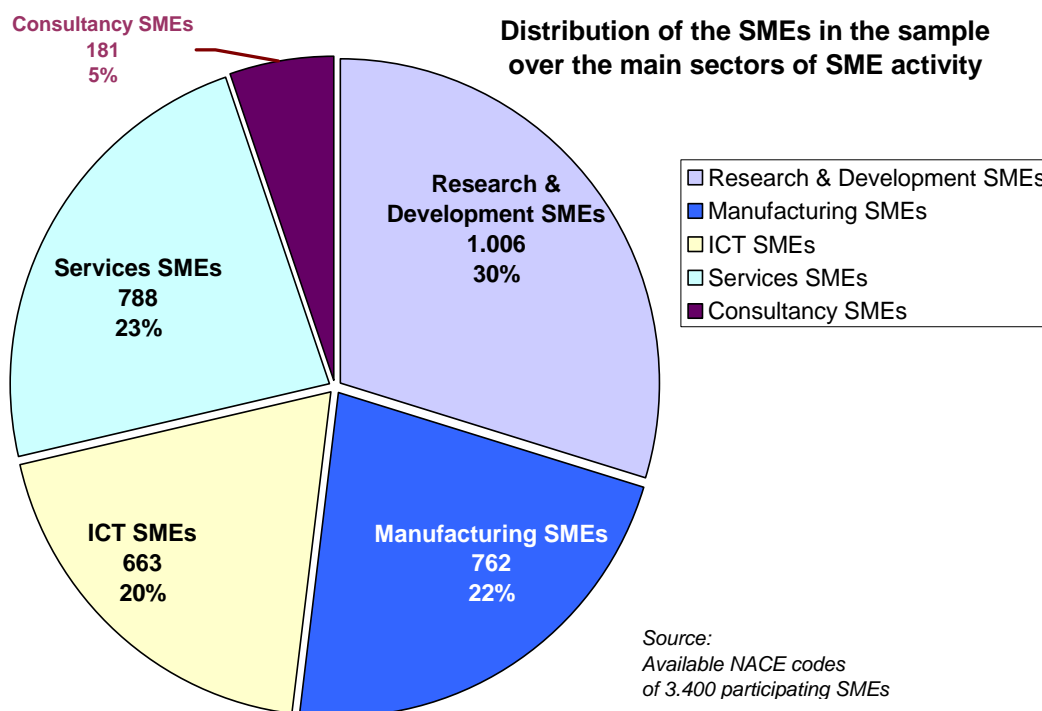
Graph 17: Participating SMEs per country – Distribution over the Themes

SME profiles – sectors of activity

For 3.400 SME participations in projects within the ten Thematic Priorities NACE codes are available. Based upon the NACE codes, the activities were grouped into five main sectors:

1. Research and Development (Economic) Activities
2. Manufacturing sector
3. Information and Communication sector
4. Consultancy services
5. Other Services

The distribution of the SMEs over the main sectors of activity is shown in the graph below.



Graph 18: Distribution of the SMEs over the main five SME activity sectors (sample of SMEs with known NACE codes)

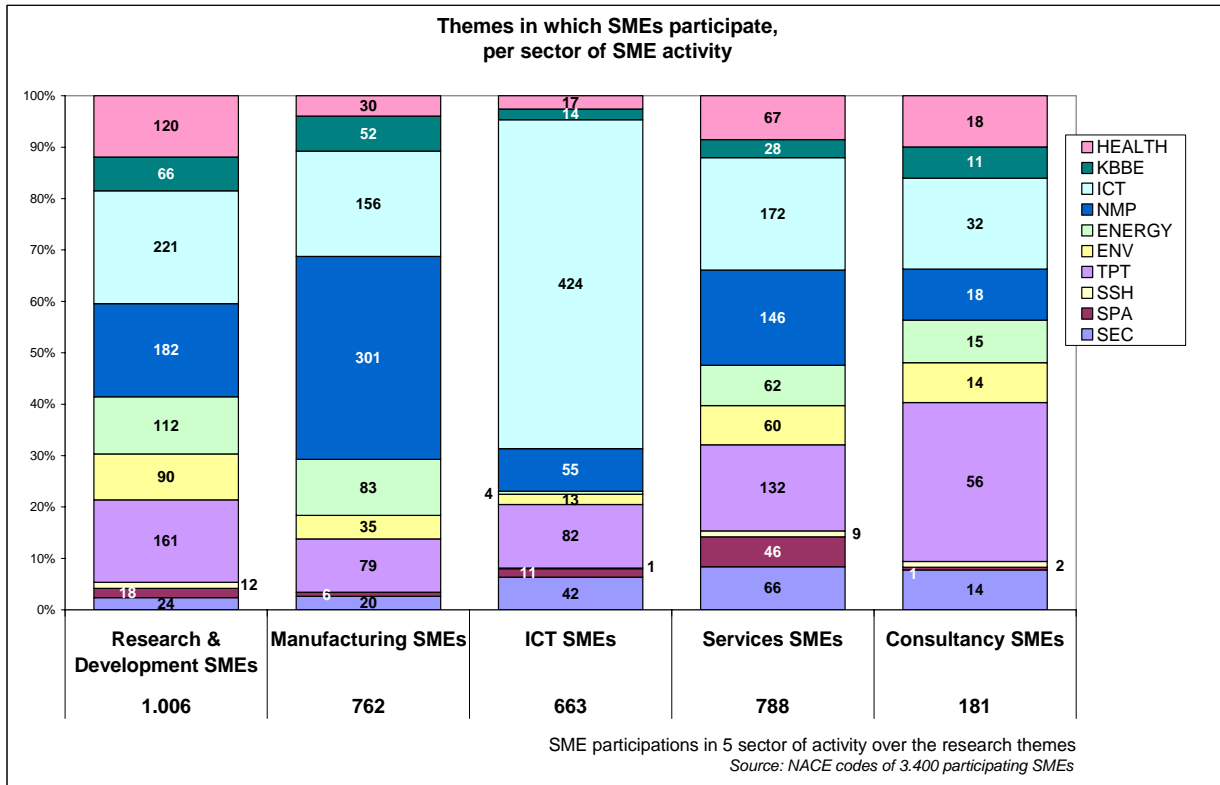

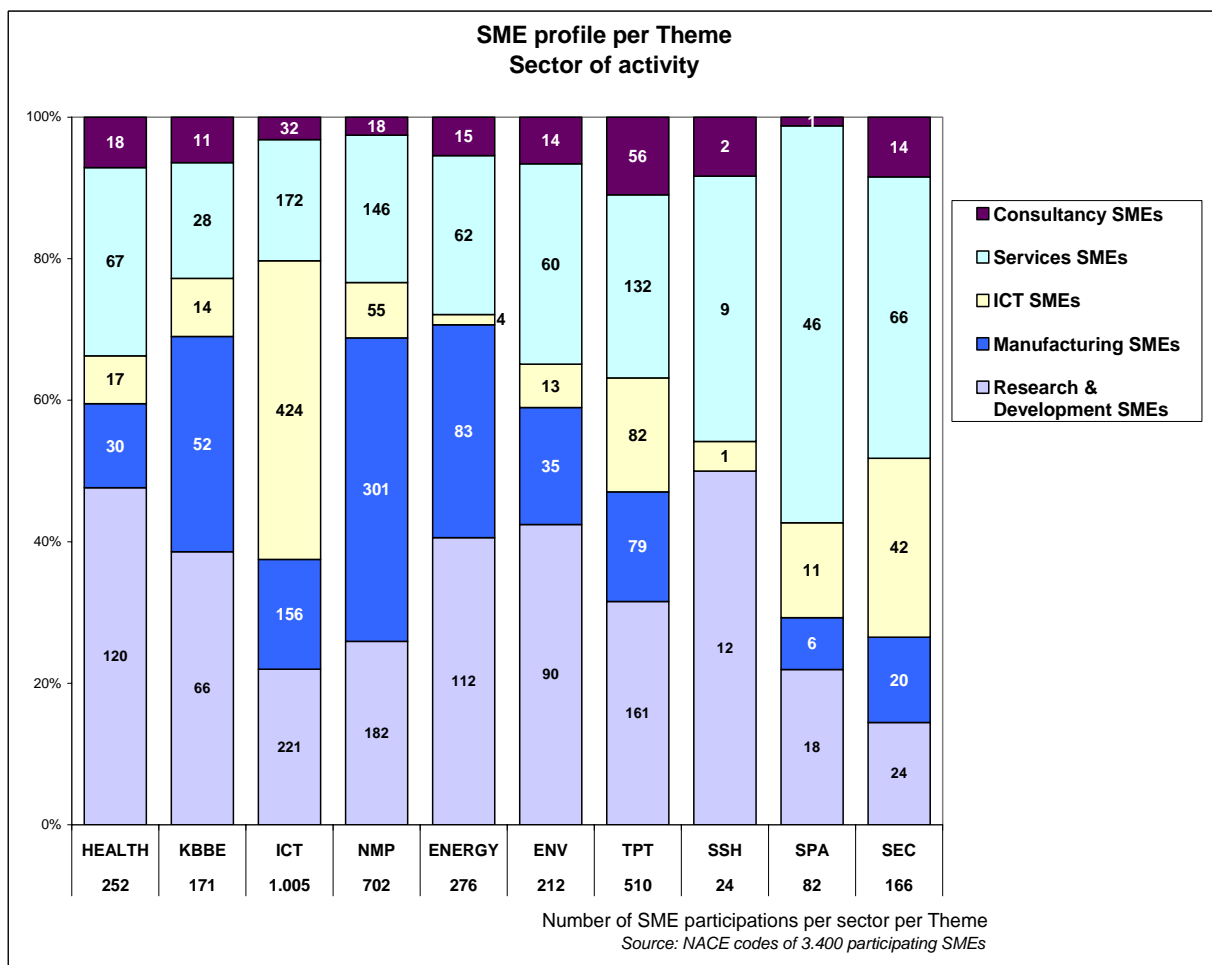
All sectors are represented in all the Themes, with the exception for manufacturing SMEs in SSH.

Apart from the ICT-Programme, ICT companies play quite an important role in other programmes, especially in TPT, NMP and SEC.

Consultancy companies represent a share of only 5% of the participating SMEs, and are typically involved in projects within TPT, HEALTH and SEC.



Graph 19: Themes in which SMEs participate, per sector of activity of the SMEs

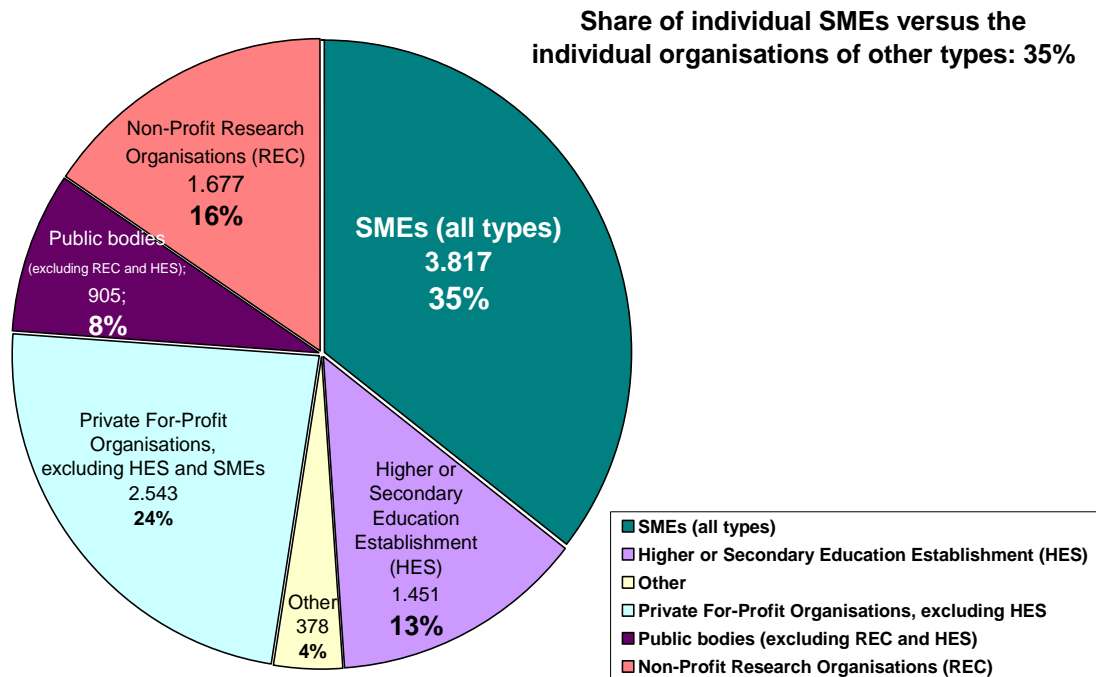


Graph 20: Sectors of activity of the SMEs participating, per Thematic Priority

Similar to FP6, small and medium sized companies are the largest community of individual participants also in the FP7 Cooperation Programme.

Compared to non-SME participants (Higher or secondary education, "Private for profit", Public bodies, and Research organisations), SMEs represent 35,4% of individual entities participating in FP7 Cooperation as shown in the graph below.

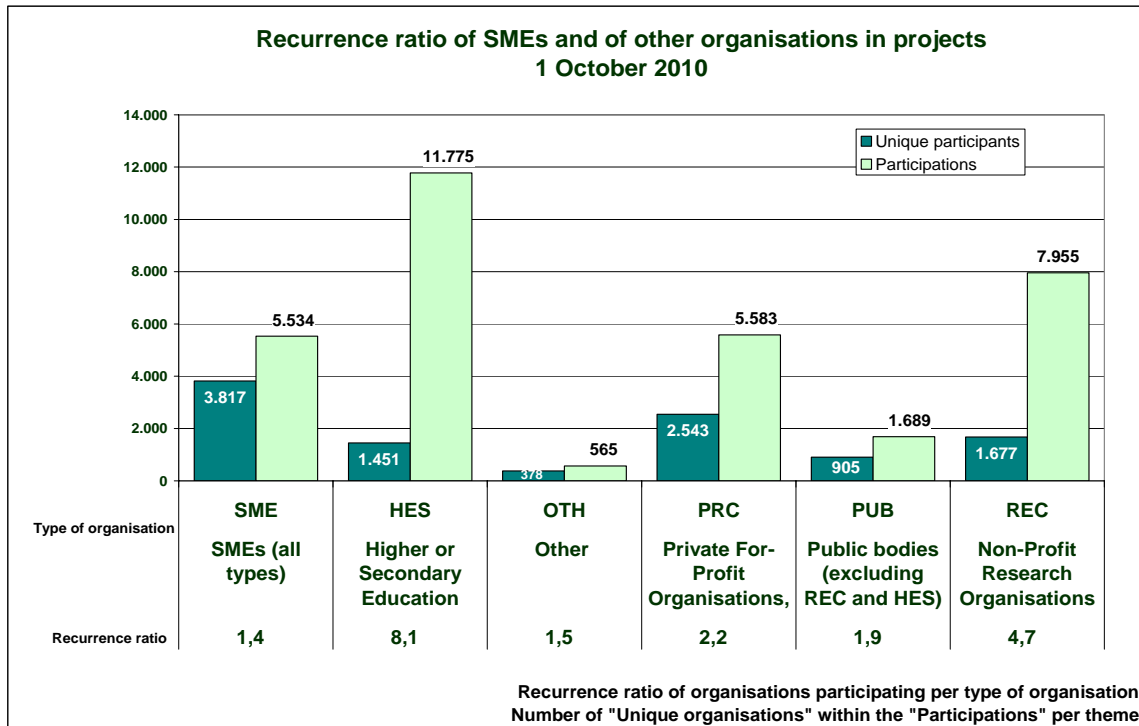


Graph 21: Share of individual SMEs versus the individual organisations of other types (FP7-Themes)

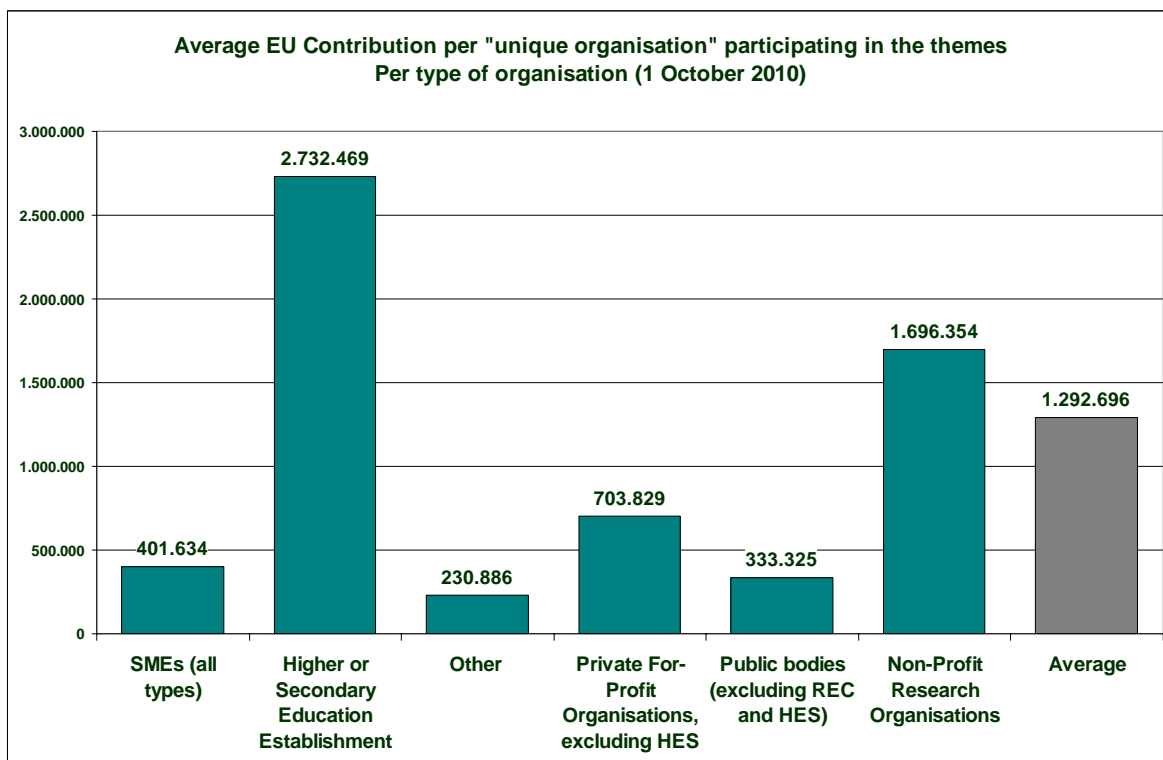
Recurrence ratio of SMEs versus other types of organisations within the Themes

Graph 23: Average EU Contribution to SMEs versus other organisations participating in FP7

