By gathering local government associations, municipal elected officials and experts on various topics, NALAS has a unique opportunity to generate knowledge of great value for the authorities in SEE. NALAS stimulates exchange of information and experiences among its members. The processes of knowledge discovery, generation, capitalization and dissemination make up the NALAS Knowledge System.

The main part of the Knowledge System is the NALAS Knowledge Centre. The strength and the focus of the Knowledge Centre is the content – or the knowledge – itself. Especially important is the knowledge found in cross-border analysis, comparisons and best practices.



The five NALAS Task Forces in: **Urban Planning**, **Energy Efficiency**, **Fiscal Decentralization**, **Water and Solid Waste Management** and **Sustainable Tourism** are at the heart of NALAS, bringing together the best experts from the region, competent associations' staff and professionals employed in the local government administration, who are directly facing the consequences and challenges coming from policies and laws which define the system of local government. NALAS Task Forces have a key role in knowledge production and dissemination.

NALAS

Quick Response

is specialized in regional ad-hoc information collection and analysis, used by the member Associations in dealing with important policy issues or otherwise negotiating with their respective central governments.

Shadowing Program

is a mechanism for permanent exchange and transfer of knowledge between members, through coaching, mentoring, and on-job learning using the expertise within the NALAS network.

Peer Review

is a service designed to facilitate a process of learning from the experience of other NALAS member LGAs. This service enables mutual learning through better understanding of NALAS members and developing joint benchmarks for good performance.

NALAS Digest

provides a rare opportunity to learn about the current trends, efforts, developments and concerns in the local government arena throughout SEE. It is produced bi-weekly and distributed electronically to over 3000 e-mails.





NALAS Newsletter

is printed 2-3 times per year. On some 30 pages, it provides an in-depth overview of NALAS activities and achievements, as well as analytical review of the developments in the local government area in SEE.

Network of Knowledge Management Assistants based within the local offices of the NALAS


NALAS Knowledge Tree


is a modern online platform that provides up-todate and user-friendly knowledge and information about the most recent developments in local government issues, as well as information about NALAS activities.

The first NEXPO was organized in Sarajevo, Bosnia and Herzegovina in 2011, the second one in Rijeka and Opatija, Croatia, in 2013, while the third one, named "Annual Forum of Local Authorities of South-East Europe" was held in May 2015 in Plovdiv, Bulgaria.
