How to ensure sustainability of a regional mobility scheme?

- Characteristics of mobility scheme are already known
- Sustainability is the key
- Important to think of sustainability as early as possible, already when designing the mobility scheme
- Perspective of the Western Balkan stakeholders

Albania

- Focus of mobility should be on young, up and coming researchers, women researchers and also researchers from regional universities/slightly more remote areas this is to ensure INCLUSIVITY
- To ensure sustainability it is important to include not only individual researchers, but attempt also some kind of institutional support for example departments, research centers, faculties
- Widespread reach and communication so as to include as many stakeholders as possible and build synergies with other mobility schemes – maybe in the future a joint pool of funds can be created
- Involvement of national policy stakeholders (NASRI, Ministry of Education) but also CSOs (SCiDEV, CoPLAN) and other national projects focused on science and research (WBF, OSF WB, EU4Innovation)
- Links with the RYLMP programme, MOVE grants, EU4Innovation, Erasmus Mobility, MCSA, COST, EIT
- Consider not only 'hard sciences' but also social sciences as a focus for mobility

Potential Funding Sources

Complex country structure: Ministry of Foreign Affairs BiH + two entity ministries + 10 cantonal ministries

Private sector collaborations and university partnerships

Bilateral/Multilateral agreements on research collaboration

Kosovo*

- Long-Term Vision: Develop a clear long-term vision for the mobility scheme beyond the initial funding period.
- **Stakeholder Engagement:** Involve key stakeholders, including universities, research institutions, and governments in the Western Balkans, for support and commitment.
- Monitoring and Evaluation: Establish robust monitoring and evaluation mechanisms to track the impact and effectiveness of the mobility projects.
- Knowledge Transfer: Facilitate knowledge transfer between participating WB economies and institutions, fostering collaboration and lasting relationships.
- Alumni Network: Create an alumni network for past participants to maintain connections and provide mentorship opportunities.
- Diversify Funding Sources: Explore additional funding sources, such as public-private partnerships, to extend the project's lifespan.
- Integration with existing programmes: Identify synergies with existing regional programmes and instruments to maximise
 resources and avoid duplication (for instance consider WBF Mobility Grant Scheme Mechanism, WBF MOVE Grants).
- Policy Alignment: Ensure that the mobility scheme aligns with regional research and innovation policies for continued support.
- **Dissemination and Outreach:** Promote the scheme's success stories and outcomes to attract further interest and support.
- Flexibility: Build flexibility into the scheme to adapt to changing circumstances and emerging needs in the region.

Montenegro

North Macedonia

- International mobility schemes: MSCA, ERASMUS +, CEEPUS,
- **National schemes:** full scholarships for postgraduate and doctoral studies at the top 100 universities according to the Shanghai List
- Suggested type of mobility schemes: intersectoral mobility between industry and mobility in higher education institutions
- Access to research infrastructure in the Western Balkans and EU (JRC)
- Sustainability: Horizon Europe dedicated Call for this scheme or other donors, national and international source of funding of Implementation of Action Plans of S3 strategy
- Links with existing schemes: to consider proposed mobility schemes in frame of S3 of the Western Balkans, for ex. North Macedonia has defined measures for the mobility of researchers in the S3.



Serbia

- Open Balkan Initiative
- Collaboration with scientific institutions
- Using EU funding
- Member of four European Research Infrastructure Consortiums (CERIC, DARIAH, ESS and CESSDA)
- Idea: creating Regional Consortium