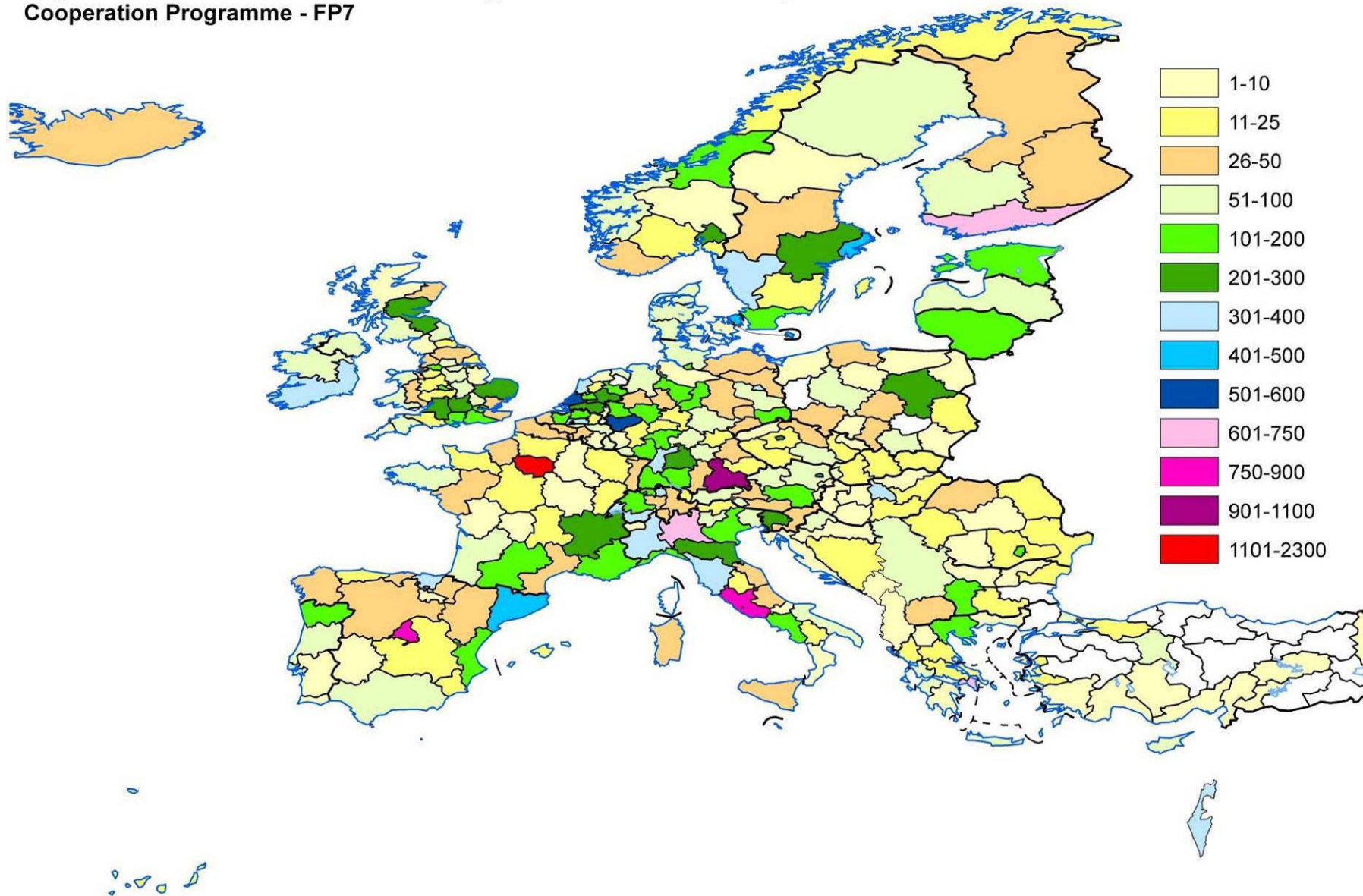

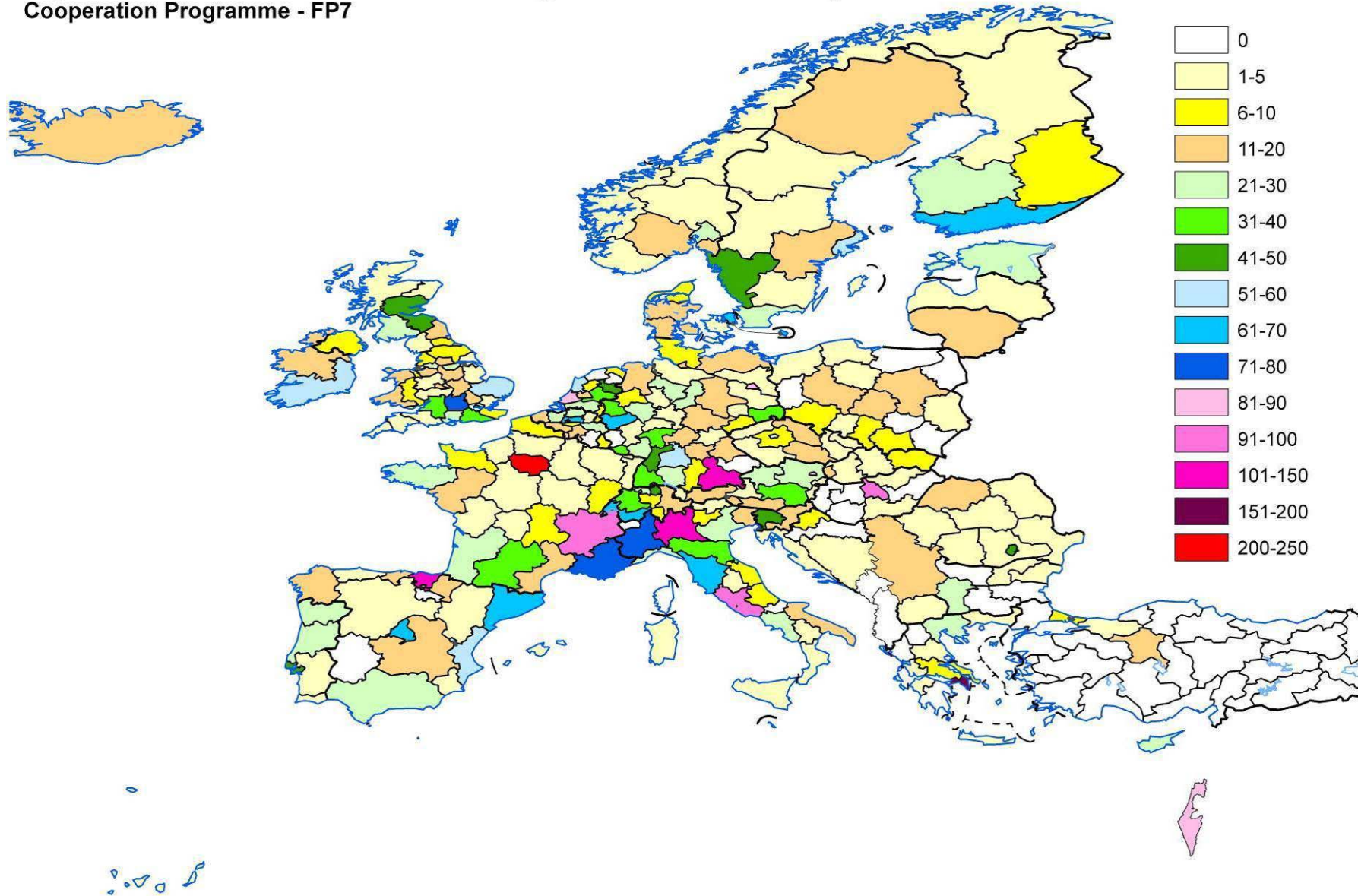

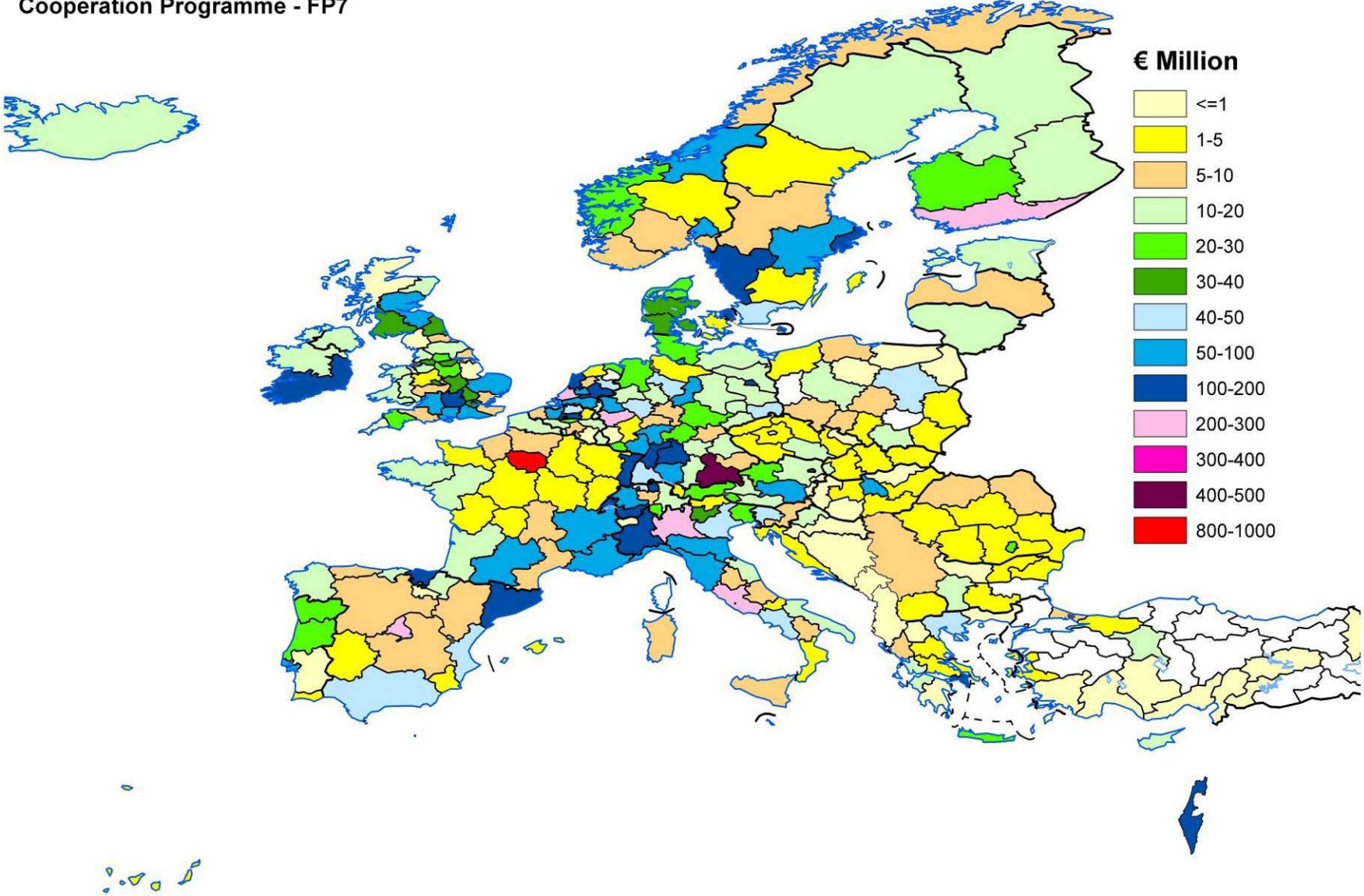
Map 1: Cooperation Programme – FP7. Regional Distribution of Beneficiaries in Signed Contracts as of the 1 October 2010

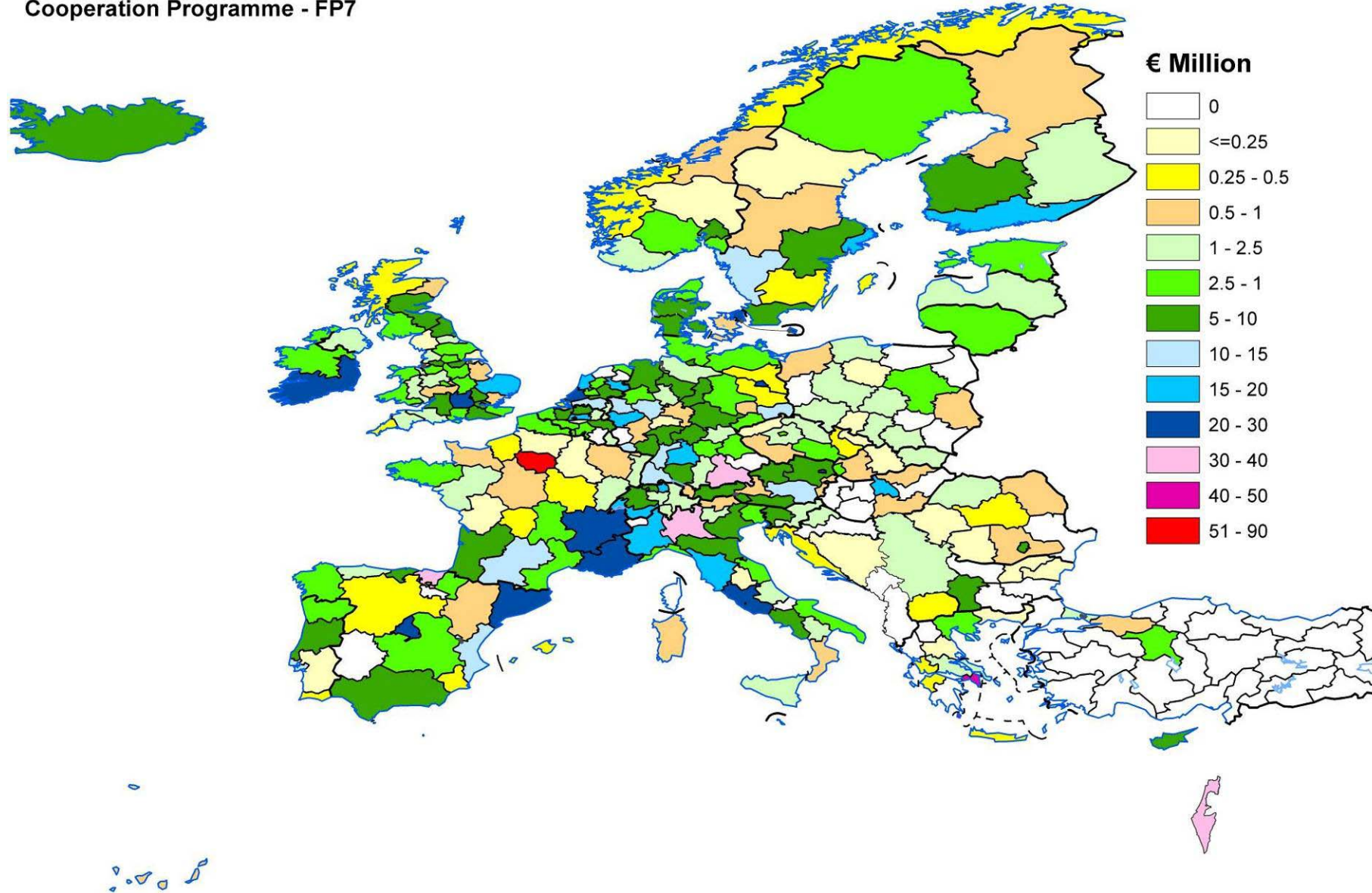
Map 2: Cooperation Programme – FP7. Regional Distribution of SME Beneficiaries in Signed Contracts as of the 1 October 2010

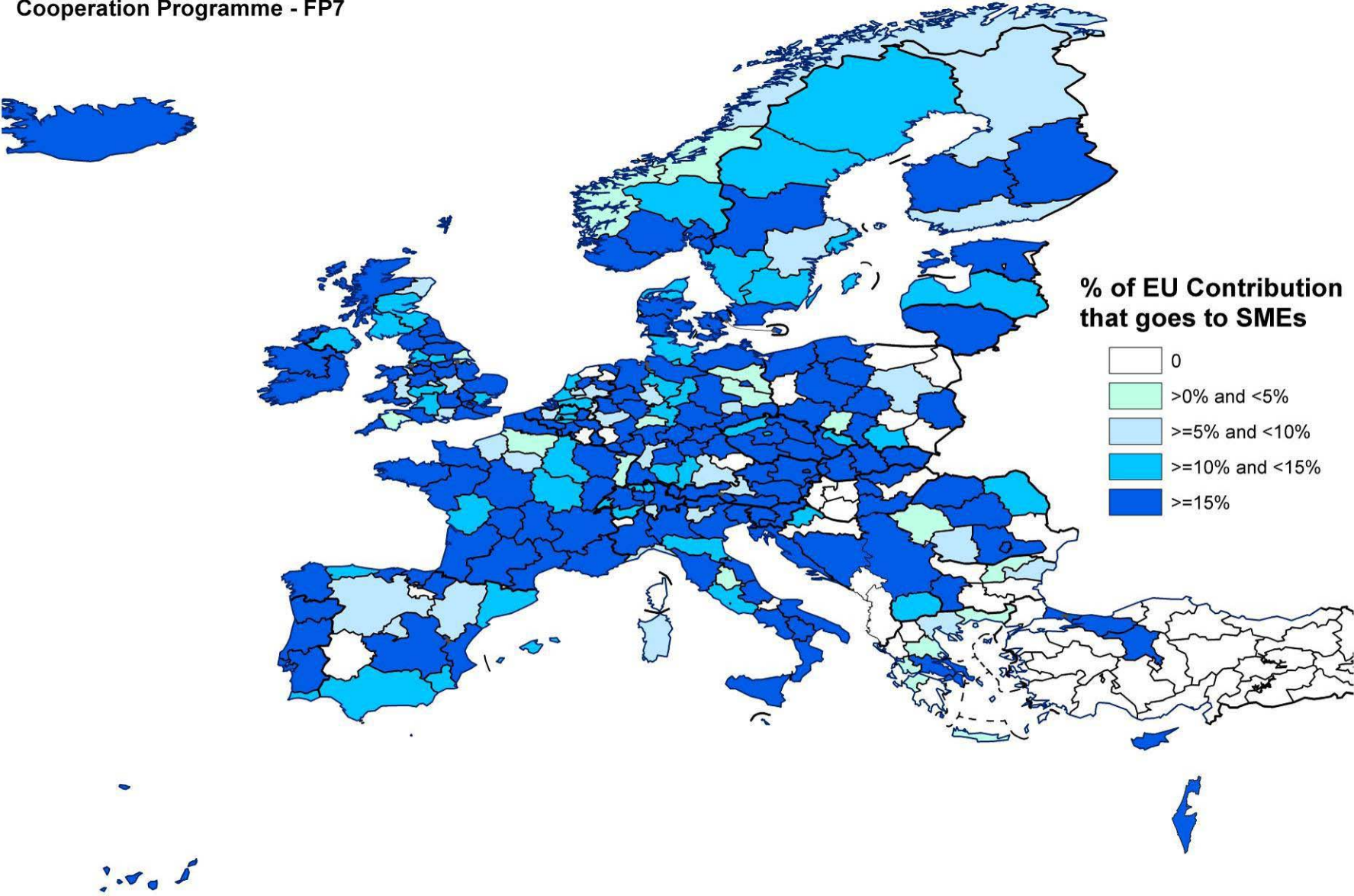
Map 3: Cooperation Programme – FP7. Regional Distribution of EU contribution in Signed Contracts as of the 1 October 2010

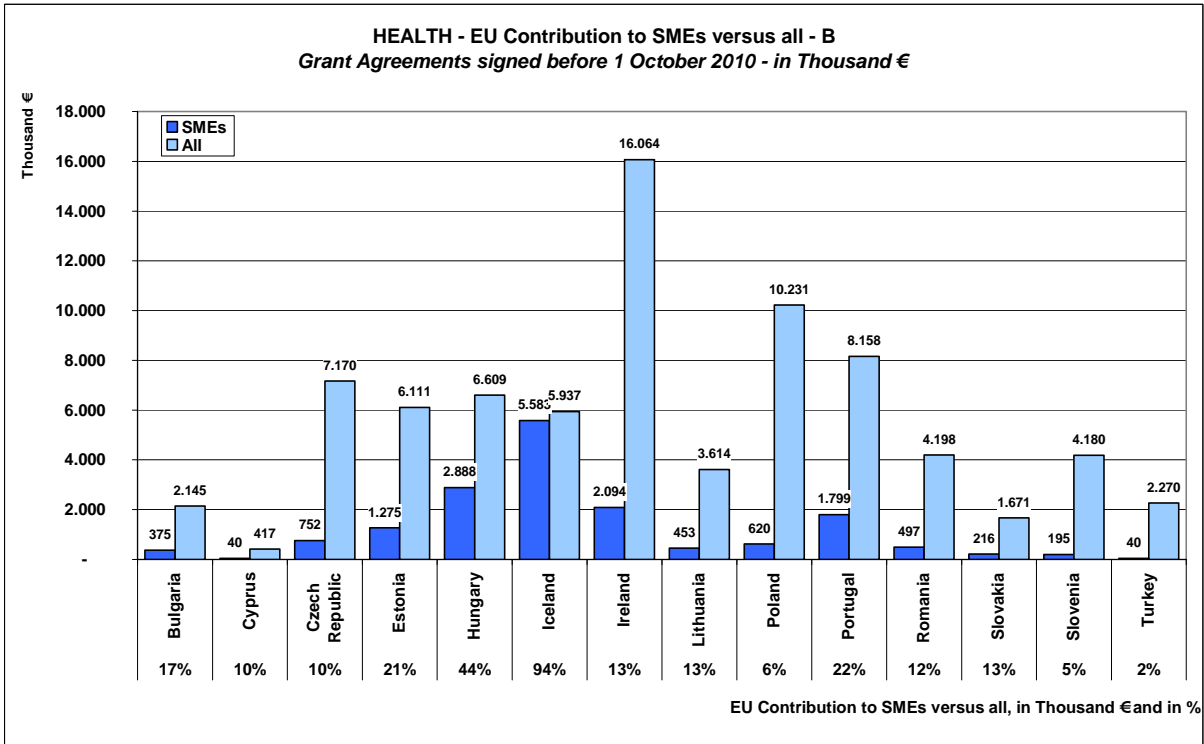
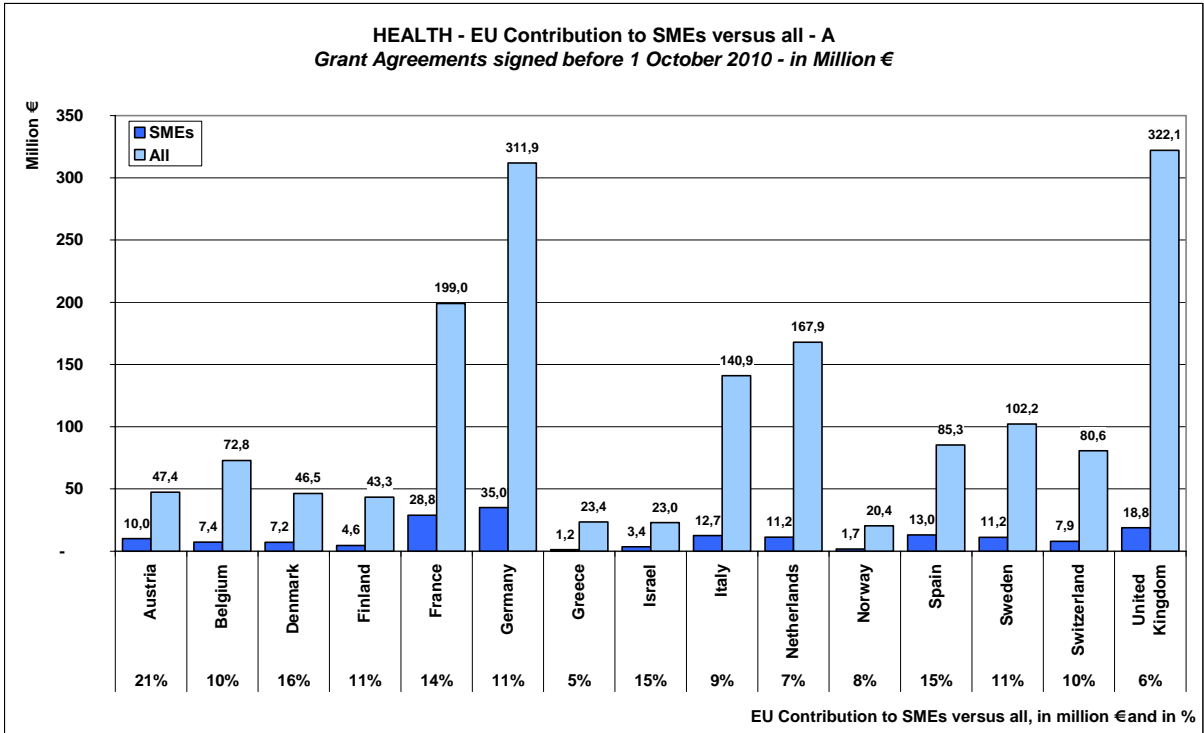

Graph 24: HEALTH: SME Participation – per country



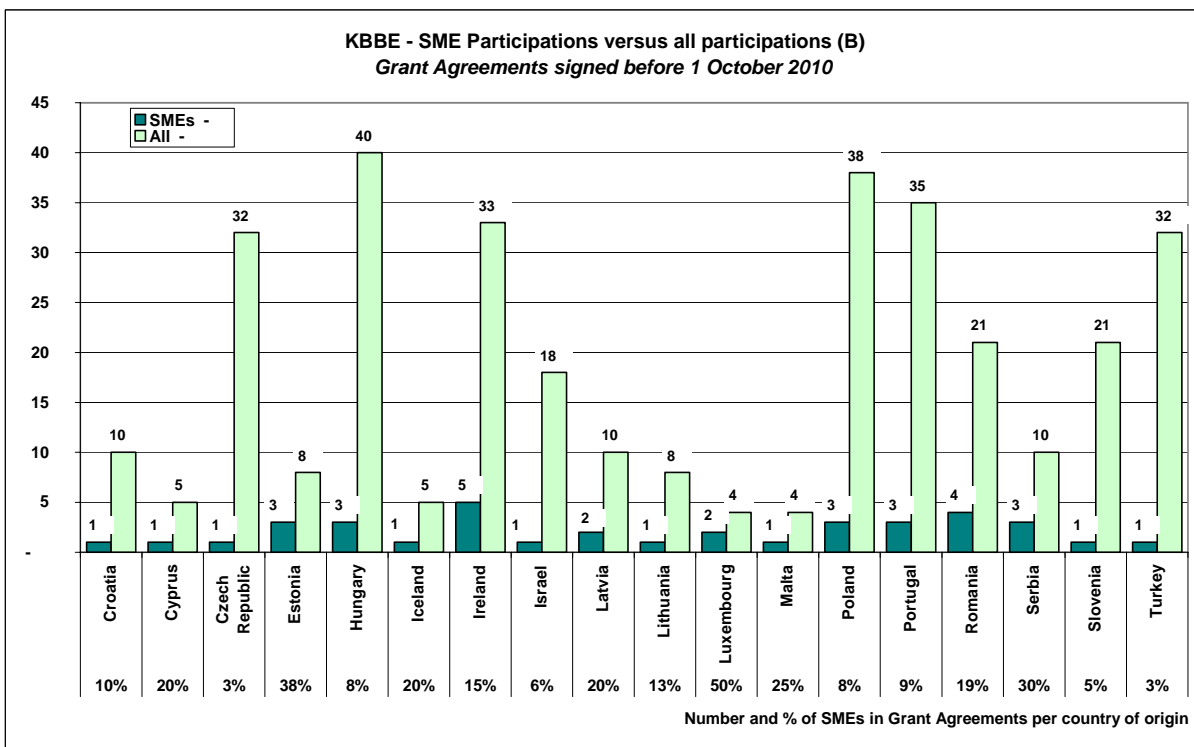
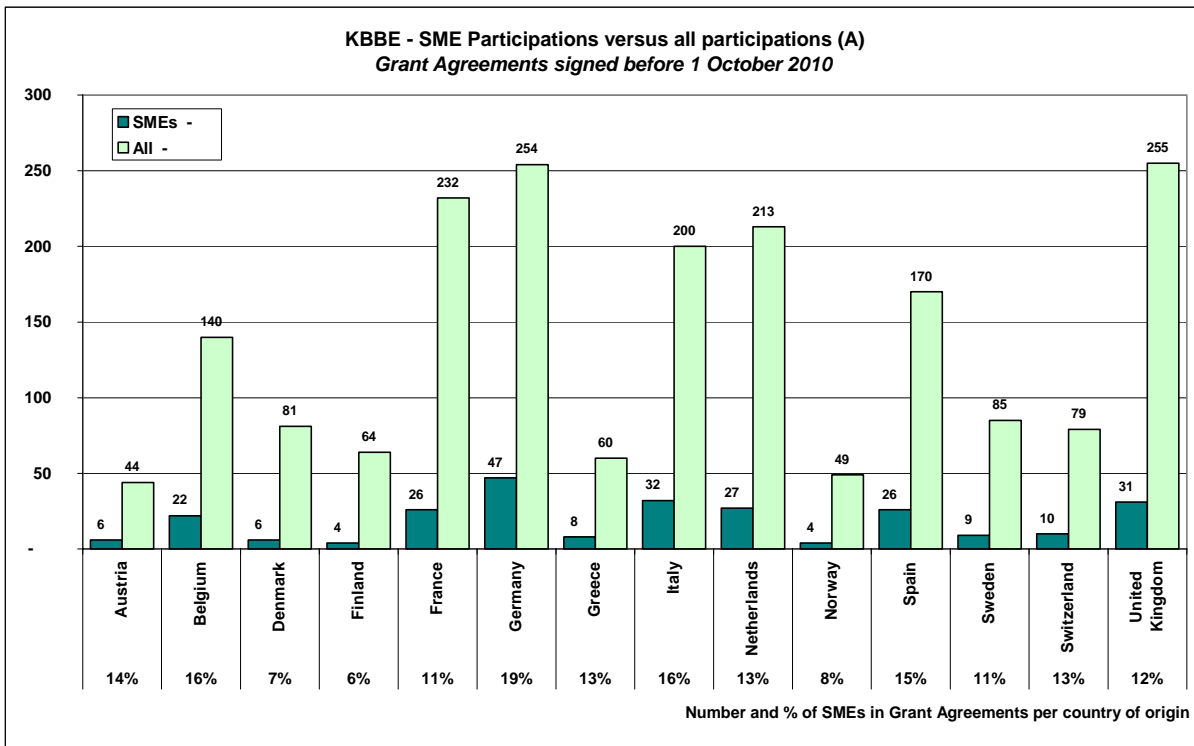
Graph 25: HEALTH: EU Contribution to SMEs – per country

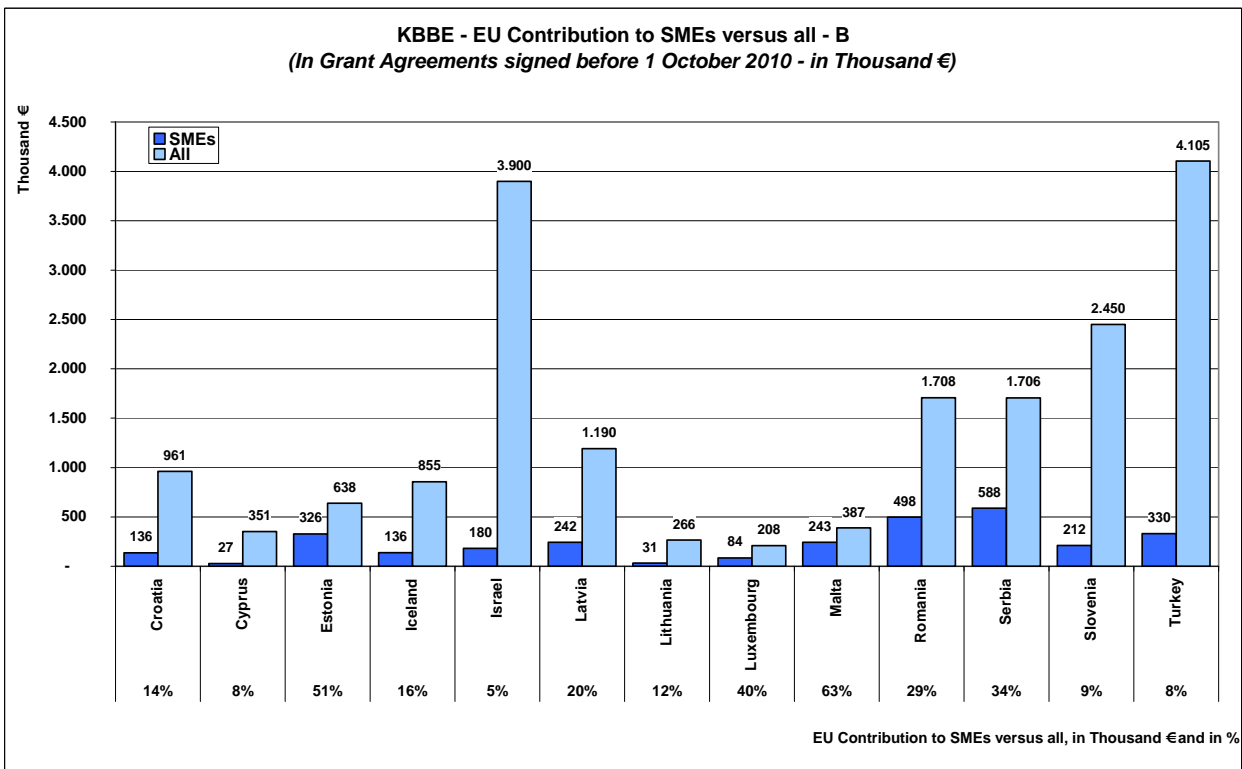
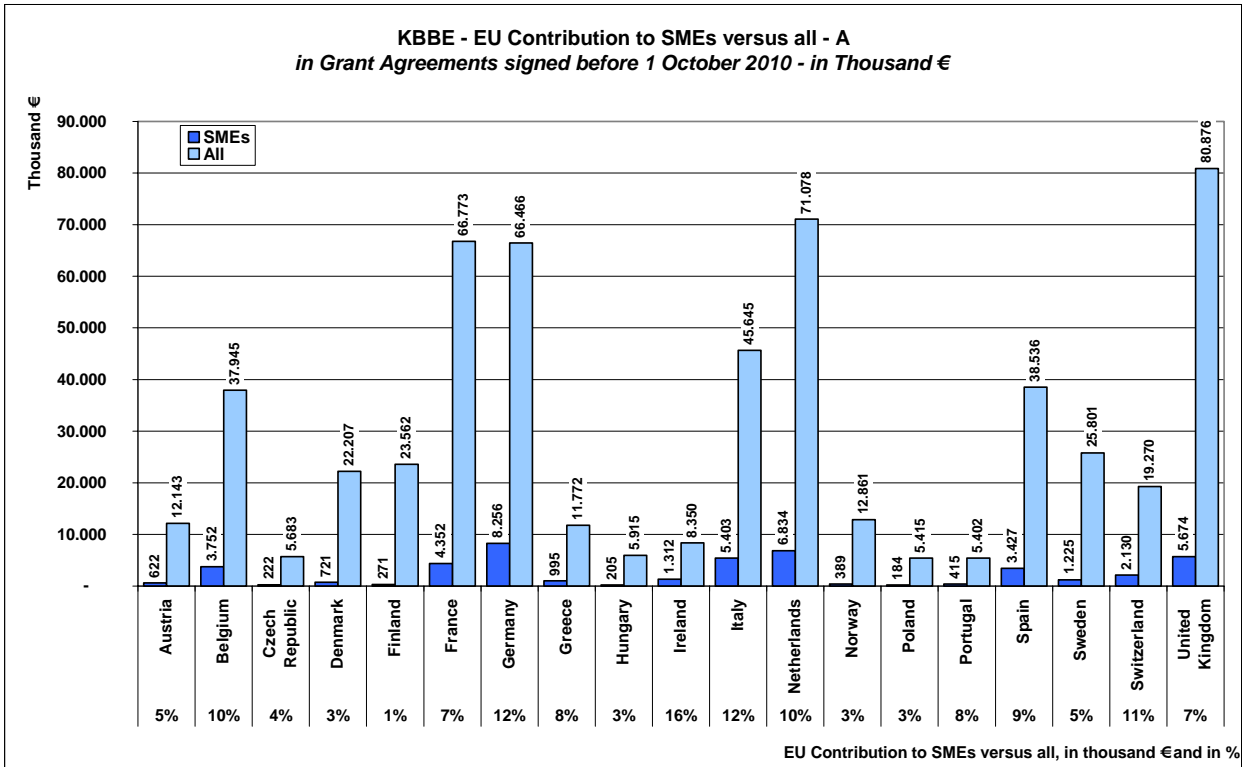

Graph 26: KBBE: SME Participation– per country



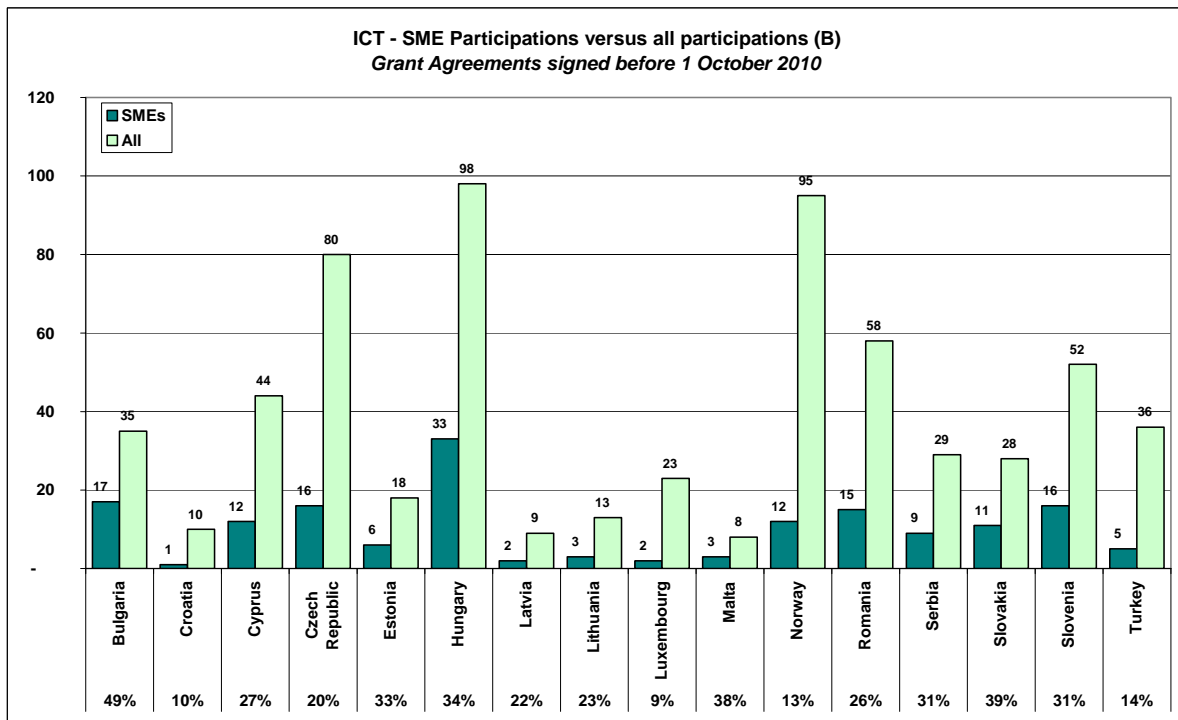
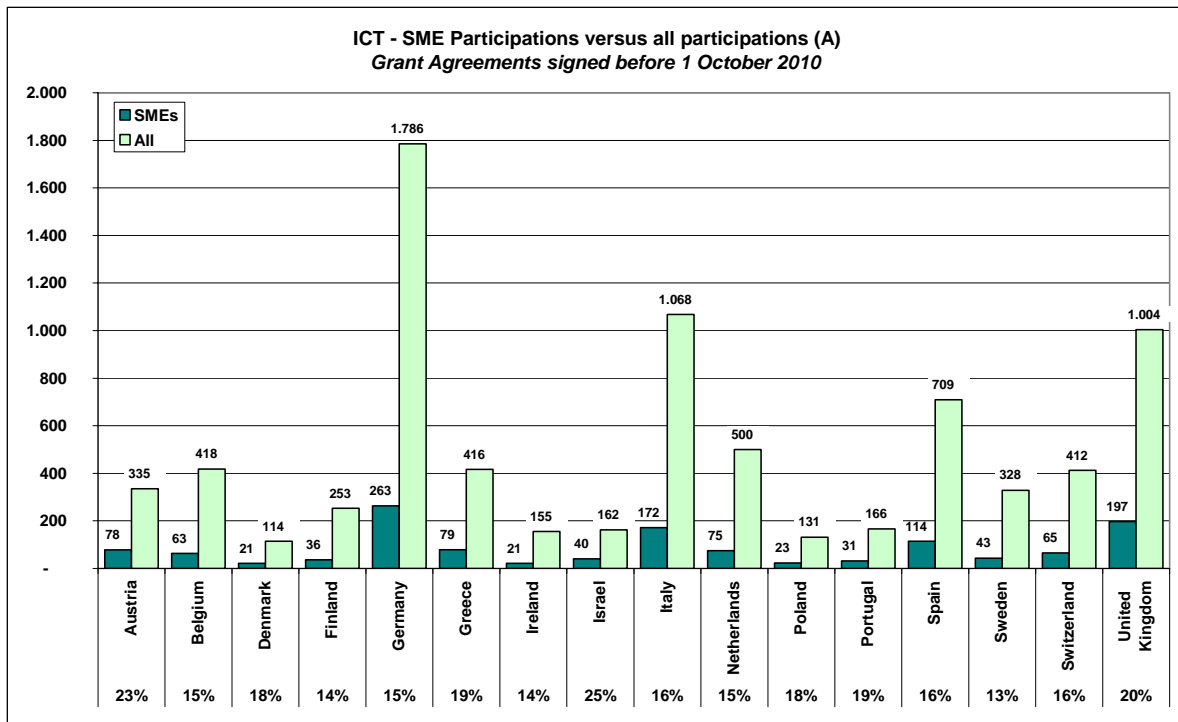
Graph 27: KBBE: EU Contribution to SMEs – per country

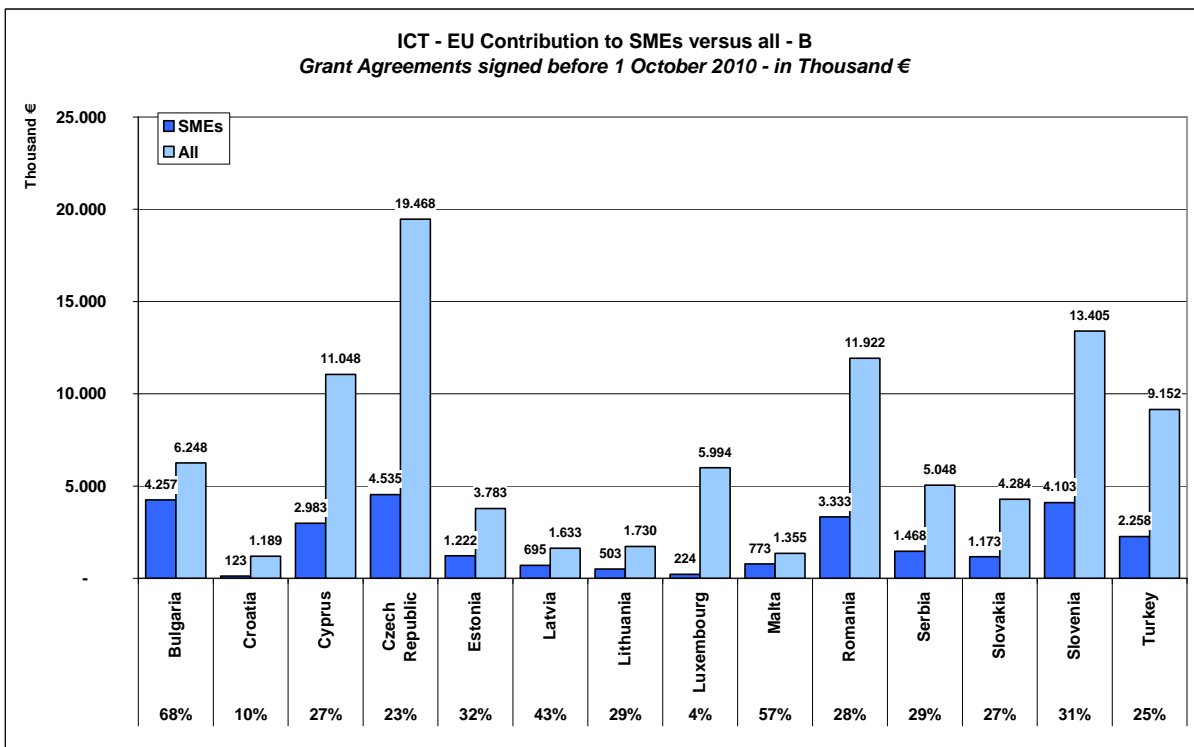
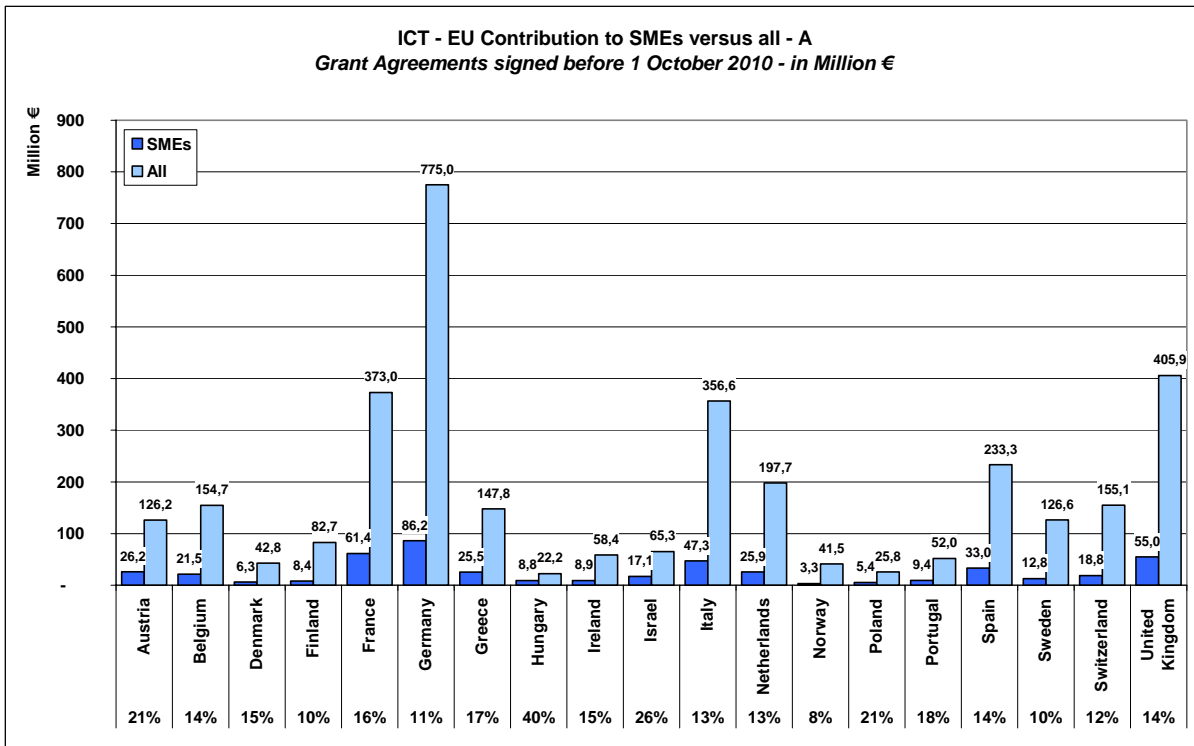

Graph 28: ICT: SME Participation– per country



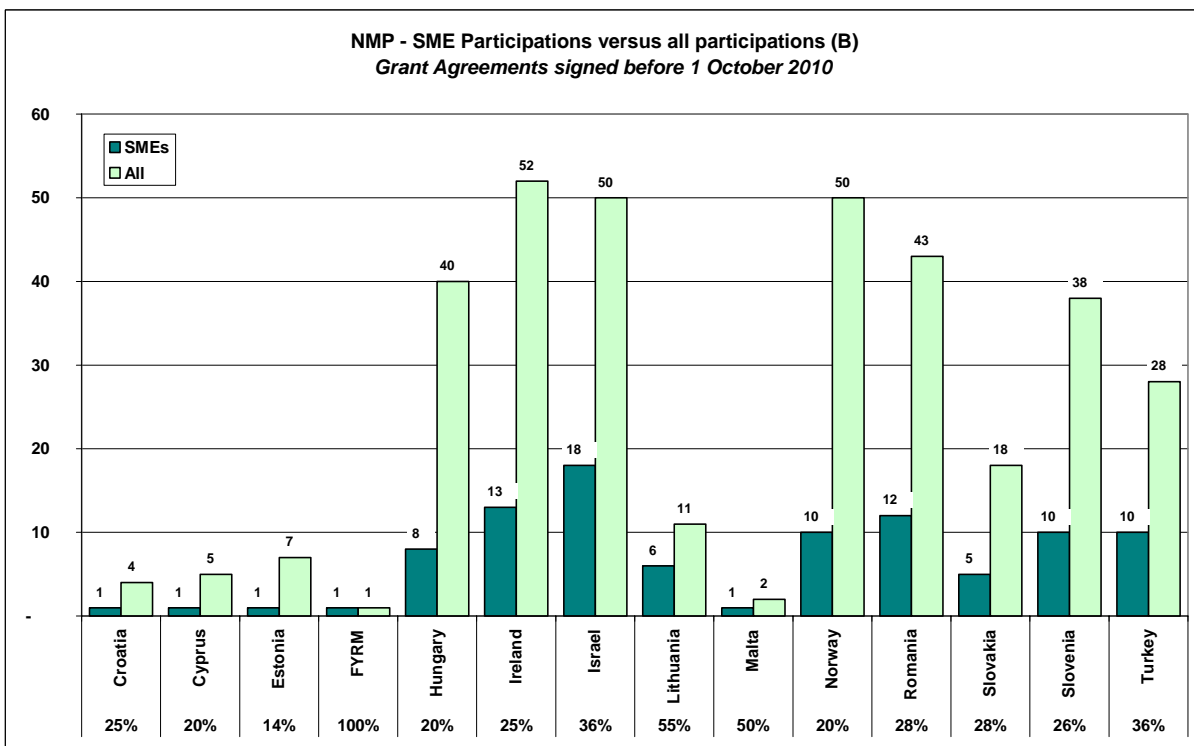
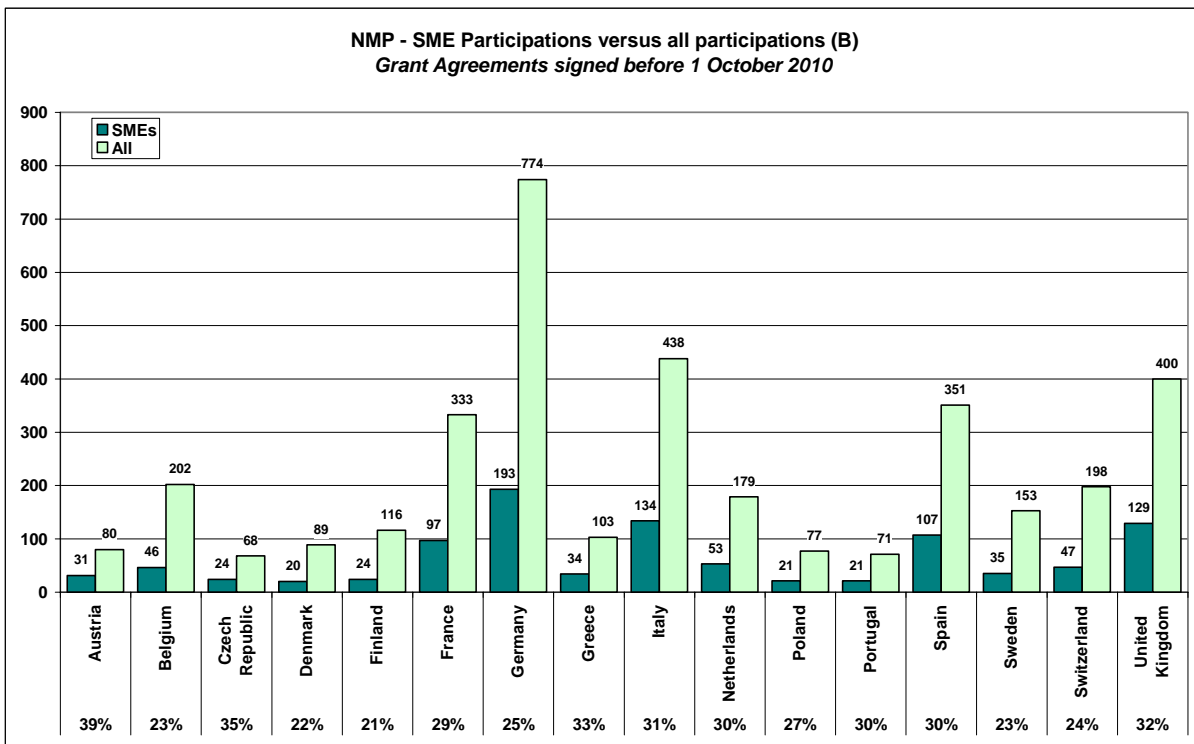
Graph 29: ICT: EU Contribution to SMEs – per country

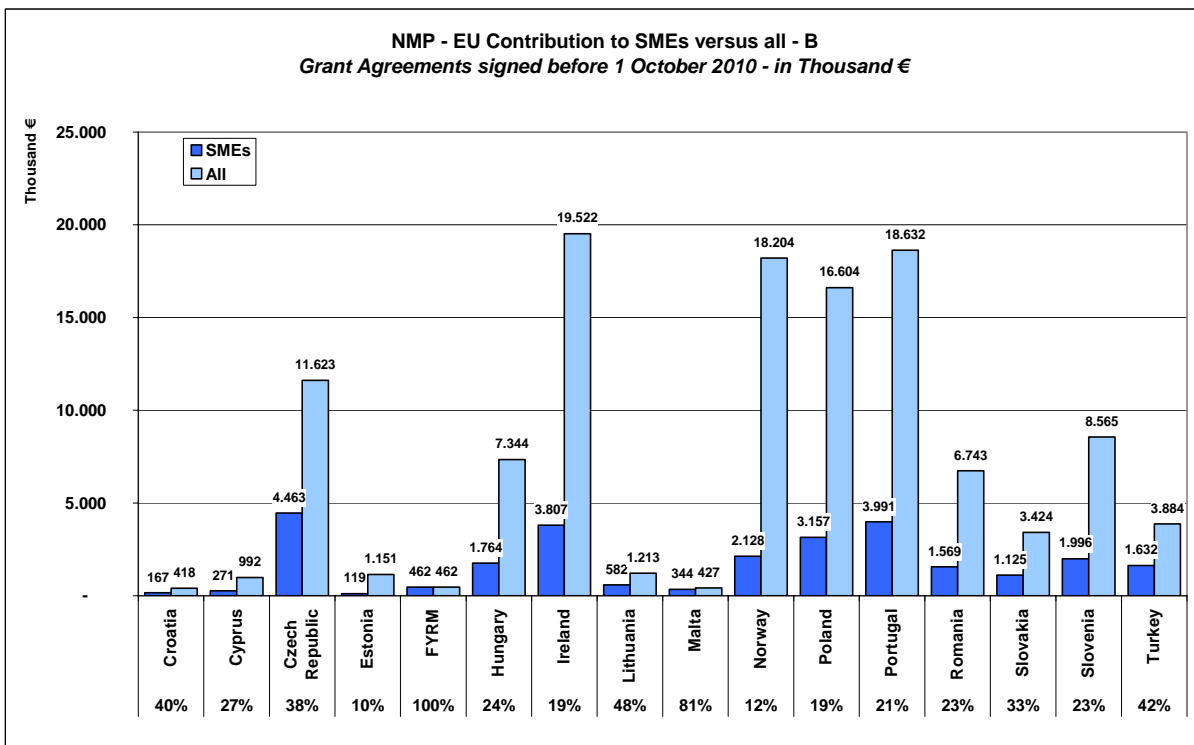
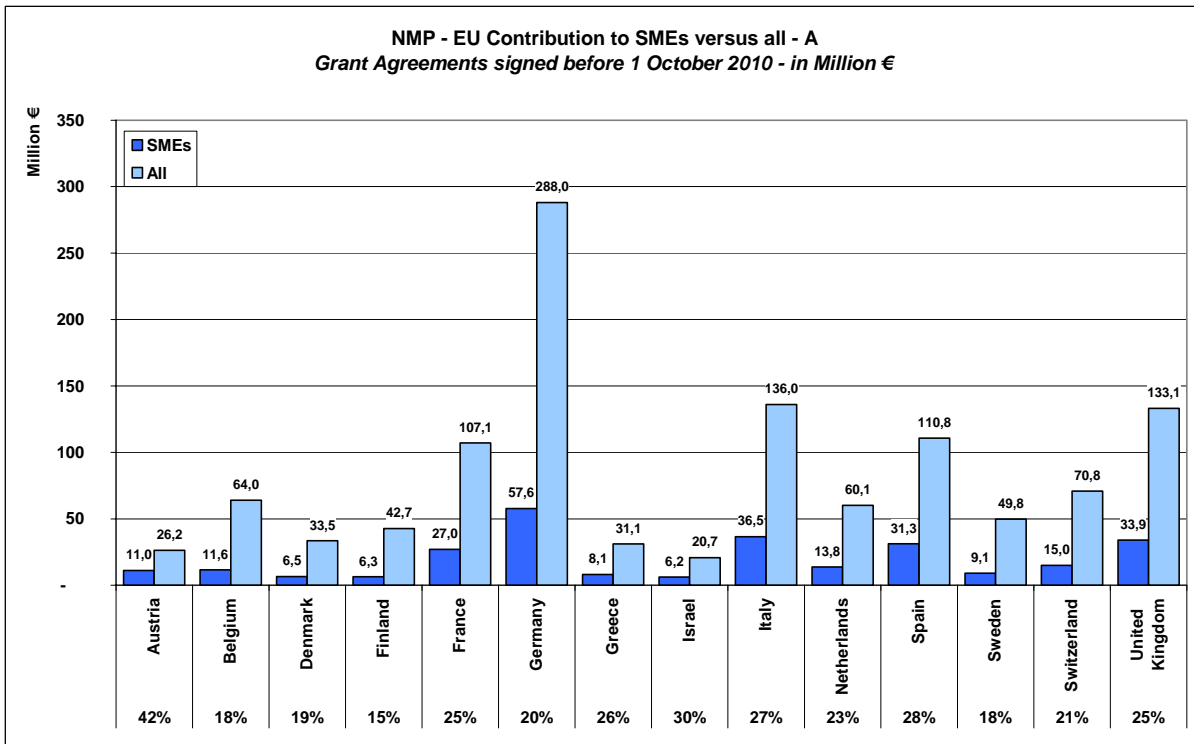

Graph 30: NMP: SME Participation– per country



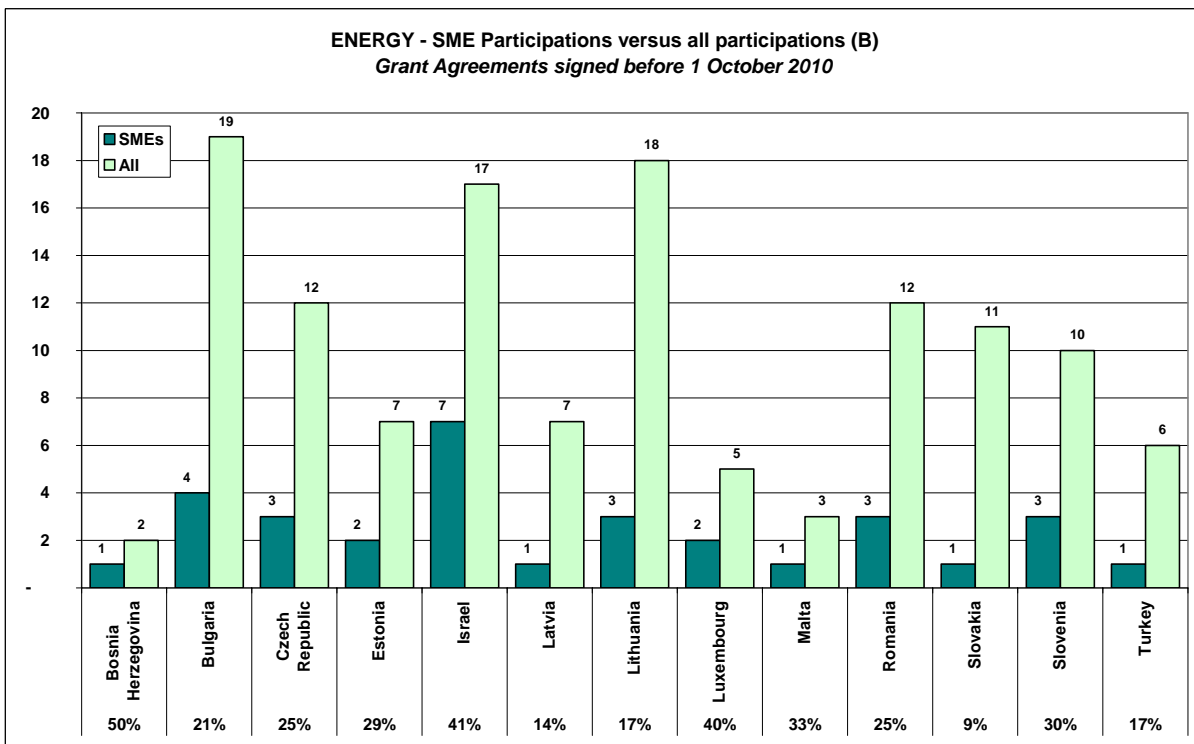
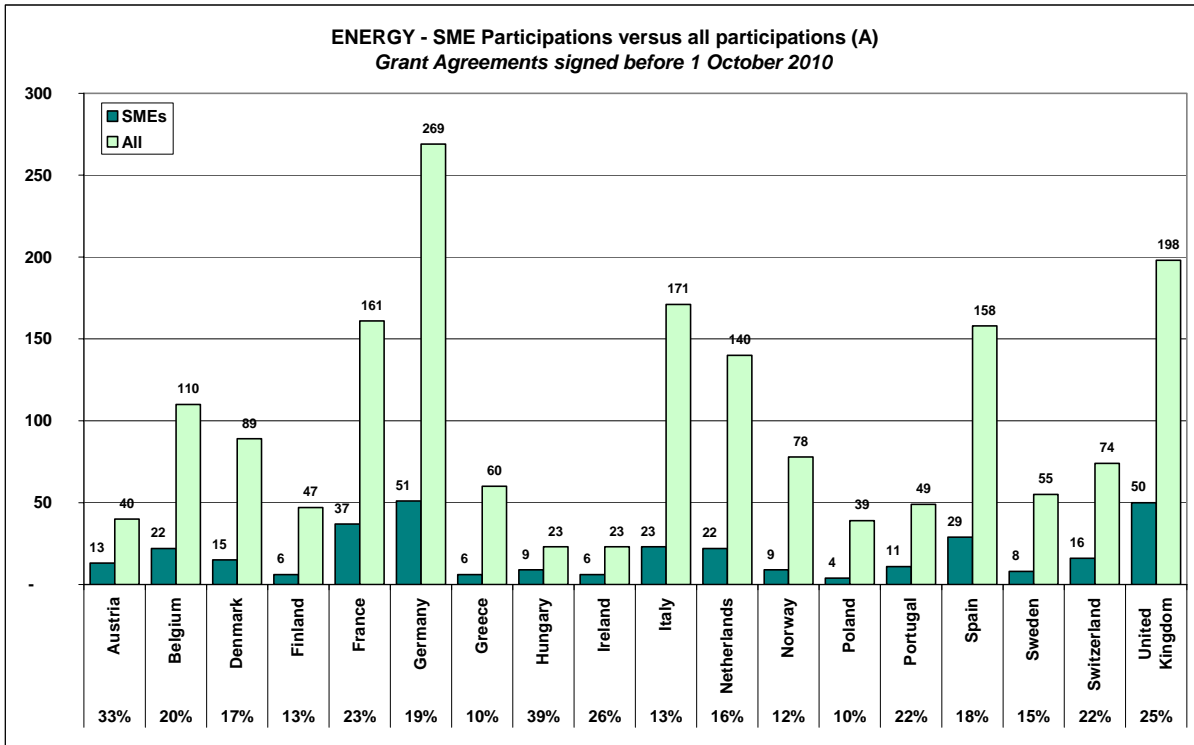
Graph 31: NMP: EU Contribution to SMEs – per country

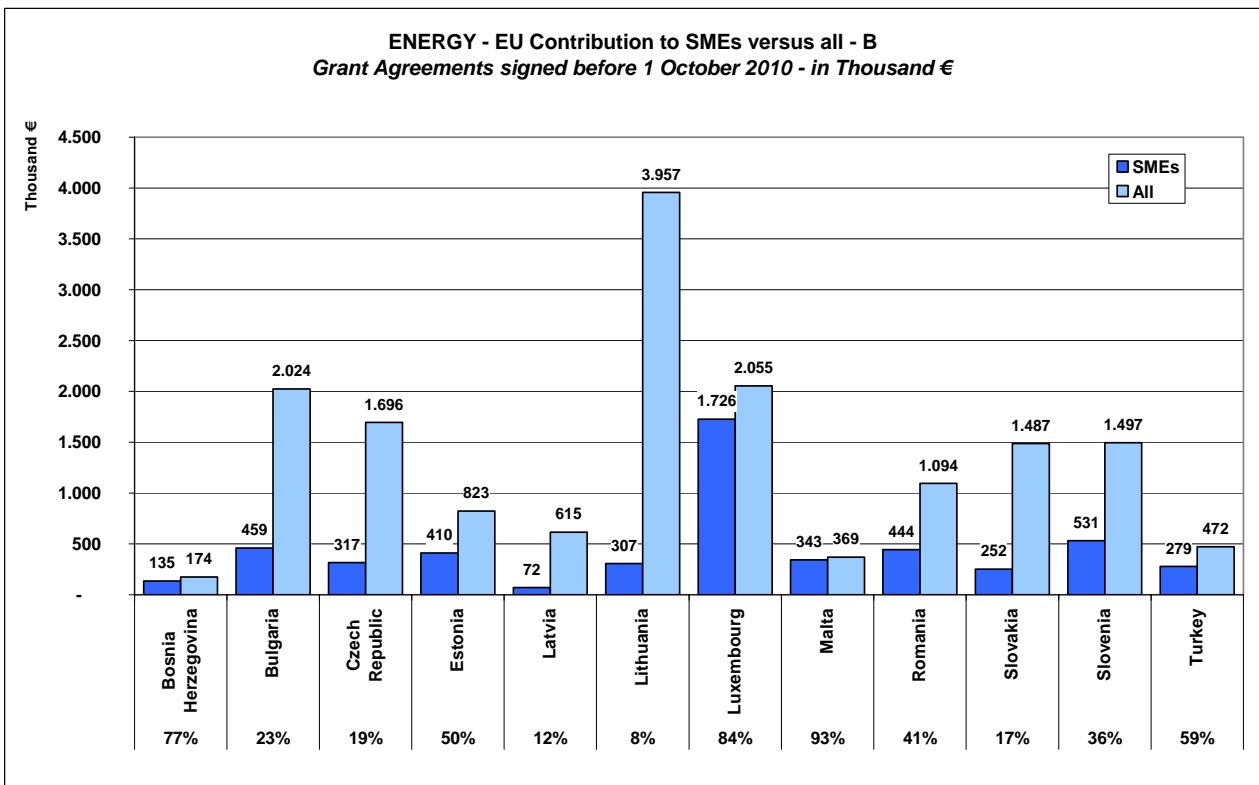
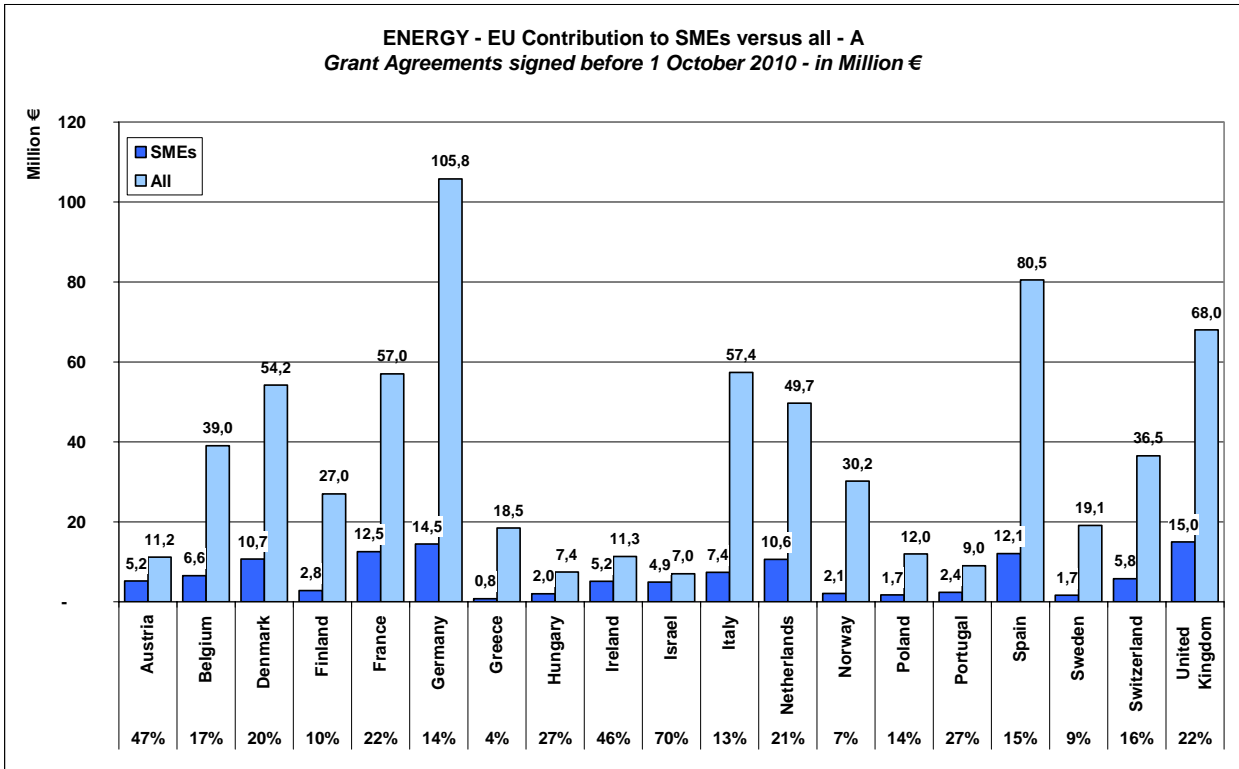

Graph 32: ENERGY: SME Participation– per country



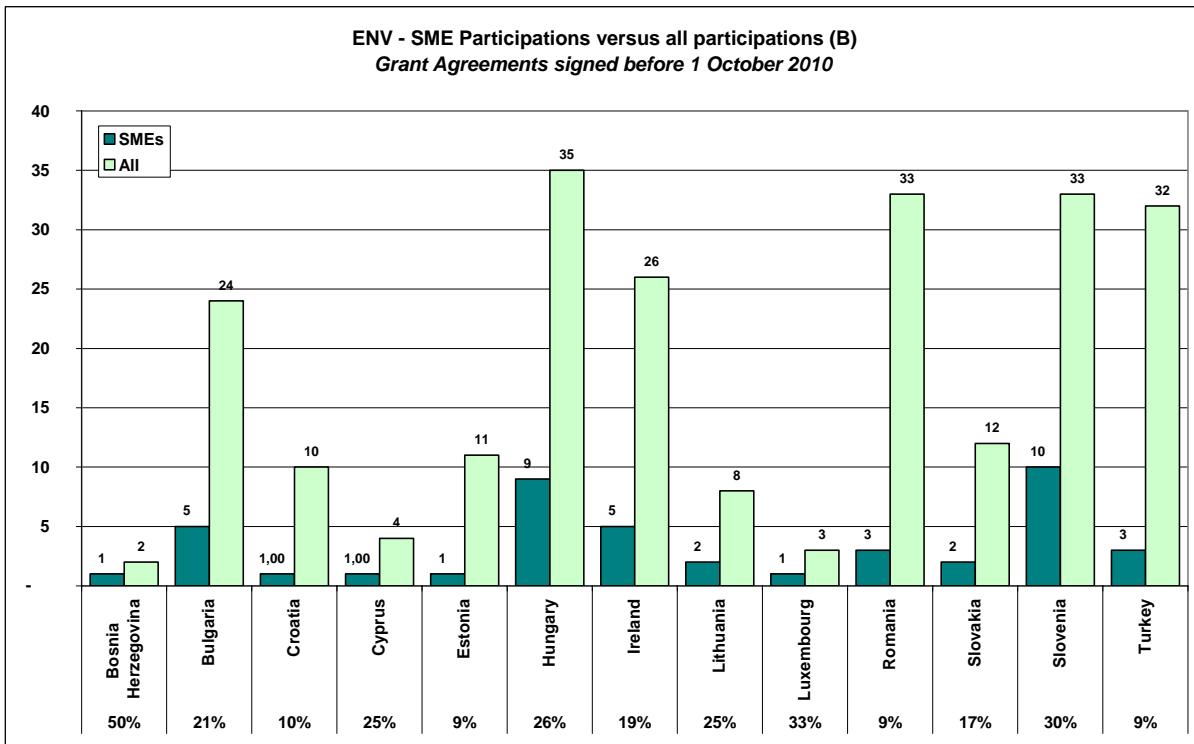
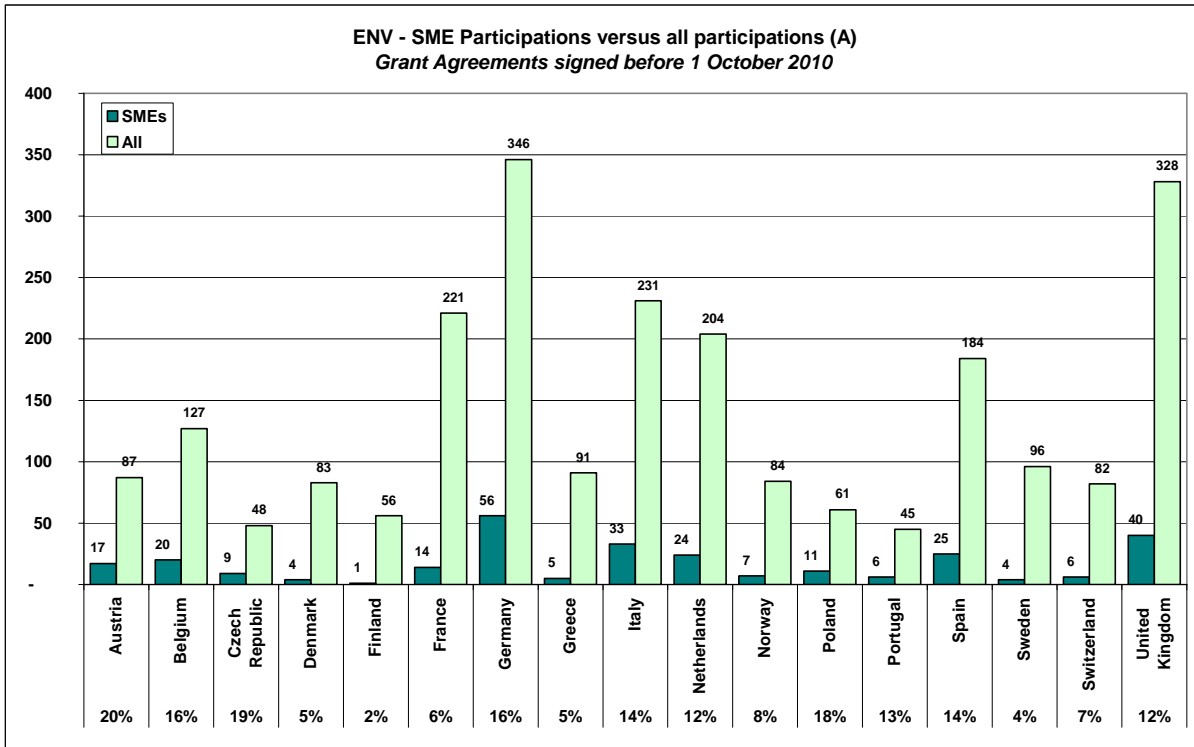
Graph 33: ENERGY: EU Contribution to SMEs – per country

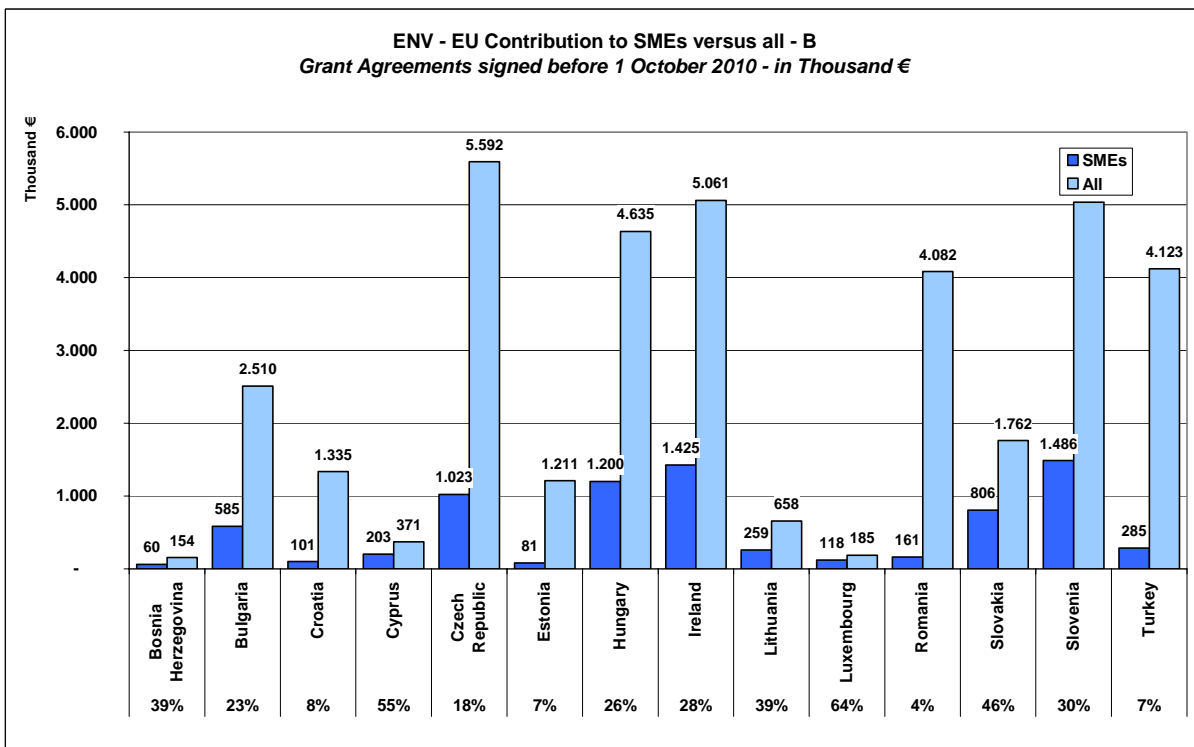
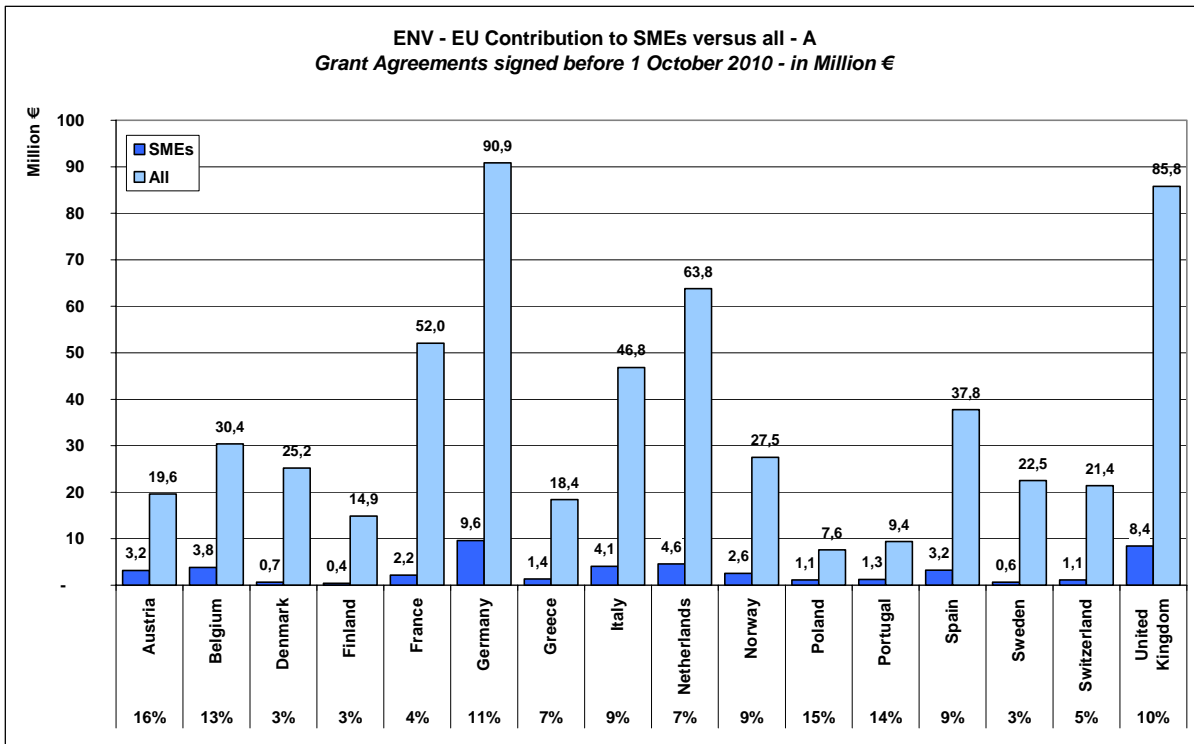

Graph 34: ENV: SME Participation– per country



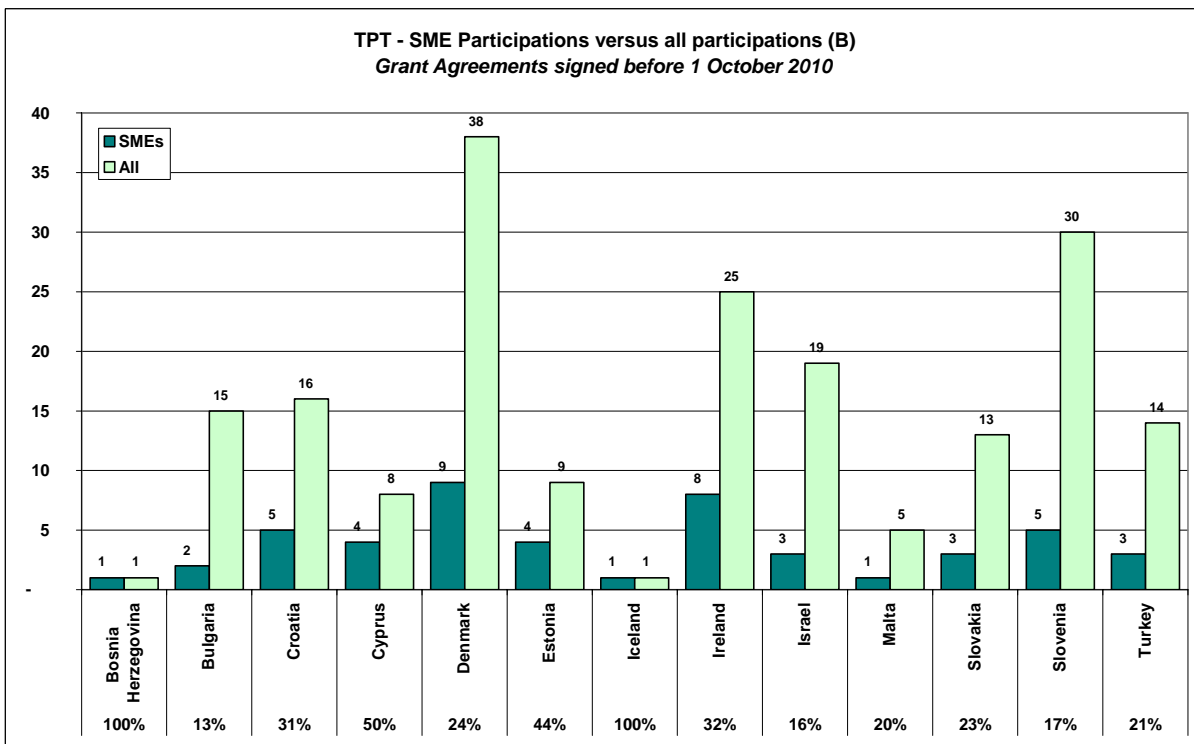
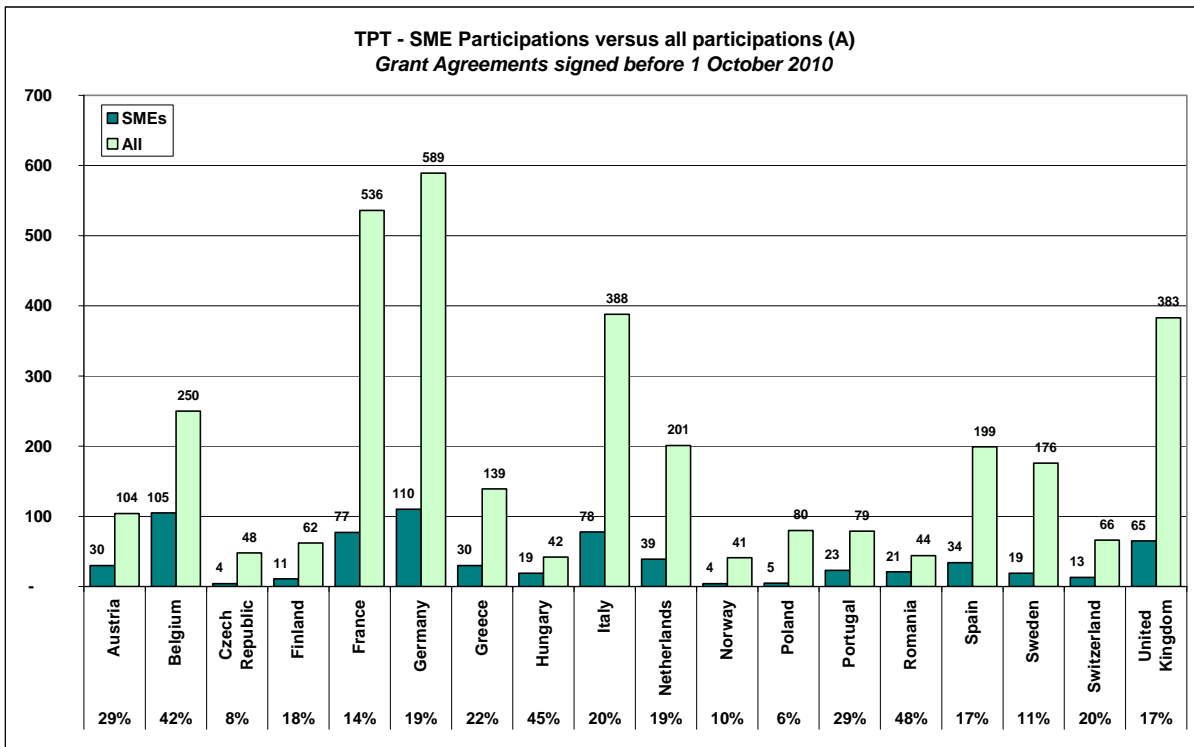
Graph 35: ENV: EU Contribution to SMEs – per country

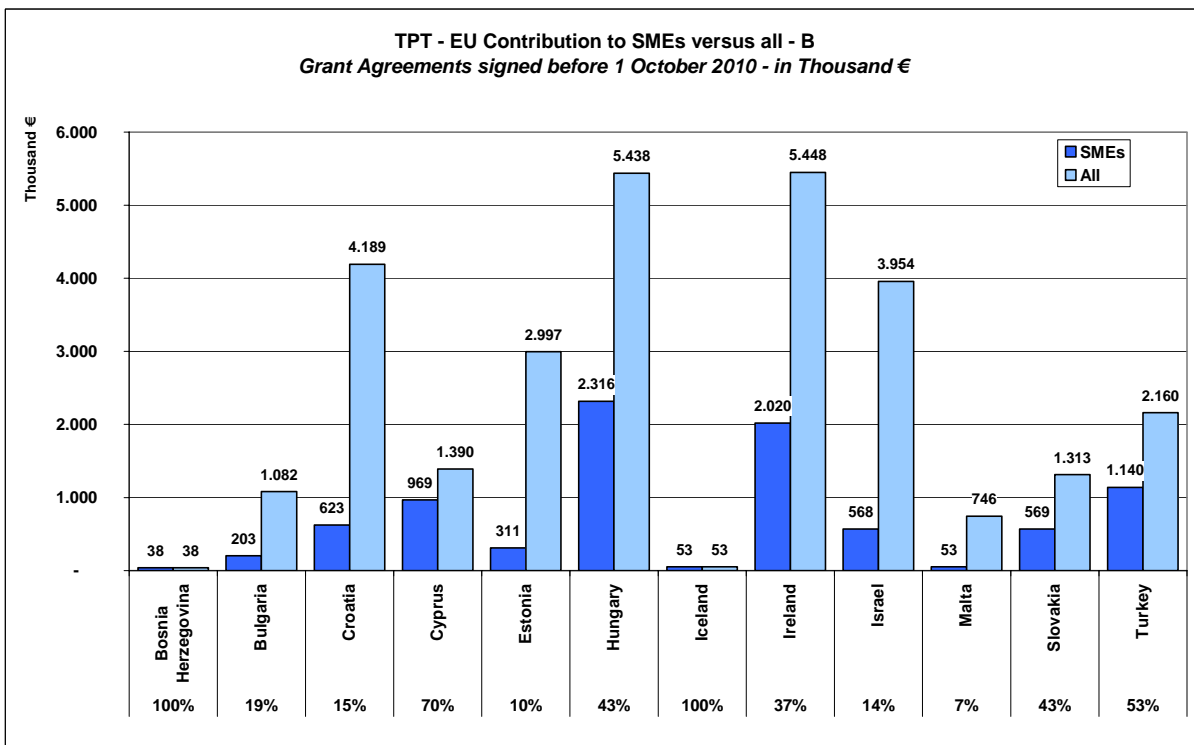
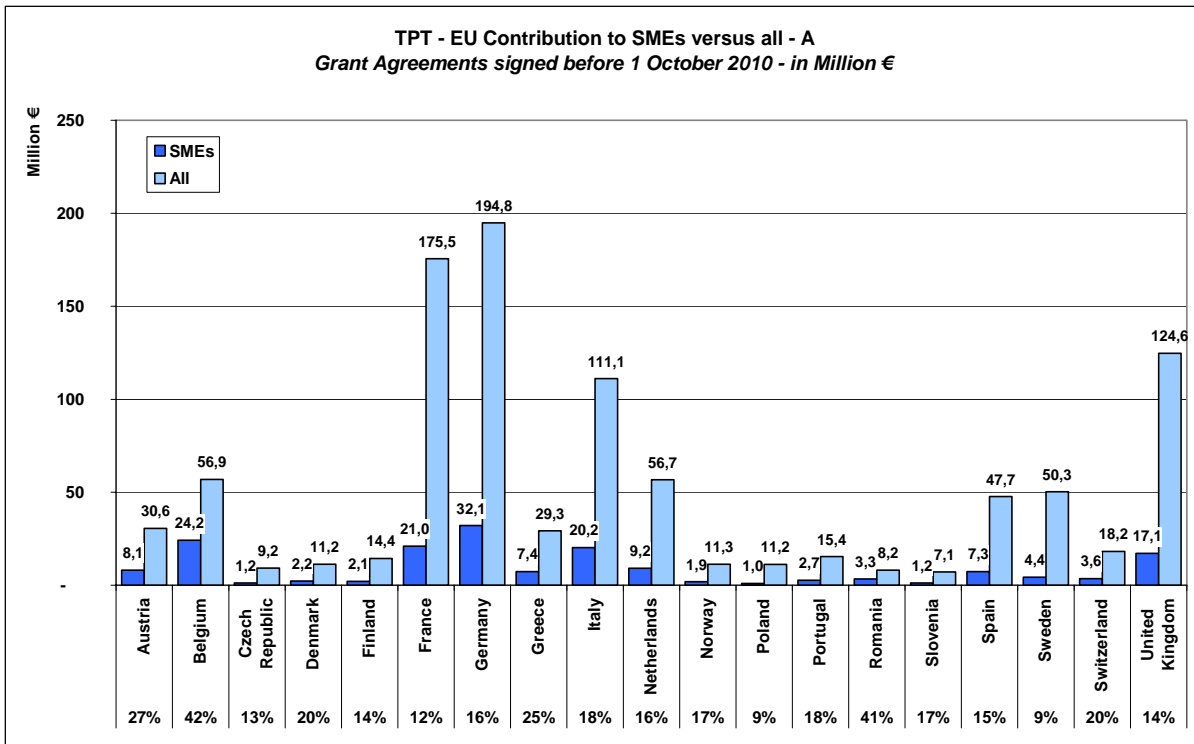

Graph 36: TPT: SME Participation– per country



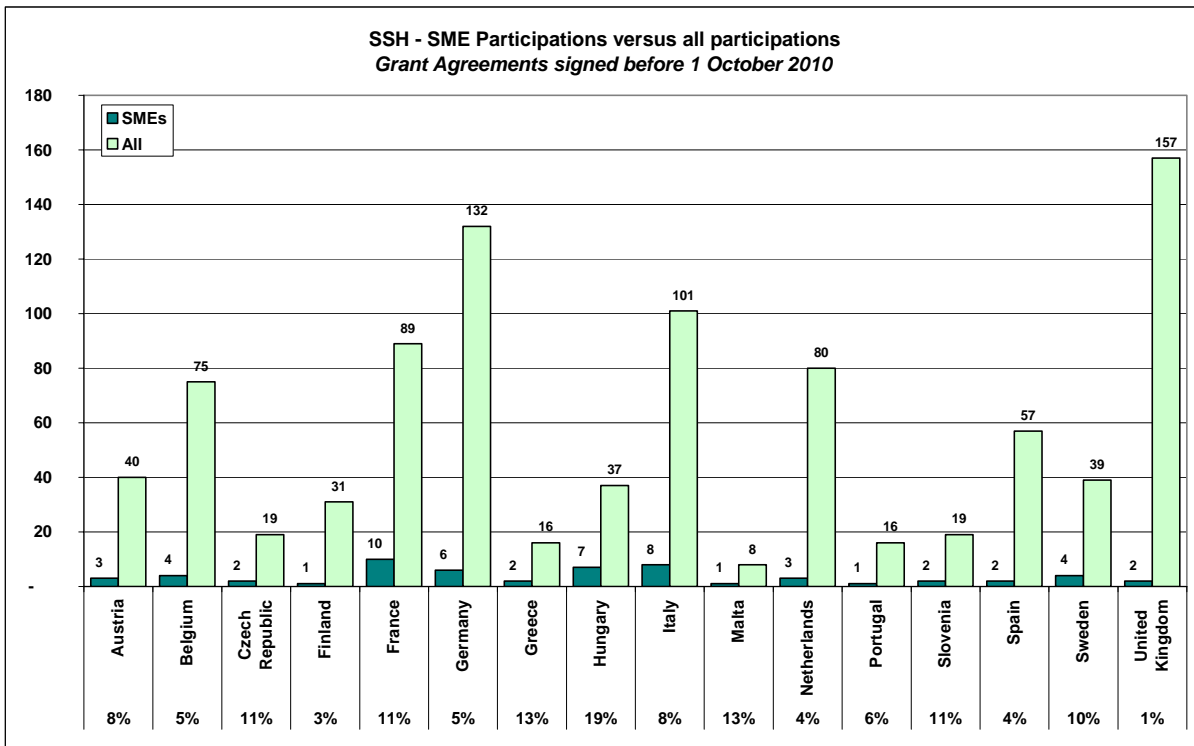
Graph 37: TPT: EU Contribution to SMEs – per country.

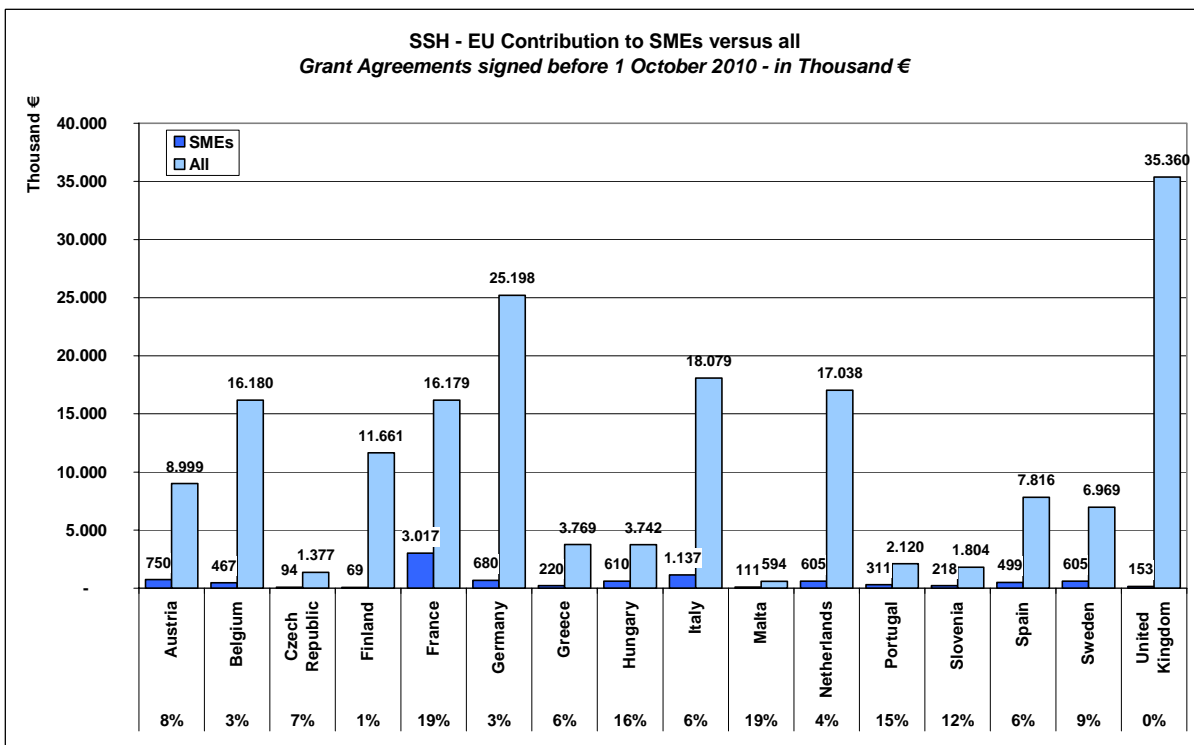

Graph 38: SSH: SME Participation– per country (where SMEs involved)



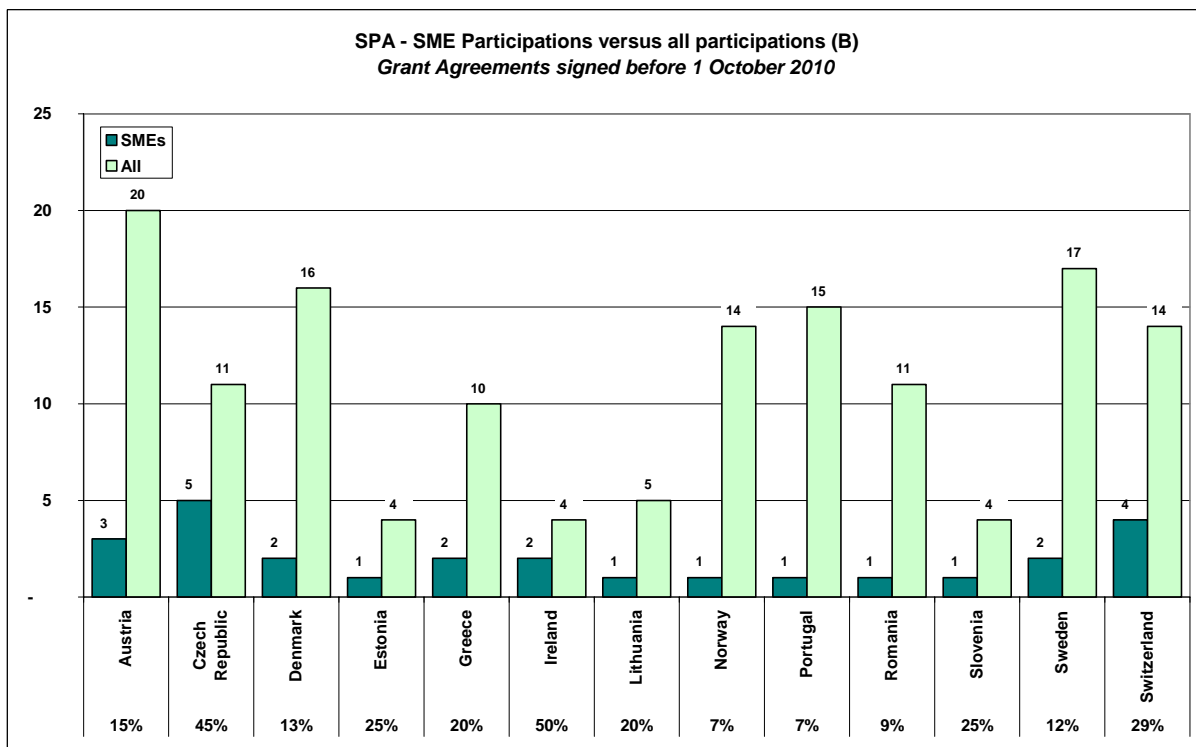
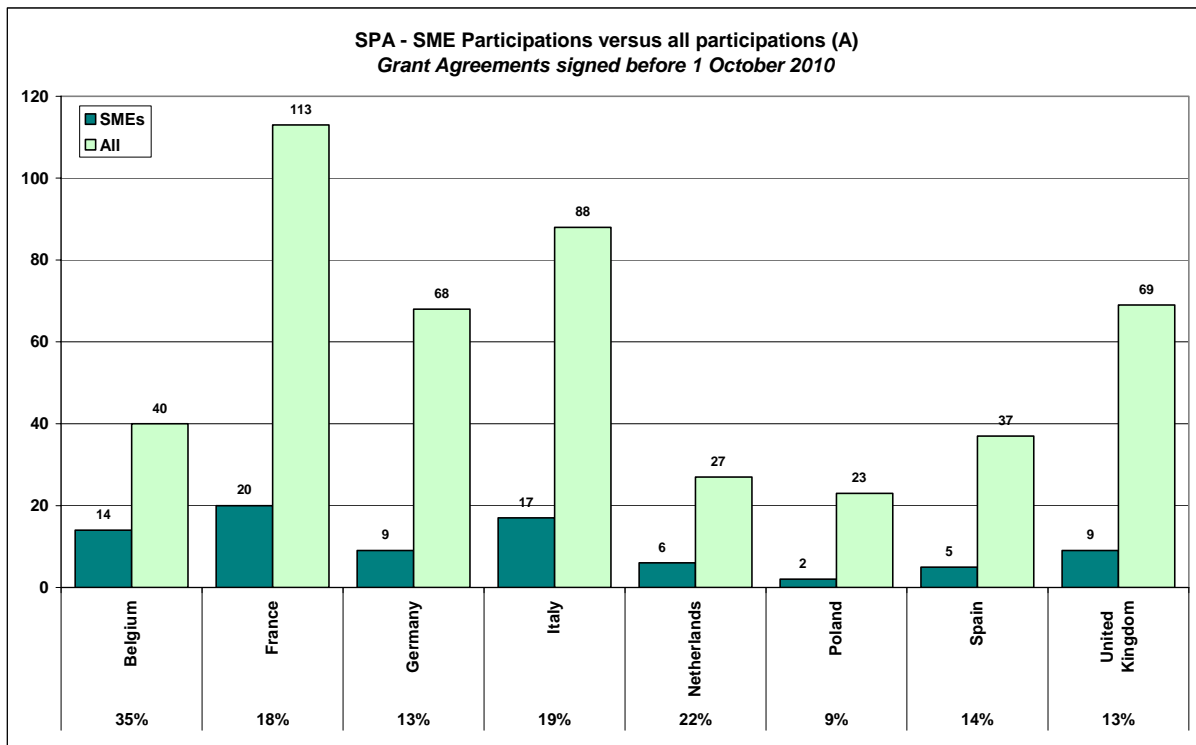
Graph 39: SSH: EU Contribution to SMEs – per country (where SMEs involved)

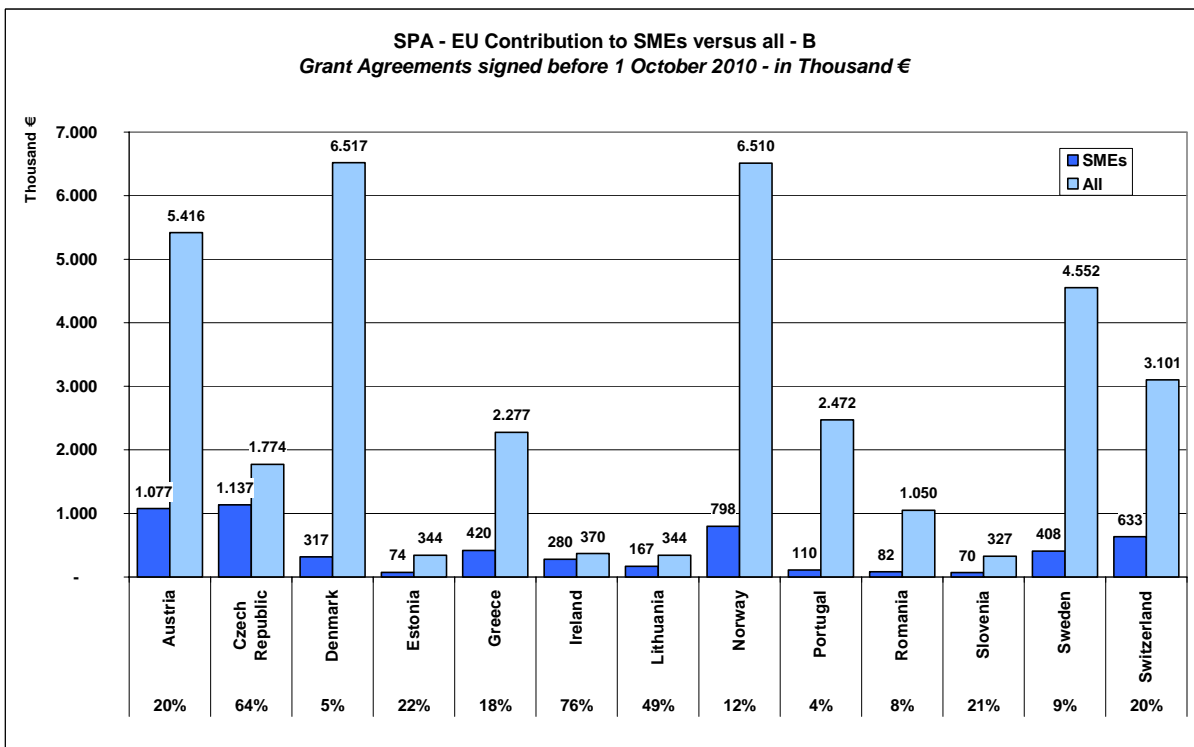
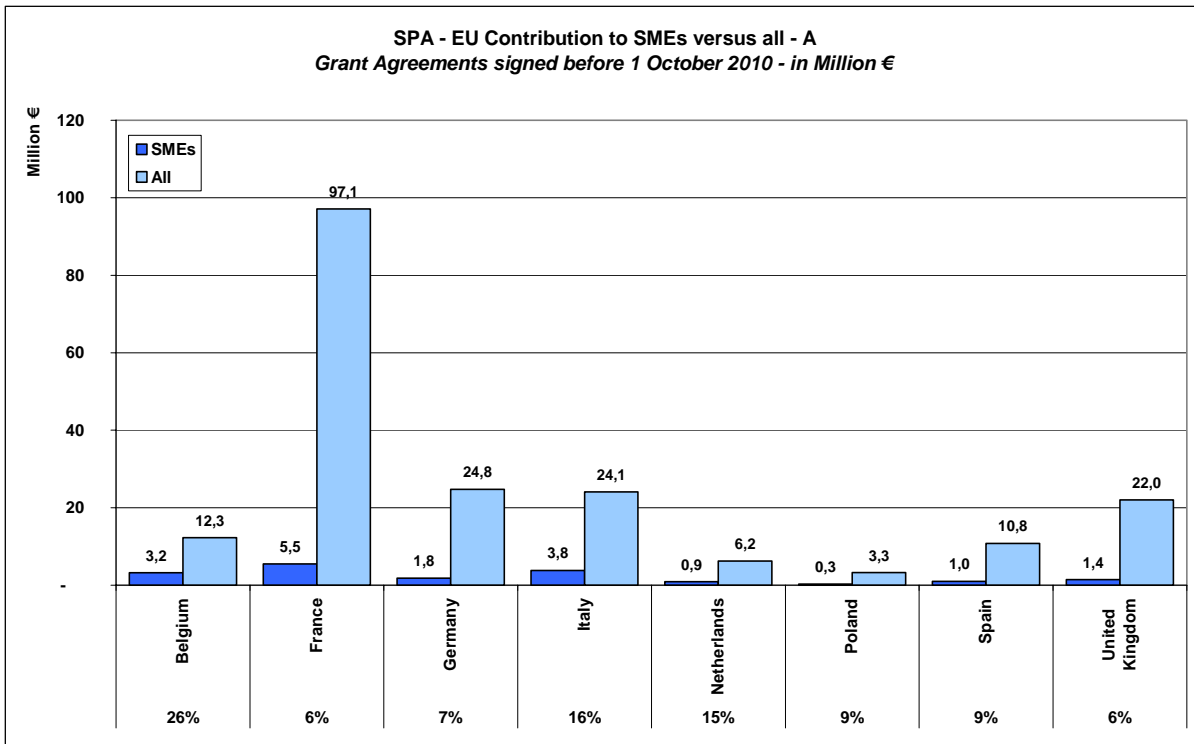

Graph 40: SPA: SME Participation– per country



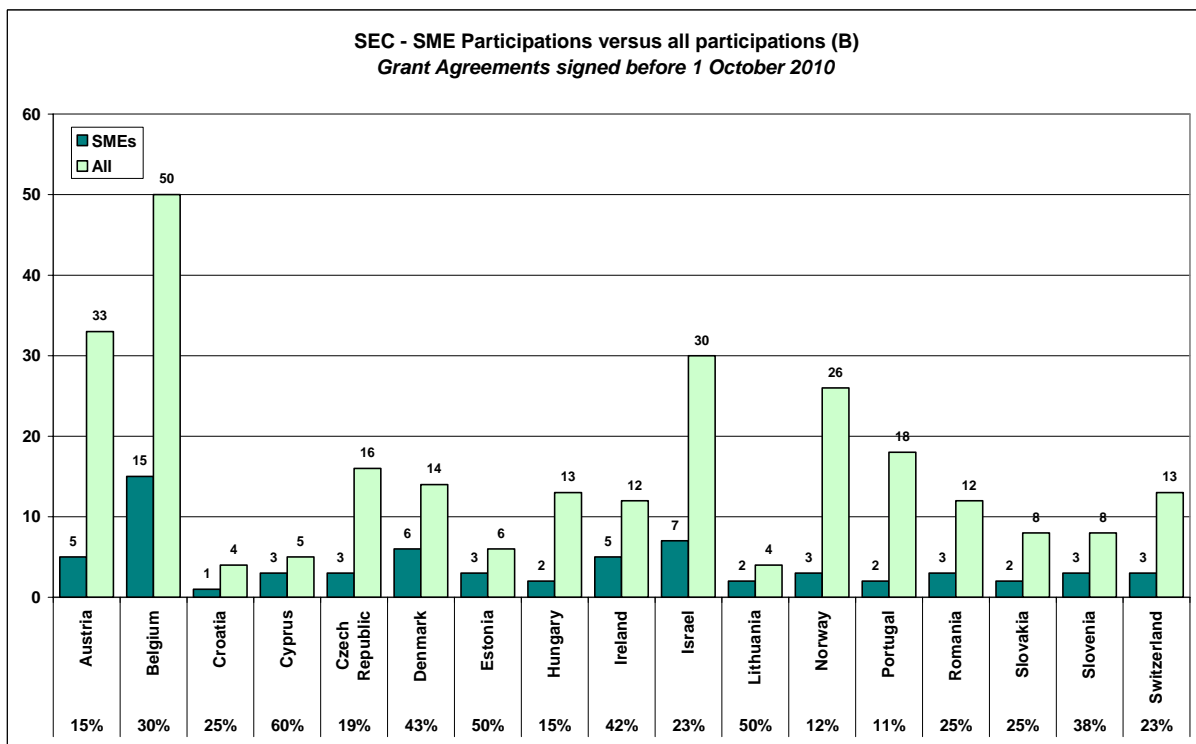
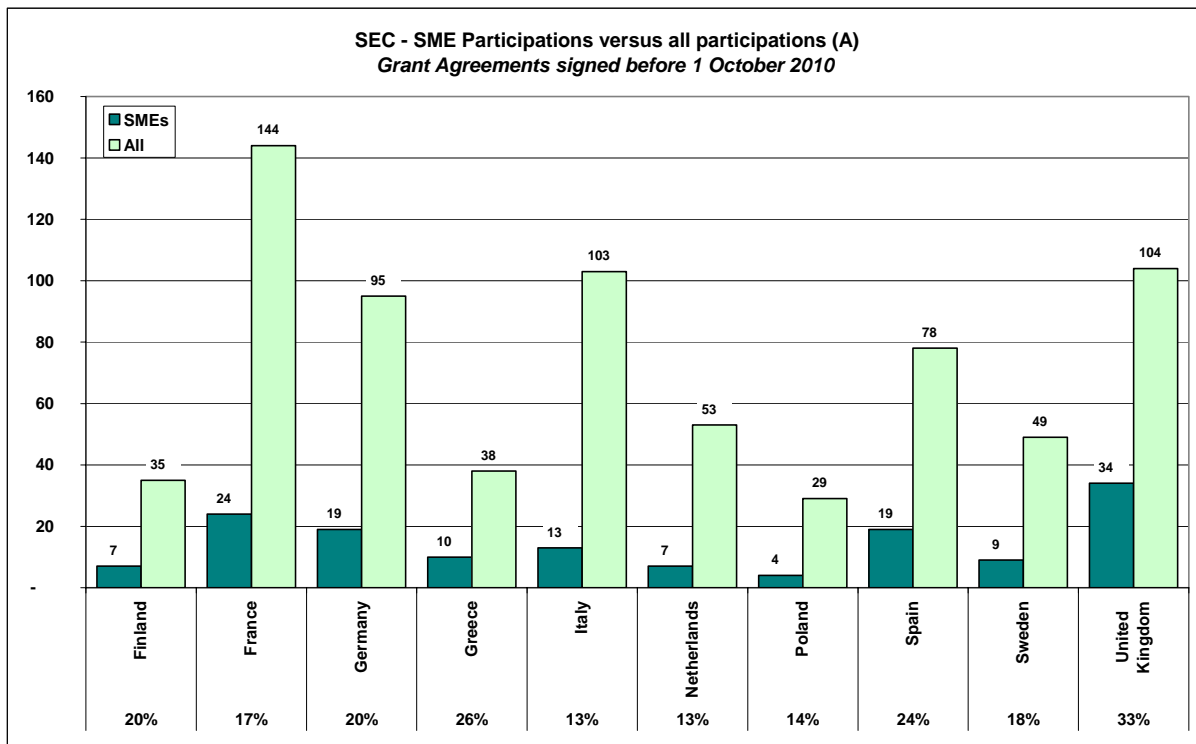
Graph 41: SPA: EU Contribution to SMEs – per country

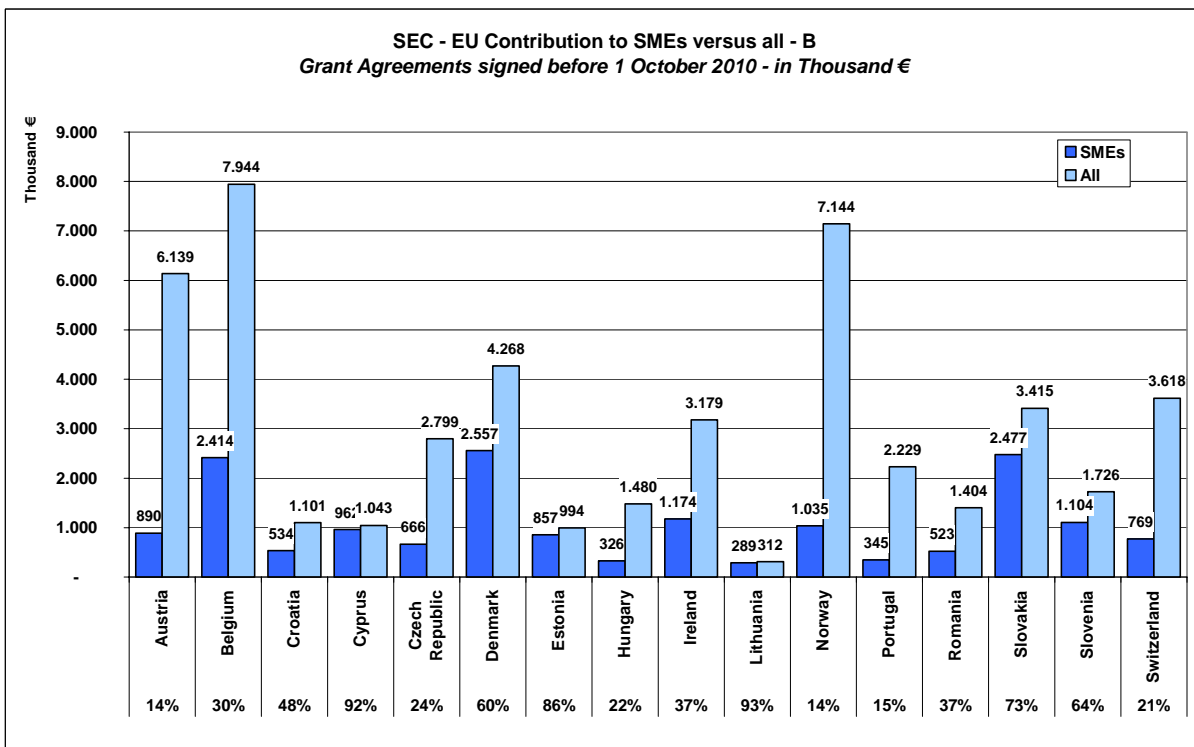
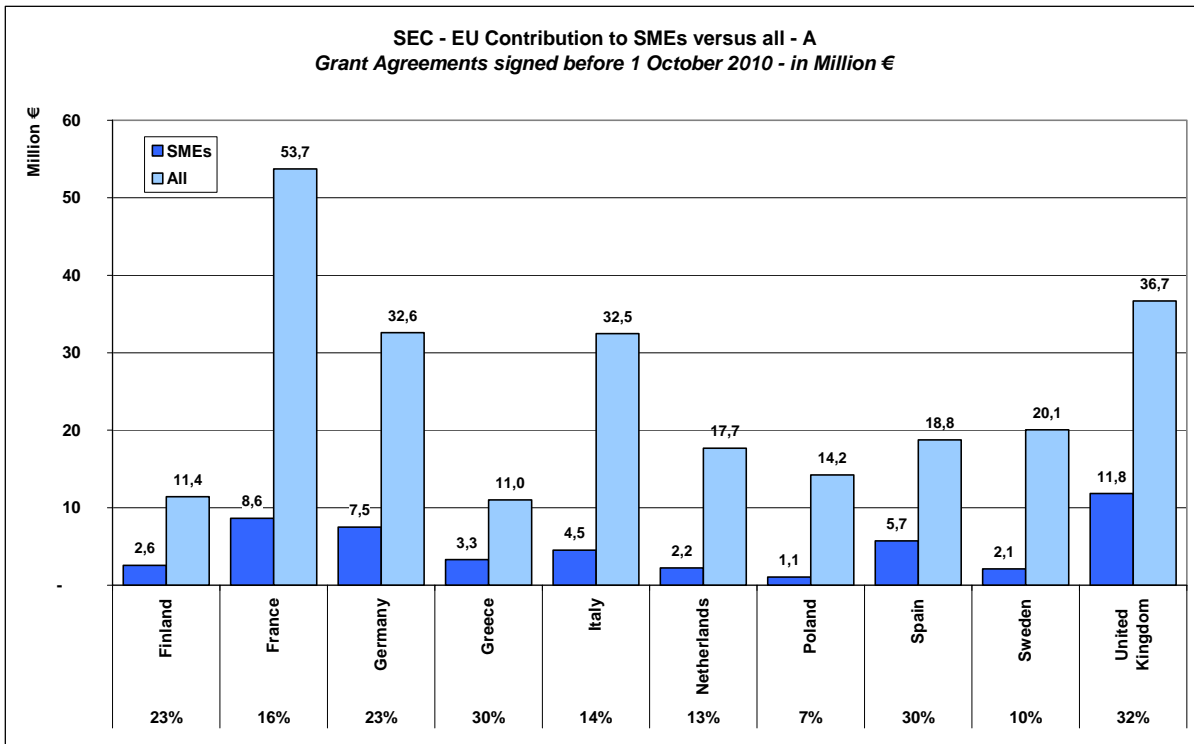

Graph 42: SEC: SME Participation – per country



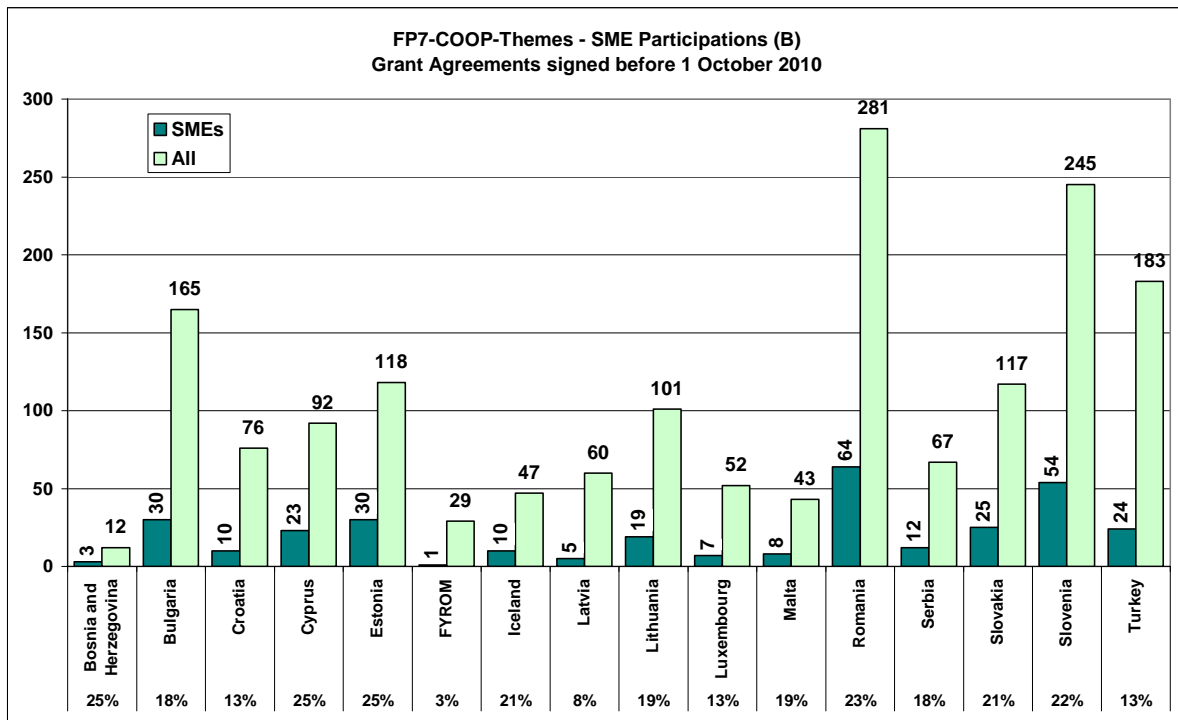
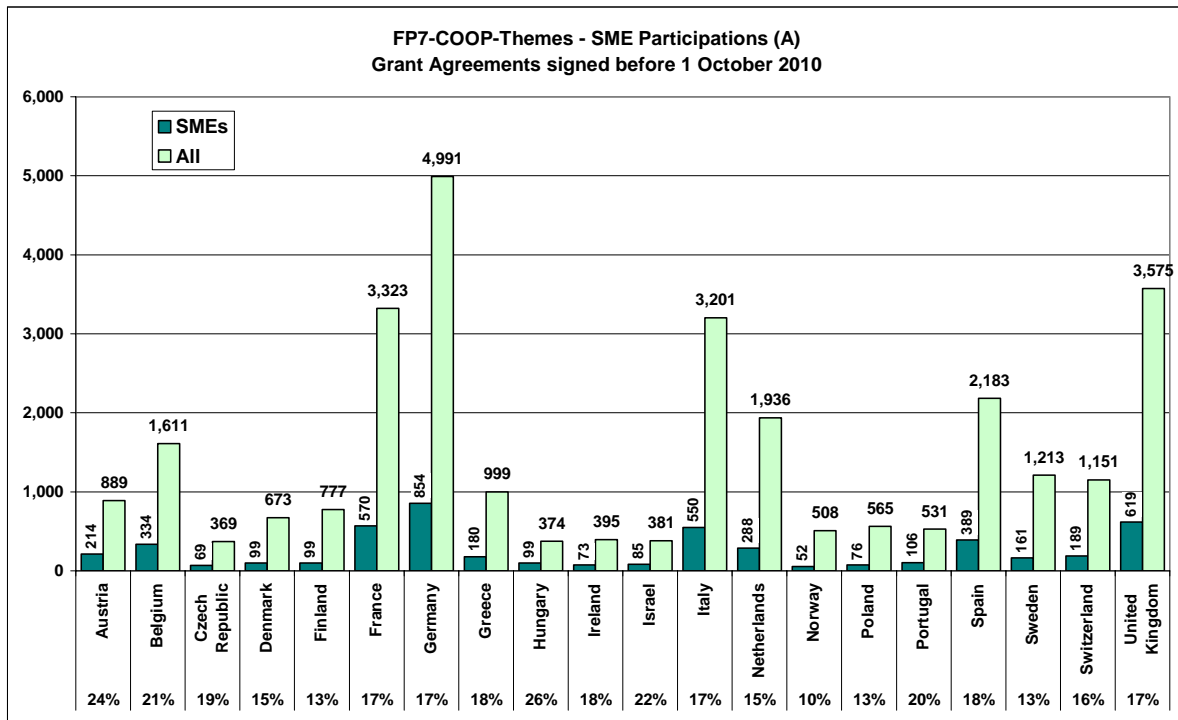
Graph 43: SEC: EU Contribution to SMEs – per country

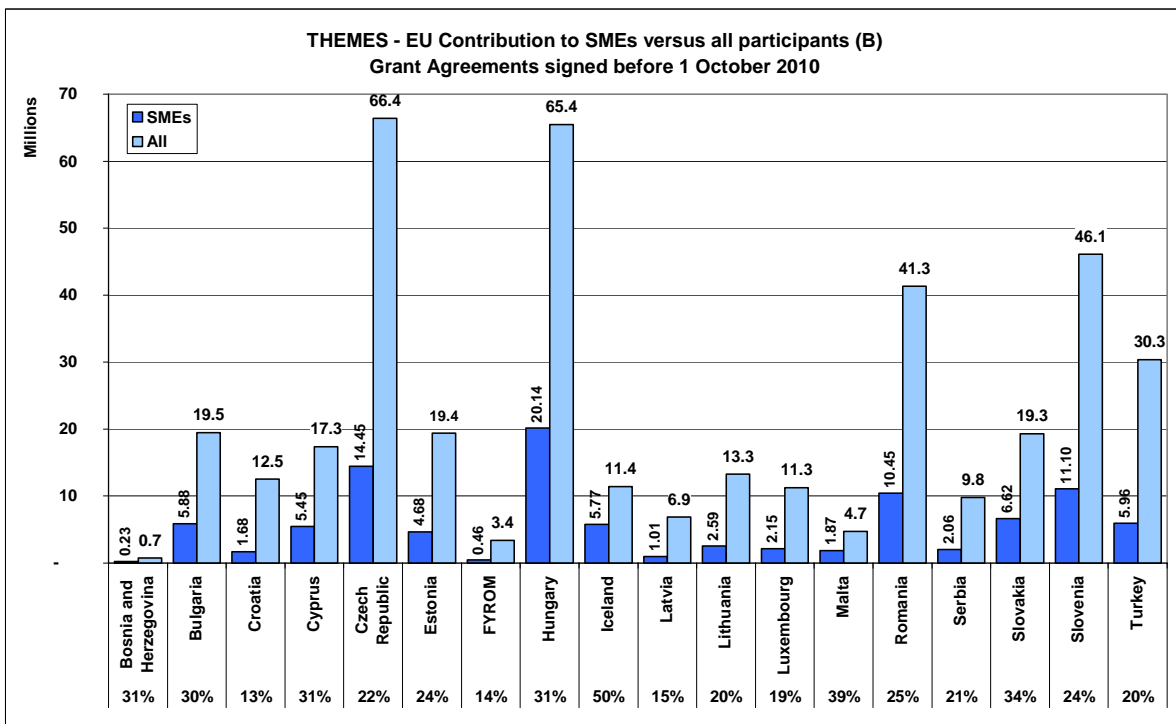

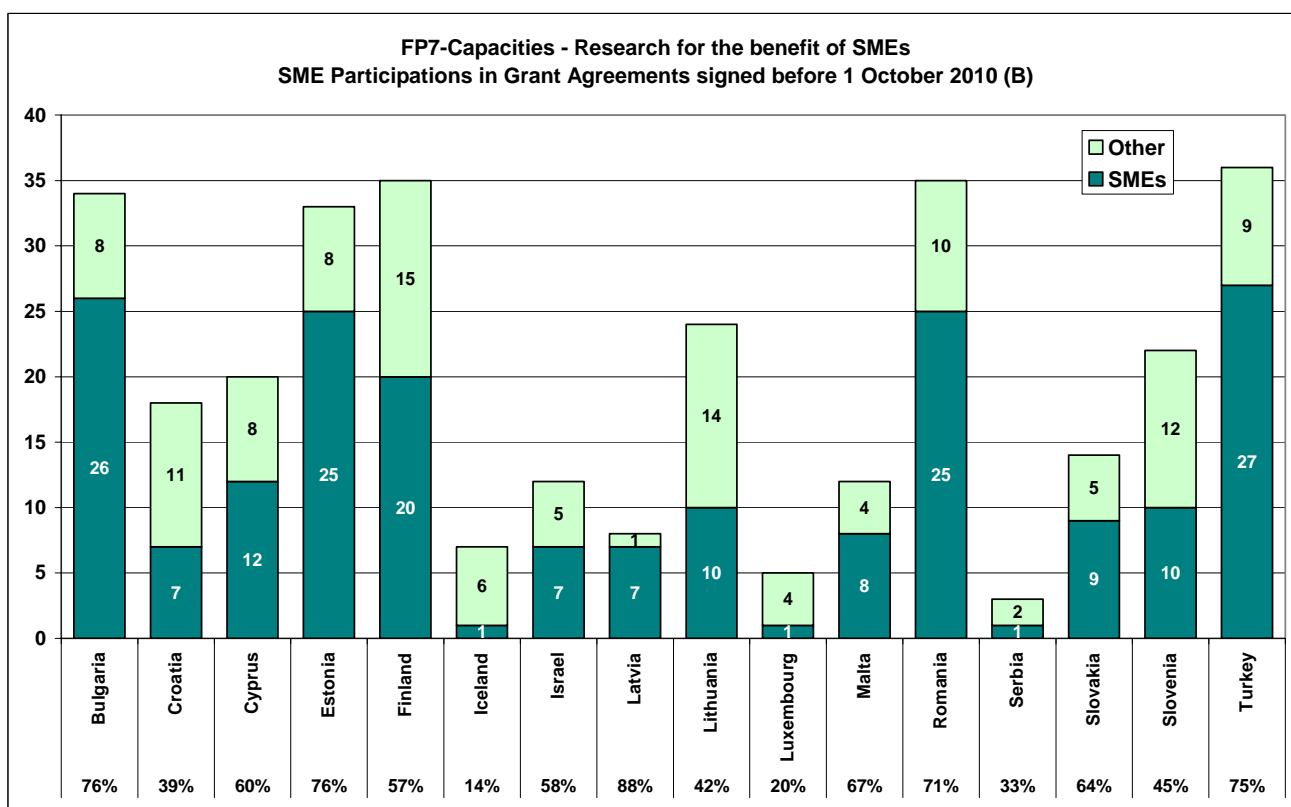

Graph 46: FP7-Capacities: SME Participation – per country

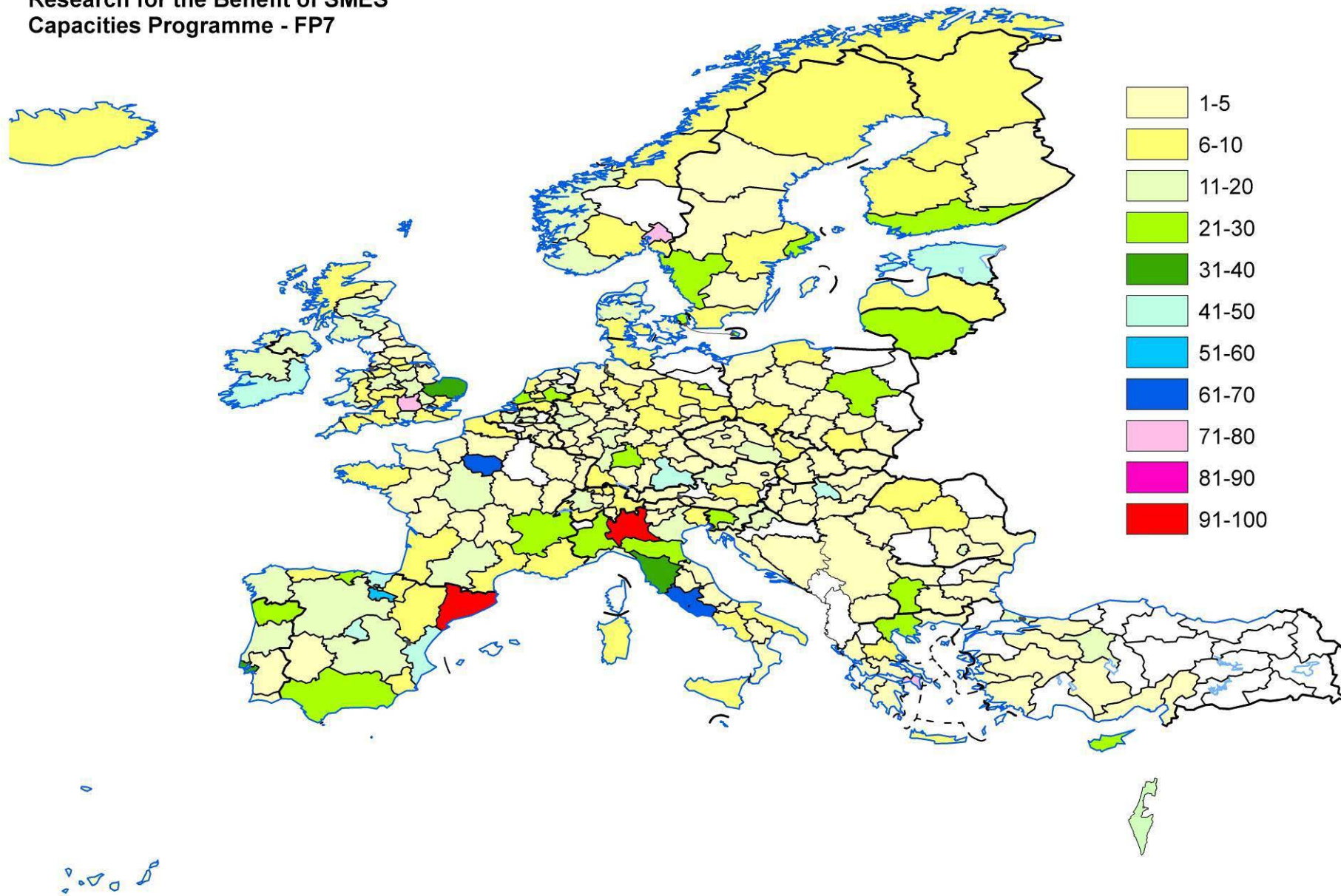


Graph 47: FP7-Capacities: EU Contribution to SMEs – Per country

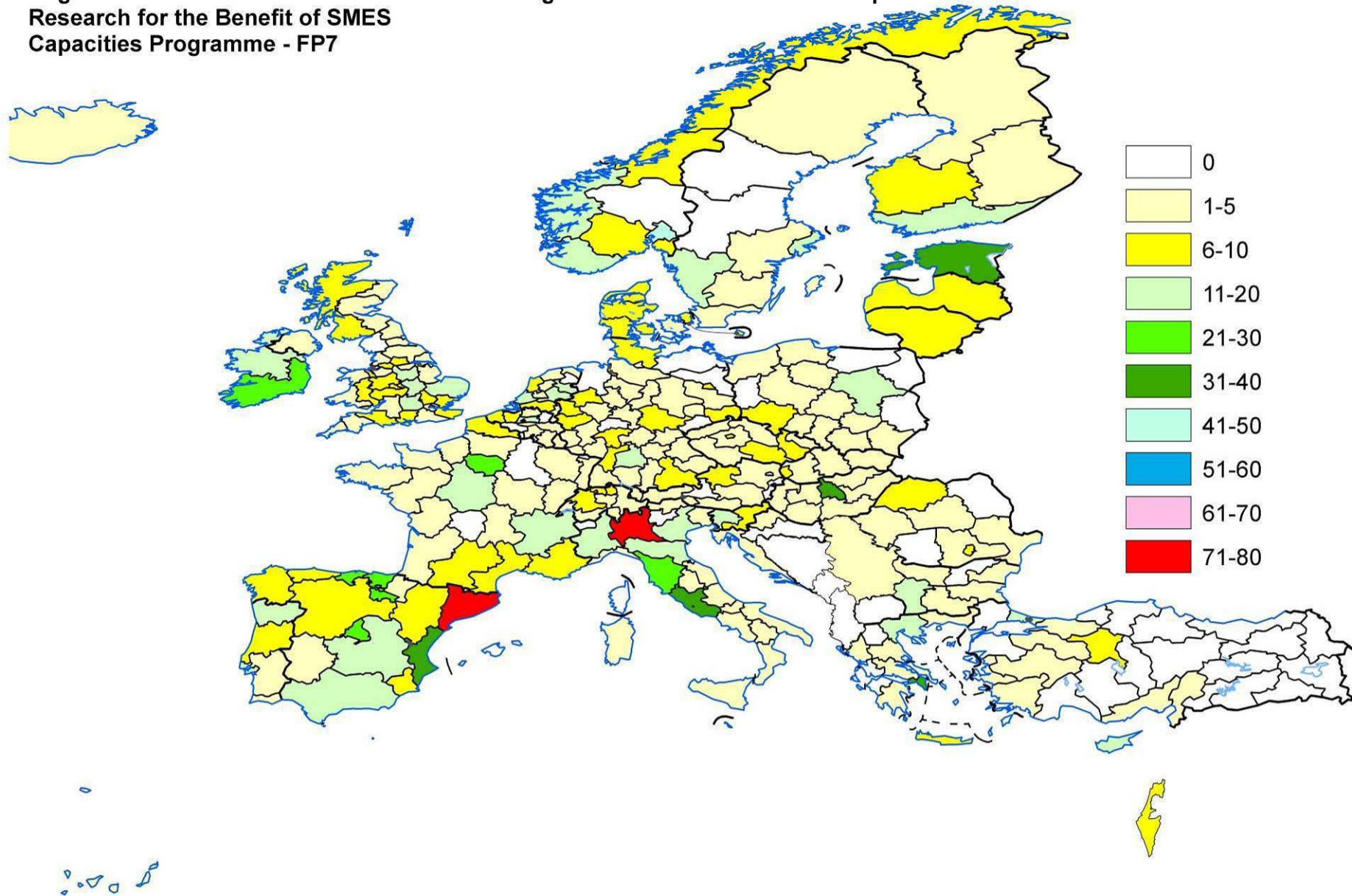

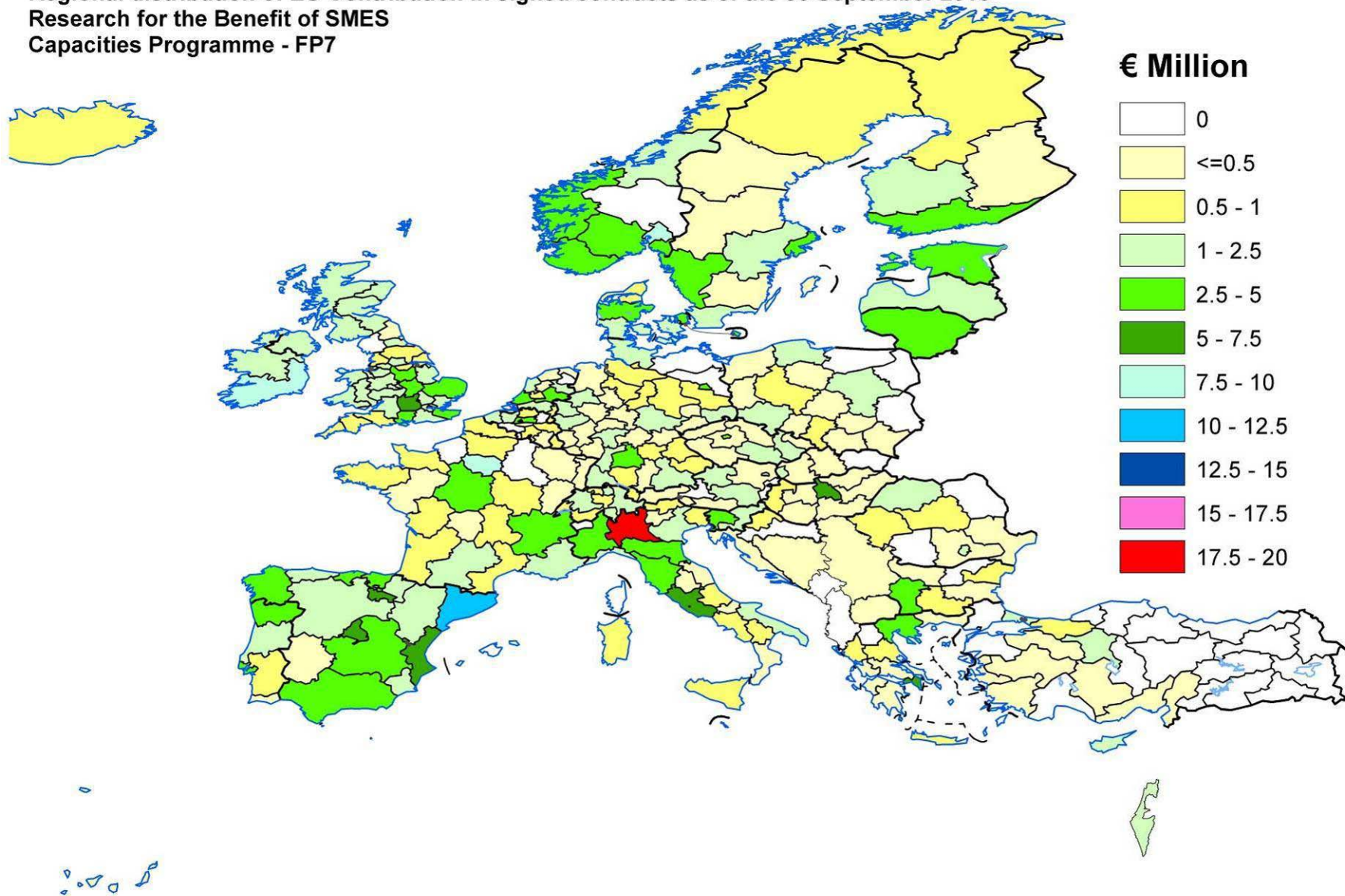
Map 6: Capacities Programme – FP7. Regional Distribution of Beneficiaries in Signed Contracts as of the 1 October 2010

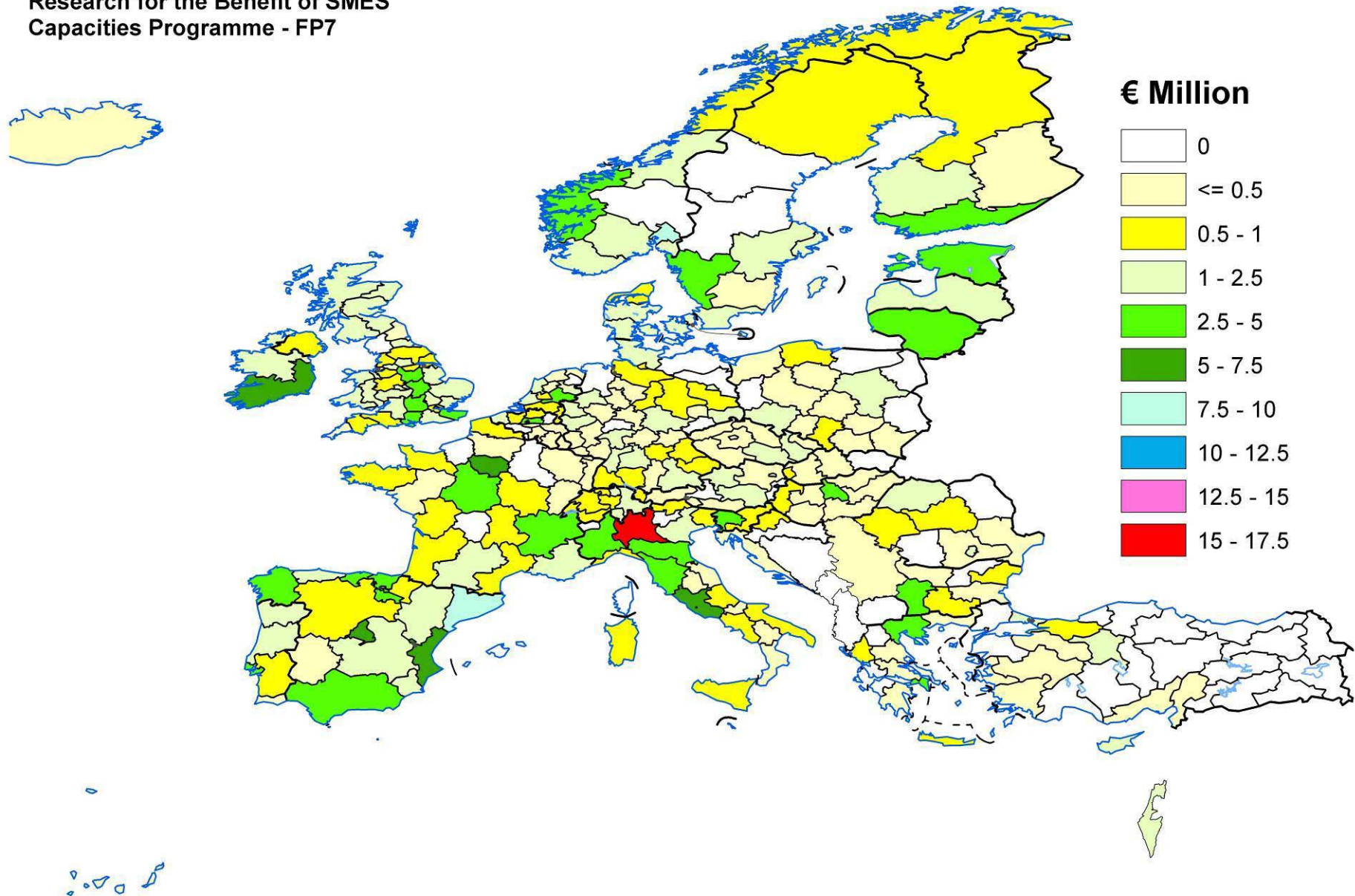
Map 7: Capacities Programme – FP7. Regional distribution of SME beneficiaries in signed contracts as of 1 October 2010

Graph 48: FP7-PEOPLE: SME Participation – per country

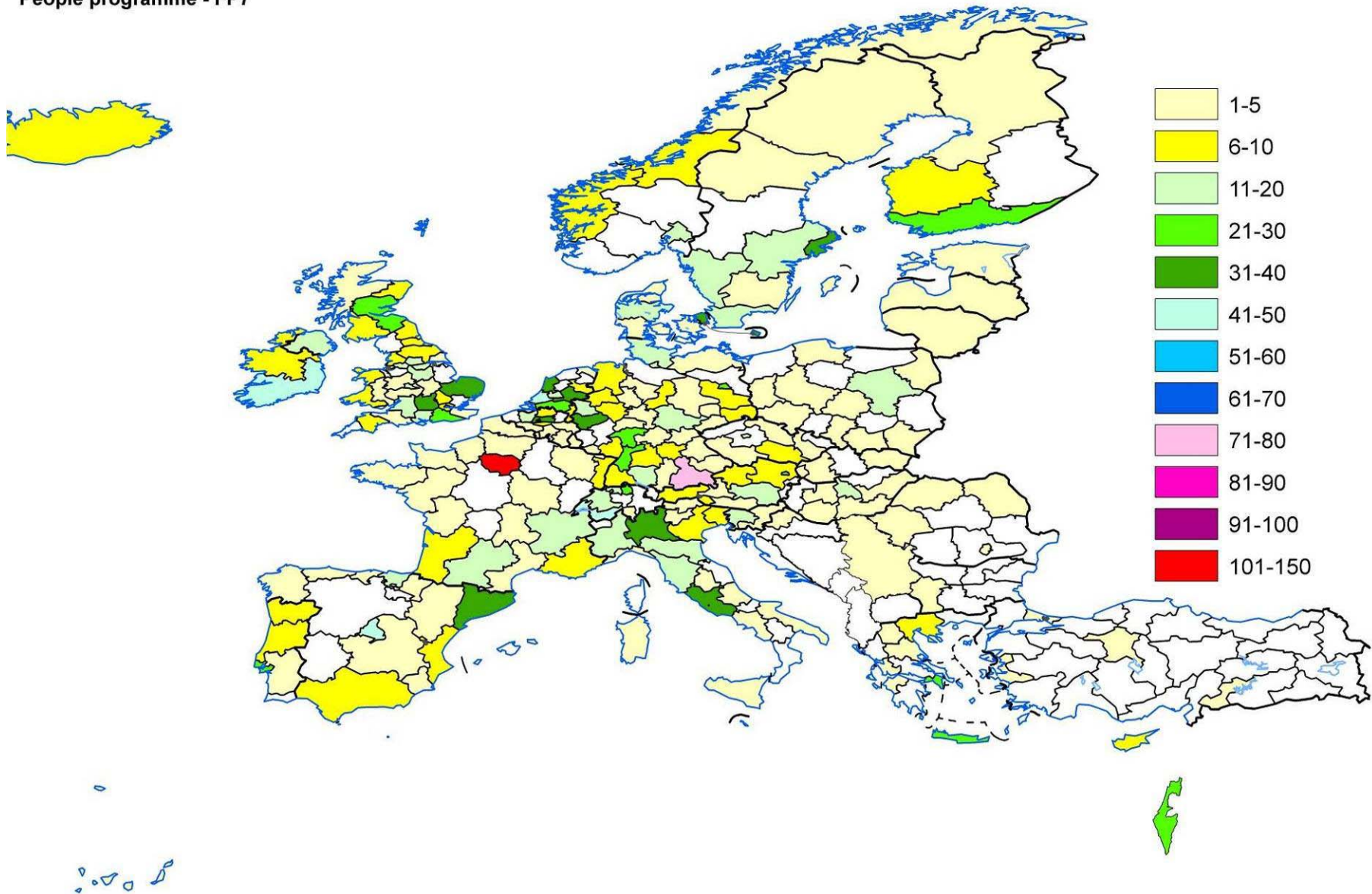


Graph 49: FP7-PEOPLE: EU Contribution to SMEs – per country

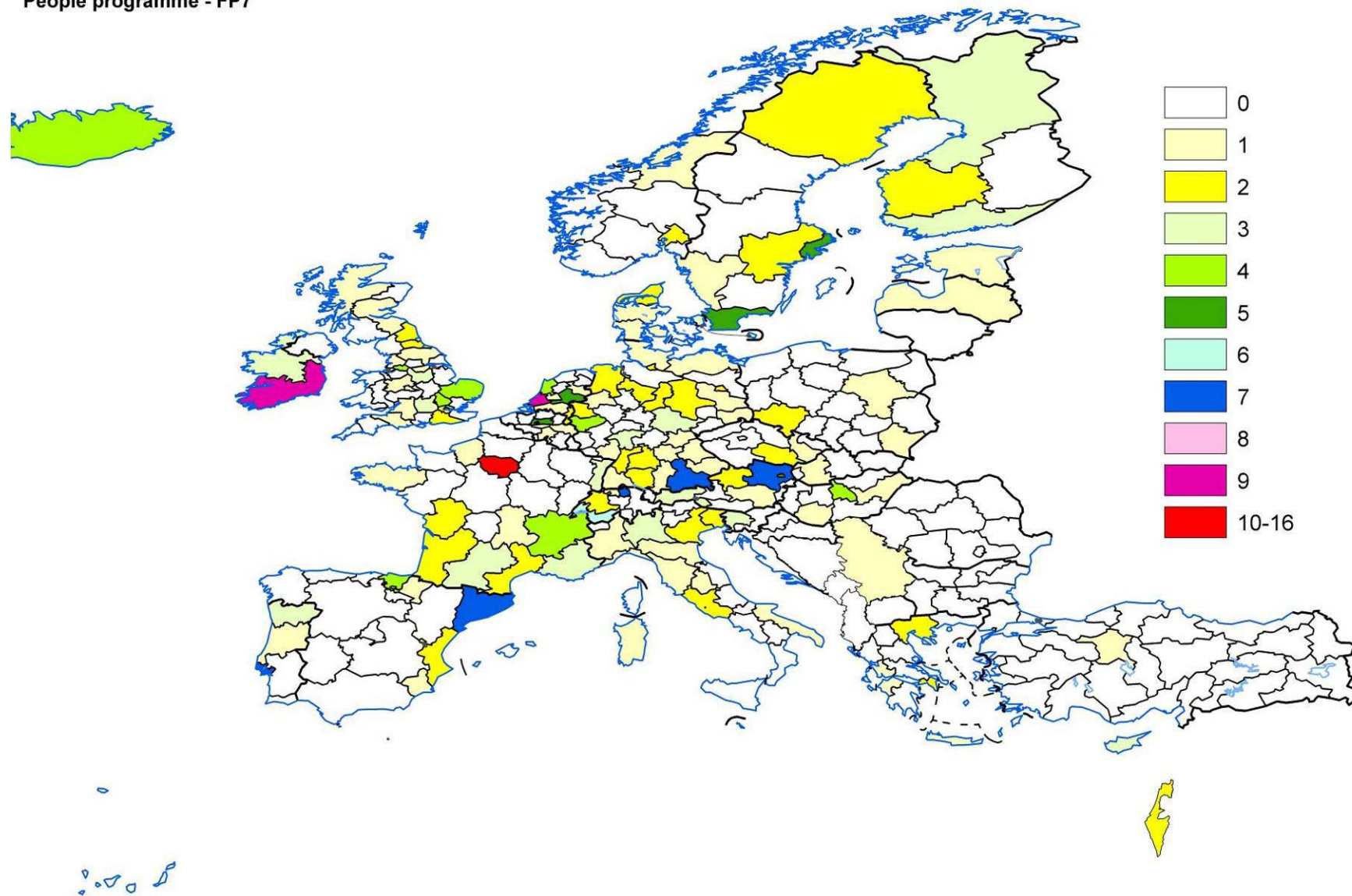

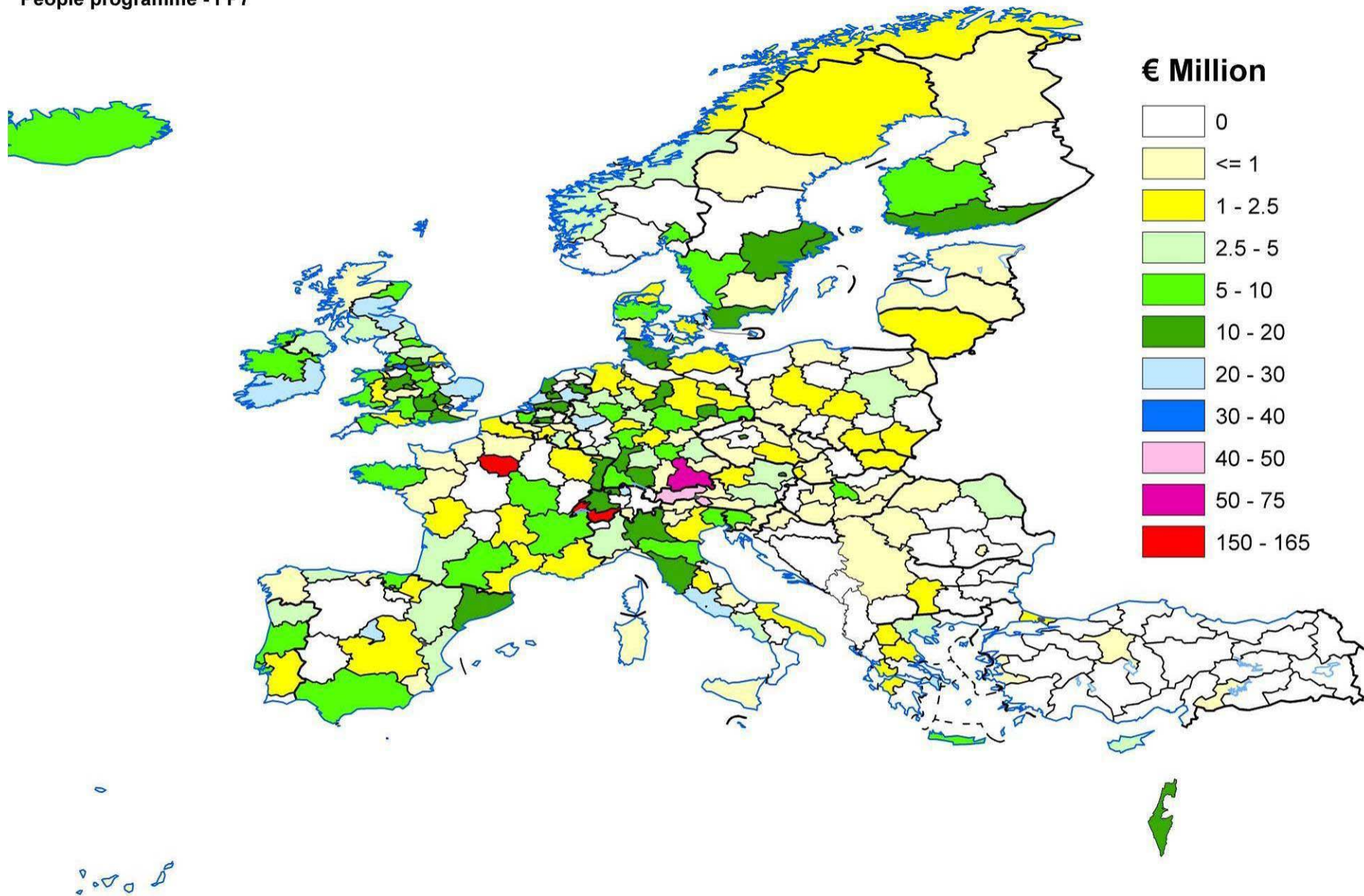

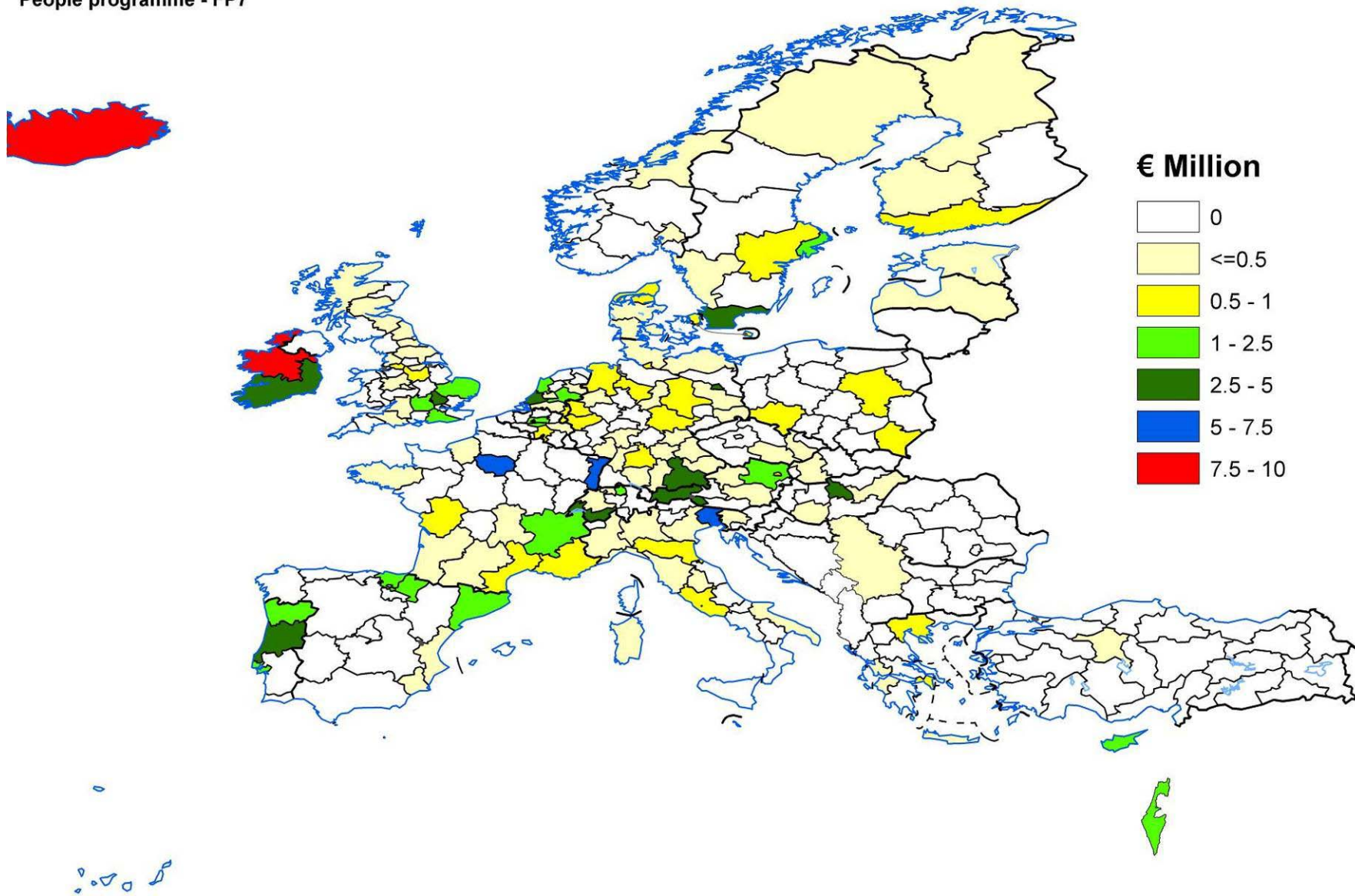

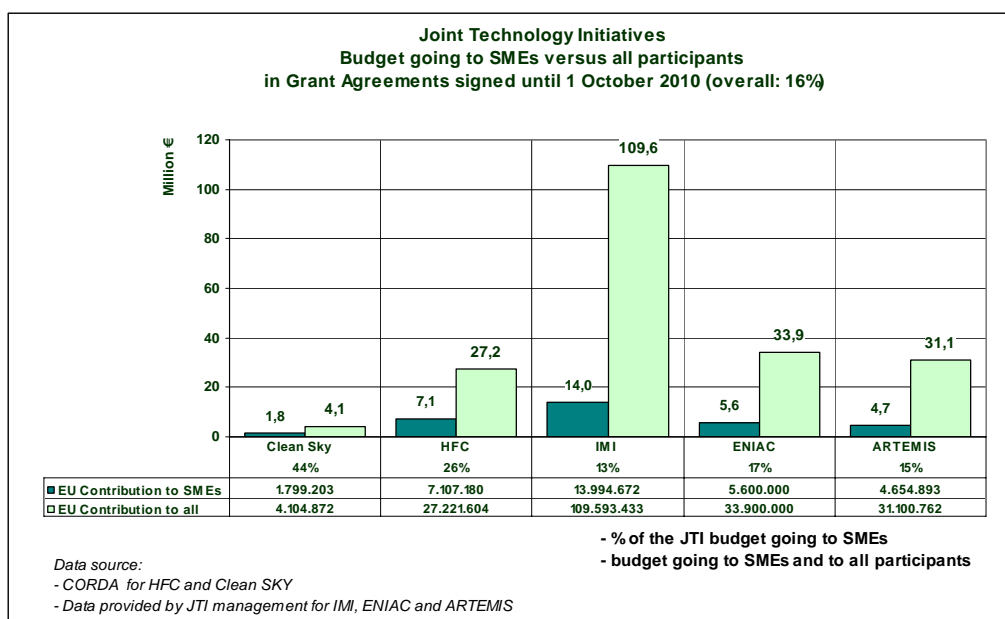

The overall EU contribution to SMEs via the JTIs is 16,1%, with 7% of the budget used.

Chapter 7. SMEs in "Regions of Knowledge" (Capacities)

The Regions of Knowledge Theme of the Capacities Programme of FP7 is aimed at strengthening the research potential of European regions through supporting regional research-driven clusters; bringing together universities, research centers, enterprises and regional authorities. As such, this Theme is relevant for SMEs.

Regions of Knowledge has a total budget of 126 M€ over 7 years (without EFTA and third countries appropriations). Until now the budget of the ten calls within *Regions of Knowledge* amounted to 54 million €

Key figures of the signed Grant Agreements within Regions of Knowledge:

- 42 projects
- 450 participations
- 101 SME participations
- 22,4% of the participations are from SMEs
- Average of 2,4 SMEs per project
- 7.268.030€ EU contribution to SMEs so far
- 36.519.724€ granted to all participants
- **19,9%** of the EU budget in signed Grant Agreements goes to SMEs
- The average EU contribution per SME participation is 71.961€

The element of continuity is the *REGIONS* calls targeted at the cooperation, development and integration of (mature) regional research-driven clusters on a trans-national basis. Research-driven clusters must be composed of at least three types of legal entities (so called 'triple helix'), namely:

- legal entities conducting research (universities, research organisations and research for-profit bodies); national entities conducting research can be accepted if their organisational structure is broken down at regional level and if the regional structure involved is located in the same region as the other components of the cluster;
- business entities (large enterprises and SMEs as defined in the EC recommendation 2003/361/CE of 6 May 2003, OJ L 124/36, 20/05/2003) or their local groupings;
- regional/local authorities (local and regional government, regional development agencies);

In the years 2007 and 2008 there was a complementary format of calls in support of "emerging" research driven clusters. The participation of SMEs has been particularly encouraged in the Work Programme but also via different communication activities. The side calls covered horizontal activities with named beneficiaries without SME participation e.g. conferences, NCP and expert groups.

Regions of Knowledge activities covered different specific S&T fields in each annual work programme such as management of natural resources (2009), CO2 reduction (2008), health (2010), transport (2011) as well but also horizontal aspects such "bringing research to the benefit of SMEs" (2007), rural economies (2007) and research infrastructures (2008).

Regions of Knowledge is implemented via the "Coordination and support actions" funding scheme (CSA actions) and therefore research and technological development joint activities are not eligible for funding.

For the above reasons it is not surprising that the SME share of participation is globally over 20 % with some variability. Apparently the call related to the topics "research infrastructure" and "CO₂" reduction in 2008 was especially interesting for SMEs. The latter topic responded to the need of developing energy efficient production technologies and renewable energies.

For the future we may expect a slight drop of SME participation in the statistics because the triple helix approach is increasingly realised by cluster organisations a self standing legal bodies where the SMEs are participating via their membership but anymore as individual entity in the grant agreement.

Chapter 8. Other funding schemes offering benefit to SMEs

Eurostars and Ambient Assisted Living (Article 185 initiatives)

Eurostars and Ambient Assisted Living (AAL) are Joint Programmes between Member States, to which the Community participates via Article 185 TFEU. Although the exact benefit for SMEs is not yet known, considerable parts of the funds of both programmes will definitely go to SMEs.

Eurostars supports R&D-performing SMEs willing to undertake their own research in small, transnational partnerships. The Community will contribute up to EUR 100 million to the Joint Programme, while the 32 participating countries are expected to contribute EUR 300 million.

The 100 million Euros EU contribution is coming out of the Capacities budget.

The AAL Joint Programme supports R&D which aims at enhancing the quality of life of older people and strengthening the industrial base in Europe through the use of Information and Communication Technologies (ICT). The Community will contribute EUR 150 million, while the 23 participating countries will contribute EUR 150 million. The 150 million Euro EU Contribution comes from the ICT budget under the Cooperation Programme.

The Eurostars Joint Programme has organised 5 cut-off dates. Four of them have already been evaluated. The 5th cut-off closed at the end of September 2010. At the time of preparing this report, the evaluation is ongoing.

Overall, about 1500 applications have been received for a total budget of over 2000M€ The projects selected for funding, in the first four cut-offs, are 329 with a total budget cost of 472M€ The estimated public contribution is around 220M€, of which 165M€ from the Member States and 55M€ from the EU contribution.

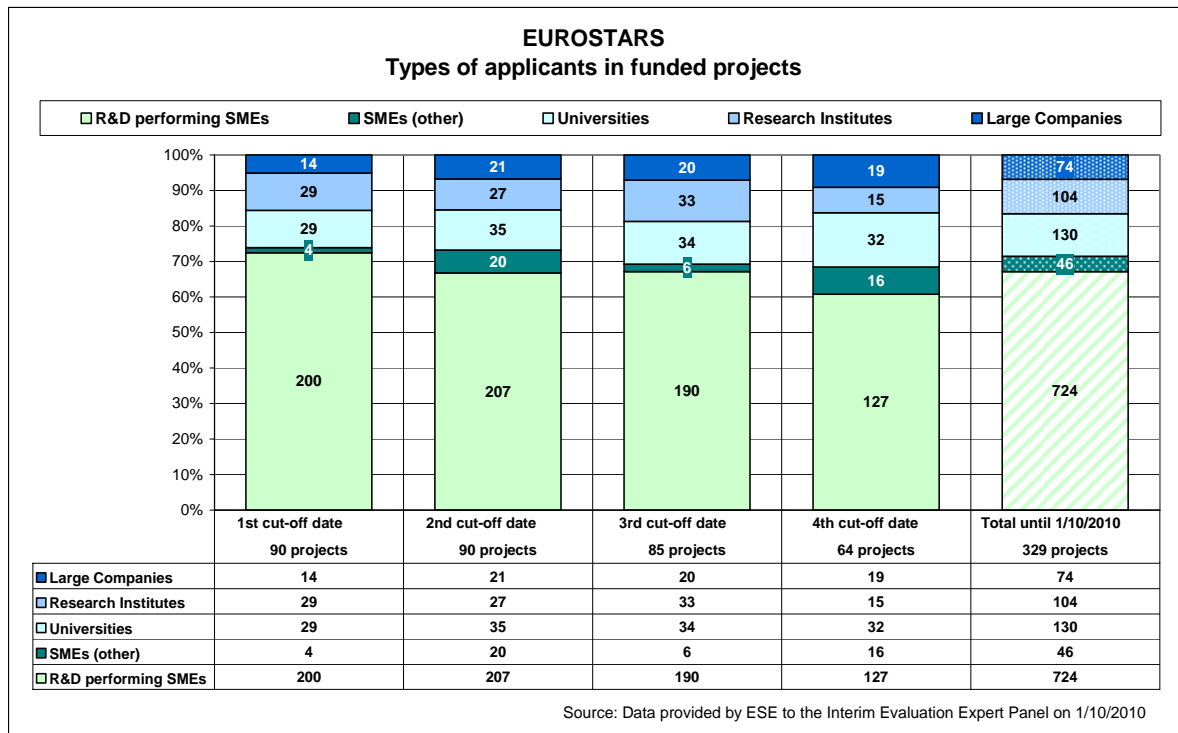
A typical Eurostars project proposal has, on the average, 3 to 4 partners from 2 to 3 countries, and a cost of EUR 1,4 million. The most represented technology areas are Electronics, IT and telecom technology, biotechnology and industrial technologies. The average duration of the projects is about 28 months.

71% of the participants in funded projects are SMEs (67% R&D performing SMEs), 7% are large companies and 22 % research institutes and universities (1% 'other').

R&D performing SMEs contribute on average to 79% of the total costs of the projects, Universities and Research Institutes to 6% each and large companies to 5 %.

With relation to the participants' profile, the R&D performing SMEs have on average between 45 to 50% of their overall workforce dedicated to research activities and around the same percentage of their annual turnover spent on R&D.

Until today, 79% of the public funds of the Eurostars goes to SMEs.

Ambient Assisted Living

The AAL JP is based on article 185 (former 169) in the European Treaty, that describes the framework for multi-annual innovation programmes – implemented as a joint activity between the European Community and the Member States that will participate in the particular programme. Also countries outside the European Member States can join – in the AAL JP Israel, Norway, and Switzerland – as an associated member - participates.

It is envisioned that the total funding available from in the AAL JP programme life-cycle will be more than 500 M€ The funding scheme means in practice so far that investment from each national funding agency in the AAL JP is returned to the same agency’s beneficiaries with an approximately 40% “European bonus” from central funding. The programme provides international evaluation and reviews of the projects.

The three calls issued so far have been thematic.

AAL closed its first call for proposals in August 2008 with an indicative budget of EUR 57.7 million. This first call had the title: “ICT based solutions for Prevention and Management of Chronic Conditions of Elderly People”.

118 project applications were received. SMEs make up 38% of the 958 applying organisations. 56 projects were positively evaluated, involving 173 SMEs (39% of all organisations). 23 proposals were finally selected for funding.

The second AAL call had the title: “ICT based solutions for Advancement of Social Interaction of Elderly People”. Some projects from these two calls are described in this brochure. It closed on 5 May 2009 and had an indicative budget of EUR 60.9 million. In total, 104 project applications were received. SMEs are very well represented in this call with

46% of the 762 applying organisations being SMEs. After the evaluation, 142 SMEs (43%) are involved in the 41 ranked projects. The number of funded projects will depend on the availability of national funding.

The third AAL call for proposals (2010) had the title: “ICT-based Solutions for Advancement of Older Persons’ Independence and Participation in the “Self-Serve Society”. It closed on 30 July 2010 and has as of August 2010 entered the evaluation and funding decision procedure. At this point in time, the ranked Call 3 projects are in the budget check and optimization phase; more specific information on these projects is not yet available.

ERA-NET & ERA-NET Plus

The objective of the ERA-NET scheme is to develop and strengthen the coordination of national and regional research programmes through two specific actions: ERA-NET and ERA-NET Plus.

ERA-NET provides a framework for actors implementing public research programmes to coordinate their activities e.g. by developing joint activities or by mutually supporting joint calls for trans-national proposals. Under this scheme, the EU contribution is used for the coordination activities, not for co-funding joint calls. Several of these actions are relevant for SMEs like CORNET II and EraSME² (which are targeting respectively collective research and the collaboration between SMEs and Research Organisations) and *Eurotransbio* (supports the collaboration between companies, especially SMEs, and academic labs in the area of Biotechnology). Several initiatives in the area of industrial technologies are also attracting SMEs, like e.g. *Manunet*, with an SME participation of 70-80%.

ERA-NET Plus provides, in a limited number of cases with high European added value, additional EU financial support to facilitate joint calls for proposals between national and/or regional programmes.

Under FP7, over 50 ERA-NET actions are funded already for more than 100 million €EU contribution. In addition, the Member States and Associated Countries contribute significantly to these ERA-NETs too.
